KNIGHT OF THE MONTH

June 2019

Thomas (Tom) Kraus

Brother Tom has been very active in Council 7667 and Church activities as a leader and participant. Although Brother Tom only just attained his First Degree in September 2016, he has been very active in with supporting various parish ministries as well as supporting the pastor in many other church projects. He attained his Third Degree in November 2016. We were sorry to hear that Brother Tom has to relocate soon to South Florida near other family members due to health issues. Brother Tom consistently volunteered to work as the table setup person for the annual Necrology Mass, which serves to remember and celebrate the past council knights who have died, and their families. Every widow is invited and sponsored by individual

knights, who escort the widows to the Mass and the dinner following the Mass. Every widow is matched up with a knight of the council. The event includes a Mass, a pastor knight to perform the Mass, the lectors, music, audio-visual support, and the dinner program. Brother Tom helped in planning and working for our annual Sunland Picnic in September and the Sunland Christmas Party in December for the severely handicapped adults. Sunland is a facility located in Marianna Florida, about 80 miles from Niceville Florida, which provides full time care and supervision for adults who are mentally handicapped. This picnic activity includes the support of a number of fellow Knights and their family members in purchasing the food and drinks, transporting the food and cooking grill from Niceville to Marianna, and then cooking the food and helping to serve the meals. Some 60 residents and 22 staff members of the training facility typically receive meals. He provided invaluable assistance acting out the role as Santa Claus during the annual Council sponsored Sunland Christmas Party for a group of over 40 handicapped persons. This annual event involves both providing of food for the handicapped, as well as for their family members and staff of the agency, and the distribution of gifts. The council members and Ladies Sodality purchased presents for the guests and then helped "Santa" to distribute the presents to each guest. During the Parish Family picnic this past Spring, he and 30+ other knights and their wives spent over six hours setting up the Family Parish Center, cooking the food, serving the food, and then performing clean-up. The KoC members grilled over 800 hamburgers and hot dogs to serve over 500 parish members. Almost the entire parish attended this special event and it culminated as a complete success. He participated in the annual Niceville Christmas parade with many KOC members from both Niceville parishes while marching with the KOC Float, representing the many good works of both parish KOC Councils. With respect to local community projects, he assisted in a bi-annual cleanup of the Henderson Beach areas in Destin. With respect for supporting the Holy Name of Jesus Parish activities, Tom was periodically an Usher for our Parish masses. Brother Tom embodies and exercises those Christian traits so necessary in today's Catholic Church and the Knights of Columbus.

FAMILY OF THE MONTH

June 2019 Ellis and Judy Boudreaux

Past Grand Knight and Advocate Brother Ellis is a charter member of Council 7667. He has been an active in the KoC since 1964, and recently attained the status as a member for the past 55 years. He and his wife, Judy, are very active in Council and Church activities as leaders and participants. Ellis is a team member in the Bingo Program working at least one Friday per month as the team cook and substituting for the early bird games whenever requested. His wife Judy also helps contributing to the bingo effort by playing the games and contributing to the overall revenues, as well as preparing and donating homemade desserts for bingo every Friday. They are both active in leading or supporting various parish ministries as well as in supporting the pastor in many other church projects. She is an active member of the parish Ladies Sodality Group and is a past president. This group of distinguished women works unselfishly with the set up and execution of social functions such as cakewalks, picnics, Sunland Christmas Party and the Parish Oktoberfest. The group also hosts receptions at funerals and memorial services while aiding the grieving friends and relatives of those whom have passed on. She was also responsible for the free annual Pancake Breakfast project for all parish members. Ellis also serves as a Parish Lector. They are both actively involved with helping with the annual Sunland Christmas Party. He assists in the efforts of the Holy Name of Jesus (HNJ) and Christ Our Redeemer (COR) Councils in completing a full up party and Christmas Gift exchange in the HNJ Parish Hall for handicapped members of the State managed Sunland facility for the handicapped located in Marianna, Florida, Our Council has sponsored these events annually for the past 35 years. They also participate in the monthly Pasta Dinner program by preparing and serving the pasta dinners in the effort to fund raise for charitable church activities. Each month his wife Judy provides deserts like cakes and cookies for the pasta dinners as well as setups with decorative flowers and colorful tablecloths to create ambivalence for the pasta guests. The dinners collect hundreds of dollars for charity programs supported by the Knights, while also

providing members of the parish with an excellent dinner on Saturday nights at a very reasonable cost. Typically 80-100 people show up for the monthly dinners. Ellis has consistently supported the annual Handicapped Citizens Drive, and he was our project lead for this year's event. He and the other volunteers work at store entrances in the Niceville area and collect contribution, while handing out a vast quantity of donated tootsie rolls to the contributors. This year over \$1800 was submitted to the State Council to help various groups assisting the handicapped. Brother Ellis volunteered to be a security guard at the annual Father-Daughter Dance sponsored by the Knights. Every year over 330 people attend the event. This was open to the community, and most attendees were from outside our parish. The dance was well covered by the local press as a family oriented dance, and was well organized. The dance was supported by over 30 knight and spouse volunteers. The volunteers greeted the Fathers and Daughters, prepared and served the food, provided individual photos of each set of Fathers and Daughters, and cleaned the Family Center after the event. Knights processed pictures real-time, and everyone walked out of the Dance with professionally styled photos. Ellis is also the HNJ Christmas Card Chairman, and can be found every year taking orders and distributing the cards to our parish members for those who want to keep Christ in Christmas. Our council received an annual award from the State for the outstanding efforts in this endeavor. He is also responsible for the renting of a Billboard displayed in a prominent area in Niceville portraying the importance of the message of keeping Christ in Christmas. Ellis has also been an active church member and he consistently offers sound advice and sensible solutions to problems as well as volunteering to get the work of the parish accomplished with the help of the council as the Church Activities Chairman. Also, whenever a need arises to improve the HNJ campus, Ellis is ready to lead the effort or assist as a part time handyman. He was responsible for relocating and repairing the crosses in the campus Grotto area where we often perform Rosaries and Stations of the Cross events. Brother Ellis and Judy are active church members assisting with the Parish Rummage sales this past year to collect funds to support the sustainment of the Family of Life Center. Ellis and Judy embody and exercise those Christian traits so necessary in today's Catholic Church and the Knights of Columbus.
