Mailing Campaign for Evangelization

Twenty-seven hundred years ago, a young man, Isaiah, was praying in the temple of Jerusalem. As he was immersed in deep prayer, he saw the glory of God. Immediately, he became aware of his sinfulness and said, "Woe is me; I am doomed. I am a man of unclean lips, living among a people of unclean lips. Yes, my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts!" (Isaiah 6:5)

At that moment, an angel flew to him, holding an ember, and touched the mouth of Isaiah and said, "Now that this the last three years.

has touched your lips, your wickedness is removed, your sin purged." Then Isaiah heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send? Who will go before me as my messenger?" (Isaiah 6:8)

Immediately, Isaiah said, "Here I am, Lord, send me." Thus, Isaiah became a messenger of the Lord and a prophet of the people of Israel. He preached the word of God for many POSTAL SERVICE ® years among his people. He presented to the world in vivid language the good news of the coming of

the Messiah, who would also suffer and die for the forgiveness of our sins.

Later, in the fullness of time, Jesus, the Messiah, and Savior, was born in Bethlehem. He was a messenger of the good news of our Heavenly Father's love for everyone. After his death and resurrection, when it was time for Jesus to ascend to heaven, he said to his disciples, "Be my witnesses to the ends of the earth. Teach them what I have taught you. Baptize them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. And I will be with you till the end of the age" (Mathew 28: 19-20). The Church, founded on the rock of Peter, has always been faithful in continuing the ministry of Jesus. And the Church has always relied on its members to fulfill the mission given by Jesus. Today, the Lord is asking the same question he once asked young Isaiah, "Whom shall I send? Who will go before me as my messenger"? Yes, the Lord needs messengers more than ever before to

spread his word everywhere, including the Palm Coast Community.

Over the last few years, we have been trying our best to spread the message of Jesus through door-to-door visits and mailing campaigns.

Despite the problems created by Covid-19, a few of our members succeeded in making almost 4000 door-todoor visits and delivering evangelization materials during

Hence, the church must be a community of compassion and consolation to one another. Touch of human sentiments: While the miracle of raising Lazarus from the grave shows Jesus' divine power over death itself, it also shows him as a wonderfully sensitive human being. His love for Lazarus and his sisters is palpable. Martha's and Mary's complaint that Jesus' presence would have averted Lazarus' death shows us how real their friendship was. So do Jesus' tears. Life Messages

1. "Roll away the stone, unbind him and let him go." There are so many dark areas in our private life. We often bind ourselves with chains of addiction to alcohol, drugs, sexual deviations, slander, gossip, enprejudices, hatred and uncontrollable ourselves in the tombs ger andbury pair. Sometimes we are in the tomb of selfishness, filled with negative feelings such as worry, fear, resentment, hatred, and guilt. Jesus asks us today to seek his help and that of the community around us to loosen those chains and come out of the tombs of our own creation. Is there an area of life where hope is gone?

Why not invite Jesus to visit this area? If we want Jesus to visit our dark dungeons of sin, despair and unhappiness, let us ask Him during this Holy Mass to bring the

light and the power of His Holy Spirit into our private life and liberate us from our tombs. Are there times when we refuse to let God enter into our wallets, fearing that faithful tithing will endanger our savings? When we receive the sacrament of reconciliation, Jesus will call our name and command, "Come out!" Jesus calls each of us by name to come out of our graves and to help others to do the same. "Lazarus, come out! Mary, come out! Jim and Joe, Kathy and Lisa, come out!" This is particularly good

news to someone who is addicted, whether to a chemical substance or to unsavory habits. "Lazarus, come out!" time. We live in a world that is filled with death. We kill each other in acts of murder, abortion, euthanasia, execution, war and terrorist activities. We kill ourselves through suicide, drug and alcohol abuse, smoking, overwork, stress, bad eating habits, and physical neglect. We watch calmly as others die from poverty, hunger and malnutrition, homelessness, unemployment, poor education, disease, child abuse, arms proliferation, discrimination, pollution, and destruction of the environment. The most important question is: Am I ready to face my death? A strange question and its truthful answer are found in the sacred scriptures of the Hindus. "What is the greatest wonder in the world?'

The answer is: "All of us know that we will surely die, but each of us foolishly thinks that he or she will not die any time in the near future." Let us not be foolish; let us be wise, well-prepared and ever ready to meet our Lord with a clear conscience when the time comes.

Stewardship Reflections

At this point in our Lenten journey, it is tempting to grow weary of the spiritual disciplines we have taken on. Today's readings inspire us to remain faithful, in grateful response to a God who loves us so much.

In our first reading, the prophet Ezekiel speaks God's own words to us. "I will put my spirit in you that you may live... I have promised and I will do it, says the Lord." Our God wants to be so closely united to us that we are one with Him. And He has promised He will do it. But only if we make room for Him by making Him THE priority of our lives. Putting God first is a grateful response that is very pleasing to Him.

How can we do this? Our second reading, from Romans, tells us. "Those who are in the flesh cannot please God. But you are not in the flesh... you are in the www.CatholicSteward.com

spirit if only the Spirit of God dwells in you."

The disciplines of Lent and a stewardship way of life are wonderful gifts that free us from too great an attachment to "the flesh." The sacrifices we make as Christian stewards are not meant to restrict our freedom and joy. Quite the contrary. They are tools to help us find the real freedom and joy that only come when we make room in our lives for God.

As we journey closer to the Passion of our Lord, let us intensify our Lenten resolutions and our stewardship way of life, inviting the Holy Spirit to take over more and more of our lives. By Easter, we will be freer to rejoice in Him and truly pleasing to God. - Catholic Stewardship Consultants:



All children from 1st through 8th grade who are not attending Catholic school should be attending PREP classes. Children preparing for the Sacrament of the Eucharist or Confirmation need to attend a two-year catechetical program.

First Reconciliation and First Holy Communion

Children preparing for the Sacrament of Reconciliation and the Sacrament of the Eucharist need to attend a two-year catechetical program which includes six Sunday classes of Sacramental preparation prior to each Sacrament.

Confirmation Formation

Children preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation need to attend a two-year catechetical program which includes three Sunday classes of Sacramental preparation and the annual Confirmation retreat.


