National Eucharistic Revival Parish Phase begins on Sunday, June 11, 2023

The three-year National Eucharistic Revival in the United States was inaugurated on Sunday, June 19, 2022, the feast day of Corpus Christi. The First Phase of this Revival was at the diocesan level, during which the various dioceses in this country organized and promoted events to inspire and strengthen the understanding of the Eucharist, especially the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist.

As the one-year Diocesan Phase of the Revival ends, the Parish Phase begins on Sunday, June 11, 2023, the feast day of Corpus Christi.

What is the Eucharistic Revival?

According to the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB), the National Eucharistic Revival is "intended to form, heal, and unite people of god through a renewed encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist, and then send these 'Eucharistic missionaries' out to a hurting and hungry world."

The following are the four primary goals of the Eucharistic Revival as proposed by USCCB:

- 1. To provide a more profound encounter with Jesus Christ in the Sunday liturgy as a point of unity among all Catholics, and through this powerful encounter, to find personal healing and courage to take the gospel to a world in need of authentic love the love of Christ found in the Eucharist.
- 2. To spark personal conversions through the joyful discovery of a relationship with Christ by encountering the love of God present in Jesus in the Eucharist.
- 3. To elevate the truth and practices of our Catholic faith through the rediscovery of the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist.
- 4. To form, inspire, and launch missionary disciples filled with the love of God and neighbor that comes from an encounter with Jesus in the Eucharist to the margins of the Church and the world.

Parish Phase of the Eucharistic Revival

We will begin the Parish Phase of the Eucharistic Revival on Sunday, June 11, 2023, with the celebration of the Feast of Corpus Christi. To mark this event at Mother Seton, we will have a solemn Eucharistic Procession in

front of the church after the noon Mass. All are invited and encouraged to attend this Eucharistic Procession.

To make the Parish Phase of the Revival successful, the USCCB is suggesting the following best practices: active participation in the Mass, Corpus Christi Processions, regular Holy Hours, short visits to the Blessed Sacrament, adult faith formation programs, and sharing of testimonials.

The USCCB is also encouraging all the parishes to launch an "Invite One Back" initiative. Through this initiative, every faithful Catholic is encouraged to invite to church one person in their inner circle who has fallen away from attending Sunday Mass.

Eucharistic Revival at Mother Seton

We have already implanted some of the best practices suggested by the USCCB for the Parish Phase, like the Corpus Christi Procession, regular Eucharistic Adoration, and retreats focusing on Eucharistic Revival. The Spiritual Life Committee of our parish has proposed some ideas to make the Parish Phase of the Revival more effective.

They include occasional 40-hour Eucharistic Adoration, Eucharistic street procession in the Fall, bi-monthly catechetical formation sessions by the clergy and the DRE to strengthen our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, Exhibition of Eucharistic miracles, monthly bulletin piece on the Eucharist, lay witness talks before weekend Masses, Sunday homilies focused on the Eucharist, monthly praise and worship led by different groups, banners on campus, and *Invite One Back* weekends.

Another idea is to extend our daily Eucharistic Adoration to 24 hours a day. It is a difficult task, but it is something that we had in our parish before. If it is not possible soon, let us consider extending it until midnight every day.

I would like to hear your ideas about what else we need to do in our parish to strengthen and promote our faith in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. After we finalize our plans, we will publish a schedule of events, which will be held during the Parish Phase of the Eucharistic Revival.

Mass will be at 8.30 am, followed by Eucharistic Procession at 10 am. The keynote address by Bishop Pohlmeier will be at 11 am. Avivamiento Eucarístico Nacional La Fase Parroquial Comienza el Domingo 11 de Junio de 2023

El Avivamiento Eucarístico Nacional de tres años en los Estados Unidos se inauguró el Domingo 19 de Junio de 2022, la Fiesta del Corpus Christi. La Primera Fase de este Avivamiento fue a nivel Diocesano, durante la cual las diversas Diócesis de este país organizaron y promovieron eventos para inspirar y fortalecer la comprensión de la Eucaristía, especialmente la Presencia Real de Jesús en la Eucaristía.

A medida que finaliza la Fase Diocesana del Avivamiento de un año, la Fase Parroquial comienza el Domingo 11 de Junio de 2023, la Fiesta del Corpus Christi.

¿Qué es el Avivamiento Eucarístico?

Según la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos (USCCB, por sus siglas en Inglés), el Renacimiento Eucarístico Nacional "tiene la intención de formar, sanar y unir al pueblo de Dios a través de un encuentro renovado con Jesús en la Eucaristía, y luego enviar a estos 'misioneros Eucarísticos' a un mundo herido y hambriento".

- 1. Fase Parroquial del Avivamiento Eucarístico

Daremos inicio a la Fase Parroquial del Avivamiento Eucarístico el Domingo 11 de Junio de 2023, con la celebración de la Fiesta del Corpus Christi. Para conmemorar este evento en Mother Seton, tendremos una procesión Euca-

rística Solemne frente a la Iglesia después de la Misa del mediodía. Todos están invitados y animados a asistir a esta Procesión Eucarística.

First Reading, Exodus 34: 4b-6, 8-9

The first reading, from the book of Exodus, describes how God revealed His name to Moses as "Yahweh," which means "I am Who am." But orthodox Jews never used that name. They addressed God by calling Him Lord. The passage also is as close as the Bible comes to giving a definition of God. According to that text, the Lord is "a merciful and gracious God, slow to anger and rich in kindness and fidelity." Every part of that statement stresses God in relationship to humankind, and it emphasizes especially God's great love for us. The revelation of God's nature as Triune was

made by Jesus. In fact the very word "Trinity," referring to Three Persons in one God, one in Godhead yet distinct in Person, is not explicitly spelled out in the Bible, although the doctrine on Trinity is mentioned about forty times in the New Testament without using the term "Trinity." Rather, the early Church arrived at the doctrine of the Trinity when she reflected on the Revelation which she had received from Jesus in Faith.



The word "grace" in a theological context refers to Divine favor. In Christ, God has shown favor toward us humans, a special care for us and a desire that through Jesus' life, death and Resurrection we might find and enjoy a right relationship with God. We often use the phrase "the love of God" to describe our response to God and our duty to love God. That is both correct and appropriate. But what comes first is God's love for us. The Scriptures emphasize that God has loved us first and that our love for God is only a fitting response. And the fellowship of the Holy Spirit: The Holy Spirit shapes and animates the life of the Christian community. In other words, we live our Christian lives in the fellowship, or koinonia, formed by the Holy Spirit because it is He who guides, empowers and teaches in Christ's place and brings us together in Faith, Love and Hope.

In the story of salvation, we usually attribute creation to the Father, redemption to the Son and sanctification to the Holy Spirit. Nevertheless, though they are distinct as Persons, neither the Father nor the Son nor the Holy Spirit ever exists in separation or acts in isolation from the other Two Persons of the Godhead. The inner relationship of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit is such that each of them is fully God, yet They are not three Gods but one. This is not comprehendible by the human mind. It is a Mystery.

1. The development of the Trinitarian doctrine in the Church. The oldest doctrinal formulation of the Church's belief in the Trinity is found in the Apostles' Creed which has served as the basis of instruction for catechumens and as the Baptismal confession of faith since the second century. Later, the Nicene Creed, originating at the Council of Nicaea (A.D 325), stated the doctrine more explicitly. This creed was introduced into

our Western liturgy by the regional council of Toledo in A.D. 589. God has revealed to us three separate functions that are carried out by the Three Persons. He has told us that it is proper to attribute to God the Father the work of creation; to God the Son, the work of Redemption, and to God the Holy Spirit the work of sanctification. Our knowledge of God as Trinity is made possible by God, who has chosen to be revealed as Father, Son and Holy Spirit. > The Triune God as seen in the Old Testament: Since Yahweh, the God of Israel, was careful to protect His Chosen People from the pagan practice of worshipping several gods, the Old Testament books give only indirect and passing references to the Trinity, and the Jewish rabbis never understood them as references to the Holy Trinity. Genesis 1:26 presents God speaking to Himself: "Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness." Genesis 18:2 describes how Yahweh visited Abraham in the appearance of three men, an event that the Russian Orthodox Church celebrates as the "Trinitarian Experience of Abraham." In Genesis 11:7, before punishing the proud builders of the Tower of Babel, God says, "Come, let Us go down among them and confuse their language". These passages imply, rather than state, the doctrine of the Trinity.



In our Holy of Holies, we have ten candles always burning around the tabernacle, just as in the temple in Jerusalem there were ten lights always burning around the Ark of the Covenant. They indicate the presence of our precious Lord in the Blessed Sacrament.

The candles used are seven day candles and may be purchased either in memoriam or for the intentions of a loved one for a \$10 donation through the Seton Shop. This space lists the names of those for whom candles have been purchased.




