From the desk of Fr. Jose Panthaplamthottiyil

SEAS Capital Campaign

During the weekend Masses on May 13-14 at our parish, I preached for all the Masses, presenting the details of our Campus Improvement Project and requesting generous support for this Project from all our parishioners. I am giving below the text of that homily for the information and action of those who missed it.

Today, in the place of the homily, I will be talking about our Capital Campaign. However, I can tell you a story that captures the message of today's gospel reading.

A little boy was riding his tricycle furiously around the block, over and over again. Finally, a police officer stopped and asked him why he was going around and around. The boy said that he was running away from home. The police officer asked him why he kept going around the block. The boy responded, "Because my mom said I'm not allowed to cross the street."

The point of the story is clear -- we will respect the wishes of the people whom we love. The boy was mad at his mom for some reason but did not want to disobey her because he loved her. In today's gospel reading, Jesus tells us that we will keep his commandments if we truly love him. Let us always remember this saying of Jesus.

Now, about the Capital Campaign. When I came to this parish as your pastor four years ago, I immediately learned I was assigned to a Welcoming Parish. Yes, our parish was already welcoming at that time, and we decided to make it more welcoming by choosing 'A Welcoming and Inviting Parish' as our motto. You will find this motto on the cover of our bulletin every week.

It is because we decided to become also an Inviting Parish that we started door-to-door evangelization and mailing campaigns to invite people to our church. During the last three years, our evangelization team members have made almost 4000 home visits, and we sent out evangelization postcards to the people of Palm Coast four times.

We have grown in numbers during the last few years despite Covid-19, and our offertory collection has increased. I thank all of you for your faithfulness in supporting the church through the stewardship of your time, talent, and treasure.

When I came to Mother Seton four years ago, my primary focus was to help our parishioners to grow in faith and fellowship. Hence, I tried to give more spiritual nourishment by providing more opportunities for prayer and adoration, introducing confession before all weekend Masses and all-day confession and adoration on special occasions, conducting ongoing formation programs, regular retreats, and parish missions, and encouraging all the various ministries of our parish to flourish and serve our parish community.

However, I needed to do more. When I became the

pastor, I was immediately made aware of the many needs of the parish, especially the maintenance needs of the church and the school buildings. Accordingly, we started a Building and Maintenance Committee and took care of some of the immediate needs. However, when we did a systematic study of the buildings with the help of an architectural firm, we realized that we needed professional help to take care of the maintenance needs of the buildings.

Moreover, as everybody knows, we need more than maintenance work in the church. We need to renovate the sanctuary, which requires a facelift; we need new carpet and tiles in the church; we need to refurbish the pews and kneelers, we need a new sound system, and we need better restrooms.

Furthermore, we need more meeting rooms – small and large – on our campus. We have 80 ministries in our parish, but we have only five meeting rooms on our campus, including the small parish hall. We are a large parish with almost 4000 families, and therefore we need a place to gather for a large number of people. The schoolchildren also need a place to play indoors – a gym.

So we made plans for a Campus Improvement Project, and the diocese has approved our plans. Now, the challenge is to raise \$7 million for our Project. During the pre-Campaign period, I met with a good number of people, and so far, we have received pledges for two million dollars. Of which we have already received 350,000 dollars in cash.

(At this time of my homily, I made a PowerPoint presentation of the Project to help our parishioners understand the various aspects of our Campus Improvement Project. Then I continued.)

We will be able to complete this Project only with the generous help of all our parishioners. Hence, I request you to pray about this Project, make a generous pledge for the total amount you plan to give, and please bring the pledge card next weekend when you come for Mass. Also, please bring your initial payment together with your pledge card. I wanted to meet with more people one-on-one during the pre-Campaign period. However, I could not do so because of the lack of time. However, I am still ready to meet one-on-one with everyone who wishes to do so. You can always call the rectory office and make an appointment to see me.

Let me now come back to the gospel reading. Today's gospel reading from John (14:15-21) reminds us that if we love someone, we will always respect that person's wishes. Well, because all of you love the Lord and his church, I am sure you will make the sacrifice needed to donate generously to our Project. I sincerely thank all of you for your help, and I request you to pray daily for the success of our Capital Campaign and the Campus Improvement Project. May God bless you always.



Desde el Escritorio del Pastor, Padre Jose Panthaplamthottiyil

Campaña Capital de SEAS

Durante las Misas del fin de semana del 13 y 14 de Mayo en nuestra Parroquia, prediqué para todas las Misas, presenté los detalles de nuestro Proyecto de Mejoramiento del Campus y solicité el apoyo generoso de todos nuestros Feligreses para este Proyecto. Doy a continuación el texto de esa Homilía para información y acción de aquellos que se lo perdieron.

Hoy, en lugar de la Homilía, estaré hablando de nuestra Campaña Capital. Sin embargo, puedo contarles una historia que captura el mensaje de la Lectura del Evangelio de hoy.

Un niño pequeño montaba furiosamente su triciclo alrededor de la cuadra, una y otra vez. Finalmente, un policía se detuvo y le preguntó por qué daba vueltas y vueltas. El niño dijo que se estaba escapando de casa. El policía le preguntó por qué seguía dando vueltas a la cuadra. El niño respondió: "Porque mi mamá dijo que no puedo cruzar la calle".

El punto de la historia es claro: respetaremos los deseos de las personas que amamos. El niño estaba enojado con su madre por alguna razón, pero no quería desobedecerla porque la amaba. En la Lectura del Evangelio de hoy, Jesús nos dice que guardaremos sus Mandamientos si verdaderamente lo amamos. Recordemos siempre este dicho de Jesús.

Ahora, sobre la Campaña Capital. Cuando llegué a esta Parroquia como su Párroco hace cuatro años, inmediatamente supe que estaba asignado a una Parroquia de Bienvenida. Sí, nuestra Parroquia ya era acogedora en ese momento, y decidimos hacerla más acogedora eligiendo como lema 'Una Parroquia Acogedora y Invitadora'. Encontrarás este lema en la portada de nuestro Boletín todas las semanas.

Debido a que decidimos convertirnos también en una parroquia que invita, comenzamos la Evangelización de puerta en puerta y las Campañas de correo para invitar a la gente a nuestra Iglesia. Durante los últimos tres años, los miembros de nuestro equipo de Evangelización han realizado casi 4,000 visitas domiciliarias y enviamos postales de Evangelización a la gente de Palm Coast cuatro veces.

Hemos crecido en número durante los últimos años a pesar del Covid-19, y nuestra colección de ofrendas ha aumentado. Les agradezco a todos ustedes por su fidelidad en apoyar a la Iglesia a través de la administración de su tiempo, talento y tesoro.

Cuando llegué a Mother Seton hace cuatro años, mi objetivo principal era ayudar a nuestros Feligreses a crecer en la fe y el compañerismo. Por lo tanto, traté de dar más alimento espiritual brindando más oportunidades para la Oración y la Adoración, introduciendo la Confesión antes de todas las Misas de fin de semana y la Confesión y Adoración de todo el día en ocasiones especiales, conduciendo programas de formación continua, retiros regulares y misiones parroquiales, y alentando a todos los diversos ministerios de nuestra parroquia para prosperar y servir a nuestra comunidad parroquial.

Sin embargo, necesitaba hacer más. Cuando me convertí en Párroco, inmediatamente me di cuenta de las muchas

necesidades de la Parroquia, especialmente las necesidades de mantenimiento de la Iglesia y los edificios escolares. En consecuencia, iniciamos un Comité de Construcción y Mantenimiento y nos ocupamos de algunas de las necesidades inmediatas. Sin embargo, cuando hicimos un estudio sistemático de los edificios con la ayuda de un estudio de arquitectura, nos dimos cuenta de que necesitábamos ayuda profesional para atender las necesidades de mantenimiento de los edificios.

Además, como todos saben, necesitamos más que trabajo de mantenimiento en la Iglesia. Necesitamos renovar el Santuario, lo que requiere un lavado de cara; necesitamos alfombras y azulejos nuevos en la Iglesia; necesitamos renovar las bancas y reclinatorios, necesitamos un nuevo sistema de sonido y necesitamos mejores baños.

Además, necesitamos más salas de reuniones, pequeñas y grandes, en nuestro campus. Tenemos 80 Ministerios en nuestra Parroquia, pero solo tenemos cinco salas de reuniones en nuestro campus, incluido el pequeño Salón Parroquial. Somos una Parroquia grande con casi 4,000 familias, y por lo tanto necesitamos un lugar de reunión para un gran número de personas. Los escolares también necesitan un lugar para jugar adentro: un gimnasio.

Así que hicimos planes para un Proyecto de Mejoramiento del Campus, y la Diócesis ha aprobado nuestros planes. Ahora, el reto es recaudar \$7 millones para nuestro Proyecto. Durante el período de precampaña me reuní con un buen número de personas y hasta el momento hemos recibido compromisos por dos millones de dólares. De los cuales ya hemos recibido \$350,000 dólares en efectivo.

(En este momento de mi Homilía, hice una presentación de PowerPoint del Proyecto para ayudar a nuestros Feligreses a comprender los diversos aspectos de nuestro Proyecto de Mejoramiento del Campus. Luego continúe).

Podremos completar este Proyecto solo con la generosa ayuda de todos nuestros Feligreses. Por lo tanto, le pido que Oren por este Proyecto, haga una generosa donación por la cantidad total que planea dar y traiga la tarjeta de compromiso el próximo fin de semana cuando venga a Misa. Además, traiga su pago inicial junto con su tarjeta de compromiso. Quería reunirme con más personas uno a uno durante el período previo a la Campaña. Sin embargo, no pude hacerlo por falta de tiempo. Sin embargo, todavía estoy listo para reunirme personalmente con todos los que deseen hacerlo. Siempre puede llamar a la Oficina de la Rectoría y hacer una cita para verme.

Permítanme volver ahora a la Lectura del Evangelio. La Lectura del Evangelio de hoy de Juan (14:15-21) nos recuerda que si amamos a alguien, siempre respetaremos los deseos de esa persona. Bueno, como todos ustedes aman al Señor y a Su Iglesia, estoy seguro de que harán el sacrificio necesario para donar generosamente a nuestro Proyecto. Les agradezco sinceramente a todos por su ayuda y les pido que Oren diariamente por el éxito de nuestra Campaña Capital y el Proyecto de Mejoramiento del Campus. Que Dios Los Bendiga Siempre.



Campanha Capital SEAS

Durante as missas do fim de semana de 13 a 14 de Maio na nossa paróquia, preguei em todas as missas, apresentando os detalhes do nosso Projecto de Melhoramento do Campus e solicitando apoio generoso a este Projecto de todos os nossos paroquianos. Dou abaixo o texto dessa homília para informação e acção para quem faltou.

Hoje, em vez da homília, falarei sobre a nossa Campanha Capital. No entanto, posso contar uma história que capta a mensagem da leitura do evangelho de hoje.

Um garotinho andava de triciclo furiosamente pela sua rua. Finalmente, um policia parou-o e perguntou-lhe a razão dele andar assim. O rapaz disse que estava fugindo de casa. O policia perguntou-lhe a razão de ele continuar a circular pelas mesmas ruas. O menino respondeu-lhe: "Porque a minha mãe disse-me que eu não posso atravessar a rua".

O ponto da história é claro - vamos respeitar os desejos das pessoas que amamos. O menino estava zangado com a mãe por algum motivo, mas não queria desobedecer-lhe porque a amava. Na leitura do evangelho de hoje, Jesus diz-nos que guardaremos os Seus mandamentos se O amarmos verdadeiramente. Lembremo-nos sempre deste ditado de Jesus.

Agora, sobre a Campanha da Capital. Quando cheguei a esta paróquia como vosso pastor, há quatro anos, soube imediatamente que estava designado para uma Paróquia de Acolhimento. Sim, a nossa paróquia já era acolhedora nessa altura, e decidimos torná-la mais acolhedora, escolhendo como lema 'Uma Paróquia Acolhedora e Convidativa'. Encontrará este lema na capa do nosso boletim todas as semanas.

É porque decidimos tornar-nos também uma Paróquia Convidativa que iniciamos campanhas de Evangelização porta a porta e pelo correio para convidar pessoas para a nossa igreja. Durante os últimos três anos, os membros da nossa equipe de evangelização fizeram quase 4,000 visitas domiciliares, e enviamos cartões postais de evangelização para o povo de Palm Coast quatro vezes.

Temos crescido em números durante os últimos anos, apesar da Covid-19, e a nossa colecta de ofertas aumentou. Agradeço a todos vocês pela vossa fidelidade em apoiar a igreja através da administração do seu tempo, talento e finanças.

Quando cheguei à Mãe Seton há quatro anos, o meu objectivo principal era ajudar os nossos paroquianos a crescer na fé e na comunhão. Por isso, procurei dar mais alimento espiritual, proporcionando mais oportunidades de oração e adoração, introduzindo a confissão antes de todas as missas ao fim de semana e confissão e adoração durante todo o dia em ocasiões especiais, instituindo programas de formação contínua, retiros regulares e missões paroquiais, e encorajando todos os vários ministérios da nossa paróquia a florescer e servir a nossa comunidade paroquial.

No entanto, eu precisava fazer mais. Quando me tornei pastor, fui imediatamente informado das muitas necessidades da paróquia, especialmente as necessidades

de manutenção da igreja e dos edifícios escolares. Assim, iniciamos uma Comissão de Construção e Manutenção e cuidamos de algumas das necessidades imediatas. No entanto, quando fizemos um estudo sistemático dos edifícios com a ajuda de uma firma de arquitectos, percebemos que precisávamos de ajuda profissional para cuidar das necessidades de manutenção dos edifícios.

Além disso, como todos sabem, precisamos de mais do que trabalho de manutenção na igreja. Precisamos renovar o santuário, o qual requer uma renovação; precisamos de tapetes e azulejos novos na igreja; precisamos de remodelar os bancos e o sitio para ajoelhar, precisamos de um novo sistema de som e precisamos de melhores casas de banho.

Além disso, precisamos de mais salas de reuniões – pequenas e grandes – no nosso campus. Temos 80 ministérios na nossa paróquia, mas temos apenas cinco salas de reuniões no nosso campus, incluindo o pequeno salão paroquial. Somos uma grande freguesia com quase 4,000 famílias e, por isso, precisamos de um local de concentração para um grande número de pessoas. As crianças em idade escolar também precisam de um lugar interior para brincar – um ginásio.

Então, fizemos planos para um Projecto de Melhoramento do Campus, e a Diocese aprovou os nossos planos. Agora, o desafio é angariar \$ 7 milhões de dólares para o nosso projecto. Durante o período da pré-campanha, reuni-me com um bom número de pessoas e, até agora, recebemos promessas de dois milhões de dólares. Dos quais já recebemos \$350,000 dólares em dinheiro.

(Neste momento da minha homília, fiz uma apresentação em PowerPoint do Projecto para ajudar os nossos paroquianos a compreender os vários aspectos do nosso Projecto de Melhoramento do Campus. Depois continuei.)

Só conseguiremos concluir este Projecto com a ajuda generosa de todos os nossos paroquianos. Por isso, peço-vos que rezeis sobre este Projecto, que façais um compromisso generoso pelo montante total que tenciona doar e, por favor, traga o cartão de compromisso no próximo fim de semana, quando vier à missa. Além disso, por favor, traga o seu pagamento inicial juntamente com o seu cartão de compromisso. Queria encontrar-me com mais pessoas individualmente durante o período da pré-campanha. No entanto, não pude fazê-lo por falta de tempo. Mas continuo disposto a encontrar-me individualmente com todos os que o desejam. Pode sempre ligar para a reitoria e marcar uma consulta comigo.

Permitam-me agora voltar à leitura do Evangelho. A leitura do Evangelho de hoje de João (14:15-21) lembra-nos que, se amarmos alguém, sempre respeitaremos os desejos dessa pessoa. Bem, porque todos vós amam o Senhor e a sua Igreja, tenho a certeza de que farão o sacrifício necessário para doar generosamente ao nosso Projecto. Agradeço sinceramente a todos pela ajuda e peço que rezem diariamente pelo sucesso da nossa Campanha Capital e do Projecto de Melhoramento do Campus. Que Deus os abençoe sempre.



Feast of the Ascension of Our Lord Acts 1:1-11; Ephesians 1:17-23; Mathew 28:16-20

Our Call to Be Proclaimers and Evangelizers

Introduction

Today's readings describe the Ascension of the Lord Jesus into Heavenly glory, after promising the Holy Spirit as the source of Heavenly power for the apostles and commanding them to "...be My witnesses... throughout the whole world," by their lives and their preaching. We celebrate the exaltation and the end of Jesus' earthly existence as a prelude to the gift of the Spirit. Matthew's Gospel begins with the promise of *Emmanuel – God is with us*; it concludes with the promise of the Risen Christ, "*I am with you always, even to the end of time.*" So, the ascended Jesus is with us at all times and in all places, releasing a new energy upon the earth. This is the energy of the Holy Spirit Who came down upon the Apostles and is also given to each us so that we may preach the Good News of salvation to all the world, while bearing witness to Jesus by living out His word. Hence, today's feast is the celebration of Jesus' glory after his suffering and death – the glory in which we also hope to share. The Ascension and Pentecost, taken together, mark the beginning of the Church's active life. The feast of the Ascension tells us that the Church must be a community in mission, guided by the Holy Spirit and confident of God's protection even in the face of suffering and death. Jesus' Ascension is both an ending and a beginning. The physical appearances of Jesus are at an end -- the revelation of the "Good News" is complete; the promise and mission of the Messiah is fulfilled. Now begins the work of the disciples to teach what they have learned and to share what they have witnessed.

The first reading, taken from the Acts of the Apostles, describes the scene of Jesus' Ascension, with the promise of the Holy Spirit, and the missionary command to the Apostles that they are to bear witness to Jesus by bringing and living out His teachings to the whole world. In the second reading, St. Paul prays that the Holy Spirit may enliven the hope of Christ's

disciples in their future Heavenly glory, saying, "May God enlighten the eyes of our heart so that we may know the great hope to which we have been called." Paul also teaches us that God revealed His might in the Resurrection and Ascension of Christ and in His exaltation of Jesus over all angelic forces. Although risen and ascended, Jesus is still with us through the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus remains accessible to us now with every prayer and every breath, if we so choose, in the Holy Bible, in the Sacraments, especially the Holy Eucharist, and in the praying community. Today's Gospel tells us that Jesus, returning to the Father, completes the Messianic mission on earth. In the descriptions of Christ after his Resurrection, we are given a hint of what life will be like in Heaven. But it is in the Ascension that we see Jesus entering fully into the life and glory of God. The prospect of sharing that glory should be the driving force of our lives.

First Reading, Acts 1:1-11

The first reading describes how Jesus interacted with his disciples for forty days after his Resurrection. He instructed the Apostles to remain in Jerusalem to receive the Holy Spirit, the source of power. Once they received the Spirit, they would bear witness to Jesus to the ends of the earth by their preaching and their lives: "You will be baptized with the Holy Spirit" and become "My witnesses in Jerusalem, throughout Judea and to the ends of the earth." Then Jesus was lifted up in the sky and was covered by a cloud. The disciples received the angelic message that the ascended Jesus would come back again in glory "in the same way as you have seen Him going into Heaven." Thus, the Ascension of Jesus means that the risen Jesus has entered into the glory of the Heavenly Father. Jesus has accomplished our salvation by suffering and death, burial and Resurrection, Ascension, and the sending of the Spirit.

Responsorial Psalm, Ps 47

Today's responsorial psalm, "God is king of all the earth," celebrates God's universal kingship. It was originally sung in connection with a cultic procession honoring the Ark of the Covenant. This most sacred religious object served as a pedestal upon which God was invisibly enthroned. During an annual feast it would be taken from repose in the Temple's Holy of Holies and returned in solemn procession. "God mounts his throne!" This cultic cry, our Psalm refrain today, refers to the solemn installation of the Ark within the Temple, a liturgical reenactment of the universal lordship that is God's from eternity. Now, by his Ascension the risen Lord likewise "mounts his throne" in glory.

Second Reading, Ephesians 1:17-23

In the second reading, St. Paul puts special emphasis on the truth that Jesus, our triumphant Lord, now rules in glory over all creation. He prays: "May God enlighten the eyes of your hearts so that you may know the great hope to which you have been called." In the alternate second reading (Ephesians 4:4-13), Paul exhorts the disciples to live in a manner worthy of their calling and mission. The greatest witness we can bear to the presence of Jesus in our midst is our unity with God, seen in our living with one another in peace and harmony.

Gospel Reading, Mathew 28:16-20

A. Ascension: Each Sunday we profess through the Creed, "He ascended into Heaven." Christ's Ascension was the culmination of God's divine plan for Christ Jesus, his return to his Father with "Mission Accomplished." The Ascension, as the grand finale of all Jesus' words and works done for us and for our salvation, is a culmination, but not a conclusion. Jesus is now with God in glory, and with us in the Holy Spirit: "Lo, I am with you always." The feast of the Ascension celebrates one aspect of the Resurrection, namely Jesus' exaltation. He did not wait 40 days to be glorified at God's right hand. That had already happened at his Resurrection. Like the 40 days after Easter during which He appeared to many in Israel, this public Ascension into Heaven was given to us for our sakes. The forty days allowed many to experience personally Jesus' Resurrection from the dead and his being alive in a glorified body as fact to be counted upon, reality, and the fulfillment of prophecy. The focus of this feast is the Heavenly reign of Christ, and the Lord's being "seated at God's right hand," meaning He alone will be in control of the continuing plan of salvation through the Holy Spirit, unrestricted by time, space or culture. It is there, at the "right hand of God," that Jesus continues to make intercession for all of us with the Father. Thus, the Paschal Mystery -- Jesus' passion, death, Resurrection, Ascension and the sending of the Holy Spirit -- is a single, unbroken Reality which is to be understood by Faith. By His Ascension, Jesus, the risen Christ, True God and True Man, is One with the Father and the Holy Spirit in glory forever.

B. Ascension Account The Biblical accounts of the Ascension focus not so much on the details of the event as on the mission Jesus gave to his disciples. For example, in the accounts narrated in Luke and Acts, the Ascension took place in Jerusalem. In Matthew and Mark, on the other hand, the event occurred in Galilee. All accounts, however, agree that the Ascension, a real event, happen-

ing in real time and observed by real people, took place on a mountain. In Luke and Acts, the Ascension happened forty days after the Resurrection, a period during which Jesus appeared repeatedly to his followers. In Matthew and Mark there is no indication of the time period between the Resurrection and the Ascension. The Gospel writers apparently were not aiming at accuracy of historical detail but were more concerned with transmitting Our Lord's message.

C. Ascension Message: "Preach the Good News and be my witnesses:" Matthew, Mark and Acts record Jesus' last words differently: 1. "You will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth" (Acts 1:8). 2. "Go therefore and make disciples of all nations baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:19-21). 3. "Go into all the world and proclaim the good news to the whole creation" (Mark.16:15). All are in agreement that (a) Jesus gave his disciples a mission of bearing witness to him by preaching and living the Good News. They are to tell and re-tell the story of Jesus' life, suffering, death and Resurrection, Ascension and sending of the Holy Spirit. (b) He assured them of the Divine assistance of the Holy Spirit in the carrying out of this mission. There is a saying you may have heard, which goes, "If you were accused of being a Christian, would they find enough evidence to convict you?" Today's Gospel challenges us to provide enough evidence.

D. Christmas and Ascension: The Ascension is most closely related, in meaning, to Christmas. In Jesus, the human and the Divine became united in the Person and life of one man. That's Christmas. At the Ascension, it was not the Divine nature of Jesus alone that ascended to the Father. It was the risen Jesus -- fully human and fully Divine; whole, alive and entire, in his glorified Body -- Who ascended: a body which the disciples had touched, the body in which Jesus had eaten and drunk with them both before and after His Resurrection, a real, physical, but gloriously restored body, bearing the marks of nails and a spear. This is what, and Who, ascended. This is what, and Who, now and forever, is a living, participating part of God. The Ascension, along with the Incarnation, is here to tell us that it is a good thing to be a human being; indeed, it is a wonderful and an important and a holy thing to be a human being. It is such an important thing that God did it. Even more, the fullness of God now includes what it means to be a human being.

Life Messages

1. We need to be proclaimers and evangelizers: In today's Gospel, Jesus gives his mission to all the believers: "Go out to the whole world and proclaim the Gospel to every creature." This mission is not given to a select few but to all believers. To be a Christian is to be a proclaimer and an evangelizer. There is a difference between preaching and proclaiming. "We preach with words, but we proclaim with our lives." As we celebrate the Lord's return to His Father in Heaven -- His Ascension -- we are being



commissioned to go forth and proclaim the Gospel of life and love, of hope and peace, by the witness of our lives. On this day of hope, encouragement and commissioning, let us renew our commitment to be true disciples everywhere we go, beginning with our family and our parish, "living in a manner worthy of the call [we] have received. 'Pope Francis' apostolic exhortation, *Evangelii Gaudium*, says: "All the baptized, whatever their position in the church or their level of instruction in the Faith, are agents of evangelization, and it would be insufficient to envisage a plan of evangelization to be carried out by professionals while the rest of the faithful would simply be passive recipients. ... Indeed, anyone who has truly experienced God's saving love does not need much time or lengthy training to go out and proclaim that love."

2. We need to live a life of Christian joy in the presence of the ascended Lord. According to Luke, the disciples "returned to Jerusalem with great joy." Apparently, Jesus' exaltation and final blessing gave them, as it gives us, the assurance that, though absent, Jesus is still present, present even in the pain and sorrow we undergo. That is why St. Augustine assures us, "Christ is now exalted above the Heavens, but he still suffers on earth all the pain that we, the members of his Body, have to bear. He showed this when he cried out from above: 'Saul, Saul, why do you persecute Me?' and when he said: 'I was

hungry and you gave me food.' While in Heaven he is also with us; and while on earth we are with him. He is here with us by his Divinity, his power and his love. We cannot be in Heaven, as He is on earth, by Divinity, but in Him, we can be there by love." "With a spirit of wisdom and insight to know him clearly," we can discover Christ's presence at every turn of our life's journeys to his final return at the end of time.

3. We have a teaching mission: Jesus taught us lessons of Faith, Hope, forgiveness, mercy, Redemption and Love. We cannot put these lessons on a shelf and ignore them. They stand before us in the person of Jesus. Although no longer visibly present in the world, He is present in his words. We must make his words real in our lives and in the lives of others. Christianity was meant to be a Faith in which Jesus' followers would help and care for others, just as Jesus had done, and in so doing, would care for Jesus in them. But the spreading of the Good News to all nations is not a goal that can be attained by human might and craft. This is why Jesus promises to empower his messengers with His abiding presence and that of the Holy Spirit. The challenge of sharing the Good News with all mankind should, therefore, begin with our admission that we have often been arrogant and overbearing. We must learn to be humble and let the Holy Spirit lead the way.


Tickets Are Available for Eucharistic Revival Pilgrimage 2024



In our Holy of Holies, we have ten candles always burning around the tabernacle, just as in the temple in Jerusalem there were ten lights always burning around the Ark of the Covenant. They indicate the presence of our precious Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

The regular session of the Florida Legislature officially closed on May 5 at 11 am. Many positive outcomes were initiated. Of special interest to the pro-life community are the following:

Pregnancy Support Services - the Florida Pregnancy Care Network (started in 2005) has been allotted \$29.5 million for counseling, referrals, material support, training and pregnancy and childbirth education

Affordable Housing Trust Fund - \$511 million for housing construction and rehabilitation, down payment assistance and rental development to assist disabled, elderly, vets and others in need of housing assistance.

Health Care access for underserved and uninsured
Heartbeat Protection Act - signed on April 13 - no abortions after 6 weeks of gestation with exceptions
Human Trafficking - expunction of victim records

One disconcerting decision was changing the law that required a unanimous jury decision to impose the death penalty. Now only the vote of 8 of the 12 jury members are needed to impart the death sentence.
