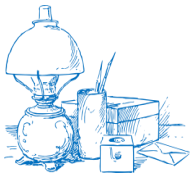

# Jesus the Good Shepherd

James A. Farley (1888-1976) was a successful New York politician who went on to become the Chairman of the National Democratic Committee as well as the Post Master General under President Franklin D. Roosevelt. As a political kingmaker he supervised both the gubernatorial and the first two presidential campaigns of Roosevelt. Farley was successful as a politician primarily because of his organizing capacity for bringing together people from different backgrounds as he did in the case of the New Deal. He had also another amazing talent of remembering the names of people. It is reported that he could identify more than 50,000 people with their first names.

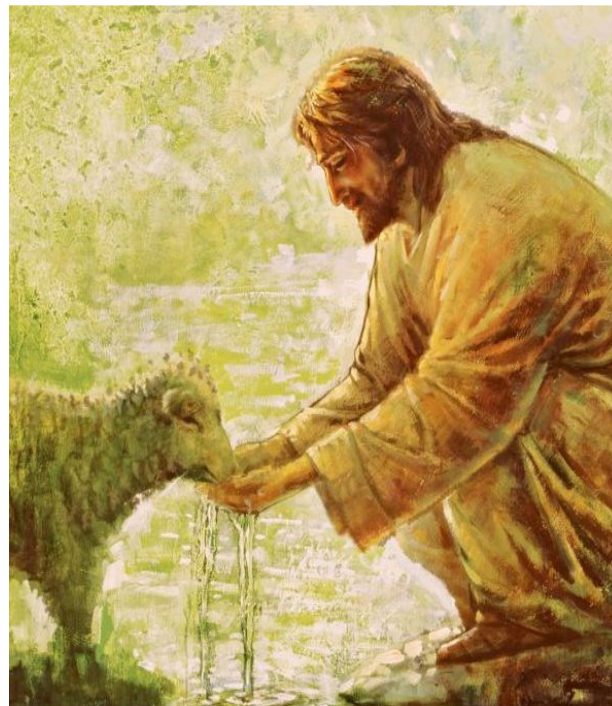
Charles M. Schwab (1862-1939) was an American steel magnate who could remember the names of his 8000 employees at the Homestead Mill. Emperor Napoleon Bonaparte (1769-1821) is credited with remembering the names of thousands of his soldiers. While these people are amazing they are nothing compared to Jesus Christ the Good Shepherd who knows the names of all his sheep. As the Good Shepherd "he calls his sheep by name" (John 10:3). Jesus says, "I am the Good Shepherd. I know my sheep and my sheep know me" (John 10:14). He says again, "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me" (John 10:27). In fact, Jesus not only knows his sheep by name but he also has their names inscribed on the palm of his hands (Isaiah 49:16).

Jesus is the Good Shepherd because as he says, "The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep" (John 10:11). And this is what he did for his sheep; he died on the cross for their salvation. Jesus is the Good shepherd because as he says, "I give eternal life to them, and they will never perish; and no one will snatch them out of My hand" (John 10:27-28). Jesus, as Good Shepherd, not only gives us eternal life but he also gives us new life now and he gives it abundantly (John 10:10). He gives us new life, as we know, primarily through the Eucharist; by giving us his body and blood for our nourishment.

Jesus claims to be the Good Shepherd also because he goes in search of sheep who are not part of his sheepfold. "And I have other sheep that are not part of

this fold," says Jesus. "I must bring them also, and they will listen to my voice. So there will be one flock and one shepherd" (John 10:16). As we know from the parable of the lost sheep, Jesus is the Good Shepherd also because he always goes in search of the lost sheep (Luke 15:3-7). This is good news for us because in Jesus we have a good shepherd who will never abandon us even when we are lost. On the contrary, he will come looking for us to save us and to give us new life and to give it abundantly.

## World Day of Prayer for Vocations



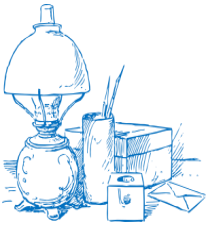
Good Shepherd Sunday is designated as the World Day of Prayer for Vocations to the priesthood and religious life. On this day we are urged to pray for an increase in vocations to the priesthood and religious life. While Jesus was here on earth he traveled far and wide in Palestine proclaiming the good news of salvation through repentance and penance. He also expelled demons of all kinds and gave healing to people.

However, he knew he needed help; he knew he could not do everything by himself. That was why he chose 12 disciples at the beginning whom he called apostles. Since they were not sufficient to meet the needs of his ministry he chose a second group

consisting of 72 disciples. Even they were not sufficient. So Jesus said to his apostles, "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few. Ask the Lord of the harvest, therefore, to send out workers into His harvest" (Luke 10:2).

Jesus, our Good Shepherd, needs help in his ministry now more than ever before. He needs more people to serve his sheep as priests and religious. Let us pray to the harvest master to bless the Church with an abundance of vocations. In the Book of Prophet Jeremiah, God says, "Then I will give you shepherds after My own heart, who will feed you with knowledge and understanding" (3:15).

We need more and more shepherds who are after the Good Shepherd's own heart. Let us always remember to pray for vocations, especially from our families and parishes.

# Jesús el Buen Pastor

James A. Farley (1888-1976) fue un exitoso político de Nueva York que se convirtió en el Presidente del Comité Demócrata Nacional, así como en el Director General de Correos bajo la presidencia de Franklin D. Roosevelt. Como hacedor de reyes políticos, supervisó tanto la campaña para gobernador como las dos primeras campañas presidenciales de Roosevelt. Farley tuvo éxito como político principalmente por su capacidad organizativa para reunir a personas de diferentes orígenes, como lo hizo en el caso del New Deal. También tenía otro asombroso talento para recordar los nombres de las personas. Se informa que pudo identificar a más de 50,000 personas con sus nombres de pila.

Charles M. Schwab (1862-1939) fue un magnate estadounidense del acero que podía recordar los nombres de sus 8,000 empleados en Homestead Mill. Al Emperador Napoleón Bonaparte (1769-1821) se le atribuye haber recordado los nombres de miles de sus soldados. Si bien estas personas son asombrosas, no son nada en comparación con Jesucristo, el Buen Pastor, que conoce los nombres de todas sus ovejas. Como Buen Pastor, "llama a sus ovejas por su nombre" (Juan 10:3). Jesús dice: "Yo soy el Buen Pastor. Yo conozco a mis ovejas y mis ovejas me conocen a mí" (Juan 10:14). Él dice de nuevo: "Mis ovejas oyen mi voz, y yo las conozco, y me siguen" (Juan 10:27). De hecho, Jesús no solo conoce a sus ovejas por su nombre, sino que también tiene sus nombres inscritos en la palma de sus manos (Isaías 49:16).

Jesús es el Buen Pastor porque como él dice: "El buen pastor da su vida por las ovejas" (Juan 10:11). Y esto es lo que hizo por sus ovejas; murió en la cruz por su salvación. Jesús es el Buen Pastor porque como dice: "Yo les doy vida eterna, y no perecerán jamás, ni nadie las arrebatará de mi mano" (Juan 10:27-28). Jesús, como Buen Pastor, no sólo nos da vida eterna pero también nos da vida nueva ahora y la da en abundancia (Juan 10:10) Él nos da vida nueva, como sabemos, principalmente a través de la Eucaristía, dándonos su cuerpo y sangre para nuestro alimento.

# Jesus o Bom Pastor

James A. Farley (1888-1976) foi um político de sucesso em Nova Iorque que se tornou o Presidente do Comité Nacional Democrata, bem como o PostMaster General debaixo do Presidente Franklin D. Roosevelt. Como um bom político, supervisionou tanto a campanha para governador como as duas primeiras campanhas presidenciais de Roosevelt. Farley foi bem-sucedido como político principalmente por causa da sua capacidade de organização para reunir pessoas de diferentes origens, como fez no caso do New Deal. Ele também tinha outro talento incrível de lembrar os nomes das pessoas. É relatado que ele poderia identificar mais de 50,000 pessoas com seus primeiros nomes.

Charles M. Schwab (1862-1939) foi um magnata do aço americano que se lembrava dos nomes de seus 8,000 funcionários na fábrica Homestead. O imperador Napoleão Bonaparte (1769-1821) é creditado por se lembrar dos nomes de milhares dos seus soldados. Embora essas pessoas sejam incríveis, elas não são nada comparadas a Jesus Cristo, o Bom Pastor, que conhece os nomes de todas as suas ovelhas. Como Bom Pastor, «chama as suas ovelhas pelo nome» (João 10, 3). Jesus diz: "Eu sou o Bom Pastor. Conheço as minhas ovelhas e as minhas ovelhas conhecem-me» (João 10, 14). Ele diz novamente: "As minhas ovelhas ouvem a minha voz, e eu as conheço, e elas me seguem" (João 10:27). De facto, Jesus não só conhece as suas ovelhas pelo nome, mas também tem os seus nomes inscritos na palma das suas mãos (Isaías 49:16).

Jesus é o Bom Pastor porque, como ele diz, "O bom pastor dá a vida pelas ovelhas" (João 10:11). E foi isso que fez pelas suas ovelhas: morreu na cruz para a sua salvação. Jesus é o Bom Pastor porque, como Ele diz, «Dou-lhes a vida eterna e eles nunca perecerão; e ninguém os arrebatará da minha mão" (João 10:27-28). Jesus, como Bom Pastor, não só nos dá a vida eterna, mas também nos dá vida nova agora e a dá em abundância (João 10:10). Ele dá-nos vida nova, como sabemos, principalmente através da Eucaristia; dando-nos o seu corpo e sangue para o nosso alimento.

Jesus afirma ser o Bom Pastor também porque vai em busca de ovelhas que não fazem parte do seu rebanho. "E tenho outras ovelhas que não fazem parte deste

rebanho", diz Jesus. "Devo trazê-los também, e eles ouvirão a minha voz. Haverá, pois, um só rebanho e um só pastor" (João 10:16). Como sabemos pela parábola da ovelha perdida, Jesus é o Bom Pastor também porque vai sempre em busca da ovelha perdida (Lucas 15:3-7). Esta é uma boa notícia para nós, porque em Jesus temos um bom pastor que nunca nos abandonará, mesmo quando estamos perdidos. Pelo contrário, Ele virá à nossa procura para nos salvar, dar-nos vida nova e dar-nos abundantemente.

## Dia Mundial de Oração pelas Vocações

Então Jesus disse aos seus apóstolos: "A colheita é abundante, mas os trabalhadores são poucos. Peça, pois, ao Senhor da colheita que envie trabalhadores para a Sua colheita" (Lucas 10:2).

Jesus, nosso Bom Pastor, precisa agora mais do que nunca de ajuda no seu ministério. Ele precisa de mais pessoas para servir as suas ovelhas como sacerdotes e religiosos. Peçamos ao mestre da colheita que abençoe a Igreja com abundância com vocações. No Livro do Profeta Jeremias, Deus diz: "Então vos darei pastores segundo o Meu coração, que vos alimentarão de conhecimento e compreensão" (3:15). Precisamos de cada vez mais pastores que estejam de acordo com o coração do Bom Pastor. Lembremo-nos sempre de rezar pelas vocações, especialmente das nossas famílias e paróquias.





Easter Fourth Sunday, Acts 2:14, 36-41, 1 Peter 2:20b-25; John 10:1-10

# Our Call to Be Good Shepherds

### Introduction

Today is called Good Shepherd Sunday, and, appropriately, this day is also the *World Day of Prayer for Vocations*. Today, the Church calls us to reflect on the meaning of God's call for each of us and to pray for vocations to the priesthood, the diaconate and the consecrated life, because the entire Christian community shares the responsibility for fostering vocations. Both the Old and New Testaments use the image of a Shepherd and His flock to describe the unique relationship of God with Israel and Christ with Christians. The first reading is taken from St. Peter's first sermon, given on Pentecost. Here, he exhorts his listeners, Jewish people gathered for the Feast of Weeks – the "Sabbath" of the seven weeks that have elapsed since Passover -- to know beyond any doubt that the One they have allowed to be crucified is the true Shepherd, whom God has made both Lord and Messiah. Peter then proclaims that the proper response to the Good News about Jesus is to repent and be baptized "in the name of Jesus Christ," and thus to become members of the Good Shepherd's flock. Through the Sacrament of Baptism, they will receive forgiveness for their sins. The Responsorial Psalm (Ps 23), introduces Yahweh as the Good Shepherd of Israel and describes all of the things the Lord does for us, His sheep, in providing for our needs.

The second reading, taken from Peter's First Letter to the Church, continues the "shepherd" imagery. Peter encourages the suffering Christians to follow in the footsteps of their shepherd ("suffering servant"), and to remember that they have been claimed by him. Peter also explains how Jesus, the innocent sufferer, was a model of patience and trust in God, and he reminds us that it is Jesus' suffering which has enabled us to become more fully children of God. In today's Gospel, two brief parables about sheep reveal Jesus as our unique means to salvation. He is the selfless, caring "shepherd"

who provides protection and life itself, and he is the "sheep gate," the one gateway to eternal life.

### First Reading, Acts 2:14a, 36-41

This text gives us a summary of the whole Gospel message, telling us Who Jesus is, how he saves us, and how we should respond. Peter tells the people: "You crucified your God and Messiah, but he has risen from death and offers you forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit." The conclusion of the sermon sums up the whole kerygma in a single Christological formula: "God has made him both Lord and Christ, this Jesus Whom you crucified." The titles "Lord" and "Christ" have great significance. "Lord" was a title reserved for God alone. When early Christians realized that God had been made flesh in the person of Jesus, they dared to give him this Divine title. "Christ" is the Greek form of the Hebrew word "Messiah," meaning the "anointed one," or "King." He is the long-awaited successor to King David, and the fulfillment of all the hopes based on David's glorious reign.

### Second Reading, 1 Peter 2:20b-25

The "shepherd" reference in the last verse of this reading from Peter's epistle links it to the day's Gospel. "He himself bore our sins in his body upon the cross, so that, free from sin, we might live for righteousness. By his wounds, you have been healed. For you had gone astray like sheep, but now you have returned to the Shepherd, the guardian of your souls" (vv. 24-25). Peter then makes three contrasts in this part of his epistle: a) between what Jesus suffered and his surprising responses: "...insulted, he returned no insult;" "when he suffered, he did not threaten" (v. 23); b) between Jesus and us: HE bore OUR sins; by HIS wounds WE are healed (v. 24); c) between our former lost condition and our graced present state.





### **Gospel Reading, John 10, 1-10**

**Context:** Jesus was not talking to his followers. He was addressing the Pharisees. They were accusing him of being from the devil because he had healed a blind man on the Sabbath. His response was that he was the Good Shepherd. He was not like the hired hands who collected their pay for watching the sheep but abandoned the sheep in their time of need because these hired men didn't really care about the sheep. So, the Pharisees knew *exactly* what Jesus meant Jesus was claiming to be God! They also knew he was contrasting himself to them — the hired hands entrusted with the care of God's people but caring only for themselves.

**Yahweh, the Good Shepherd.** For a long time, the Jewish people had used the Good Shepherd image for God. The usage goes all the way back to Genesis 49:24, which says that Joseph was saved "By the power of the mighty one of Jacob, by the Shepherd, the Rock of Israel, the God of your father ..." Such imagery was used by Moses, Isaiah, Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Amos, Zechariah, and of course by David in his Psalms. The psalmist addresses Yahweh as his Shepherd. Psalm 23:1 "The Lord is my Shepherd; nothing shall I want." (Compare also Psalms 77:20, 79:13, 97:7). "He is our God, and we are the people of His pasture and the sheep of His hand" (Ps.95:7). "Like a shepherd, He feeds His flock; in His arms He gathers the lambs, carrying them in His bosom, and leading the ewes with care" (Isaiah 40:11). Ezekiel foretells what the Messiah will do as Good Shepherd. "I myself will tend My sheep ...I will search for the lost and bring back the strays. I will bind up the injured and strengthen the weak" (Ezekiel 34: 15 -16). In short, God is the ultimate Shepherd of the people, providing guidance, sustenance and protection (Psalm 23), and He intends their Kings and other leaders to be their shepherds as well.

**Good Shepherd image in the New Testament:** In Palestine, the word "shepherd" was a synonym for selfless love, sincerity, commitment, and sacrificial service. Hence, Jesus selects it as the most fitting term to denote his life and mission (Mt 2:6, 9:36, 18:12-14, 26:31; Mk 6:34, 14:27; Lk 12:32, 15:4; I Pt 2:25, 5:2-4; Heb 13:20). The prophets pointed out the main duties

of the Good Shepherd: 1) The Good Shepherd leads the sheep to the pasture, provides them with food and water and protects them. In Palestine, the shepherd went in front and the sheep followed behind. 2) He guarded them, not allowing them to get lost in the desert or become victims of robbers and wild animals - preventive vigilance. 3) He went in search of the lost ones and healed their wounds - protective vigilance. 4) He was ready to surrender his life for his sheep - redemptive vigilance.

**First parable in today's Gospel:** The first part of today's Gospel contrasts Jesus, the true Shepherd, with fake shepherds, thieves and robbers. Jesus gives us warning against false shepherds and false teachers in his Church. Jesus' love and concern for each of us must be accepted with trust and serenity because he alone is our Shepherd, and no one else deserves our undivided commitment. As a true Shepherd, he leads his sheep, giving them the food and protection only Jesus, the Good Shepherd, can provide, and he protects us and leads us to true happiness.

**Second parable.** During the time of Jesus in the land of Palestine, the shepherds would bring the sheep down from the hills in the evening to protect them at night when the wolves and mountain lions were hunting their prey. At night, the shepherds would gather their sheep together and lead them into large pens or sheep-folds which had five-foot-high stone walls. The shepherds put the prickly briars along the top of the wall to prevent the mountain lions and wolves from jumping over it.

Now, the doorway was about two feet wide, a narrow space in the front wall facing a fire of wood lit outside at night. The shepherd himself would sleep there in the small opening of the stone wall facing the burning fire with his club and staff. If any mountain lion came, the shepherd would fight it off with his weapons, his short stocky club or his long-pointed staff. Thus, literally and actually, the shepherd himself was the door.





In this parable Jesus compares himself to the Shepherd and to the Gate. The first title represents His ownership because the shepherd is the true owner of the sheep. The second title represents His leadership. Jesus is the Gate, the only Way in or out. He is the One Mediator between God and mankind. All must go through Him, through His Church, in order to arrive in Heaven. By identifying Himself with the sheep-gate, Jesus gives the assurance that whoever enters the pen through Him will be safe and well cared-for. Jesus is the living Door to His Father's house and Father's family, the Door into the Father's safety and into the fullness of life.

It is through Jesus, the Door, that we come into the sheepfold where we are protected from the wolves of life. There is safety and security in being a Christian. There is a spiritual, emotional and psychological security and safety when we live within Jesus and his Church, within the protectiveness of Christ, Christian friends and a Christian family.

### Life Messages

#### 1. We need to be good shepherds and good leaders:

Everyone who is entrusted with the care of others is a shepherd. Hence, pastors, parents, teachers, doctors, nurses, government officials, and caregivers, among others, are all shepherds. We become good shepherds by loving those entrusted to us, praying for them, spending our time, talents and blessings for their welfare, and guarding them from physical and spiritual dangers. Parents must be especially careful of their duties toward their children, giving them good example and sound religious instruction. Above all, parents should pray for their children and, by living according to sound Christian moral principles, show their children how to do the same.

#### 2. We need to be good sheep in the fold of Jesus, the Good Shepherd:

Our local parish is our sheepfold, and our pastors are our shepherds. Jesus is the High Priest, the Bishops are the successors of the Apostles, the pastors are their helpers and the parishioners are the sheep. Hence, as the good sheep of the parish, parishioners are expected to a) Hear and follow the

voice of the shepherds through their homilies, Bible classes, counseling and advice. b) Receive the spiritual food given by the pastors by regular participation in the Holy Mass, by frequenting the Sacraments and by participating in prayer services, renewal programs and missions as far as they are able to do so. c) Cooperate with our pastors by giving them positive suggestions for the welfare of the parish, by encouraging them in their duties, by offering them loving corrections and constructive criticism when they are found misbehaving or failing in their duties and, always, by praying for them. d) Participate actively in the work of various councils, ministries and parish associations.

#### 3. We need to pray for good pastors and vocations.

The Church uses this year's *World Day of Prayer for Vocations* to encourage vocations to the ministerial priesthood, the diaconate and the consecrated life. All Christians need to share in the responsibility of fostering these vocations: a) The faith community must continuously pray for vocations both in the Church and in their families. b) Since good priests, deacons and people embracing the consecrated life come from good Christian families, all Christian parents need to live their faith in Christ on a daily basis by leading exemplary lives as parents and by fostering good relationships with, and among, their children. c) Parents need to respect and encourage a child who shows an interest in becoming a priest or deacon or of entering upon a consecrated life. Parents need to encourage their children, including their teenagers and young adults, to participate actively in the children's and youth activities in the parish, like Sunday school, children's clubs, and youth associations. They also need to encourage and actively support them in becoming altar servants, gift-bearers, lectors and ministers of hospitality.

On this *World Day of Prayer for Vocations*, let us begin, or continue, especially in these most stressful times in and for the Church, local and universal, to pray earnestly for continued conversion and perseverance in the Faith for our bishops, priests, deacons, those living a consecrated life, and all of the laity, for we are One Body and what one member suffers, all suffer.

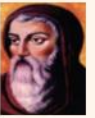

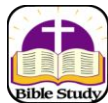
## Tickets Are Available for Eucharistic Revival Pilgrimage 2024
