Devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Every year, June is dedicated to the Most Sacred Heart of 12. I promise you in the excessive mercy of my Heart Jesus, and we celebrated the solemn feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus on Friday, June 16. To promote and strengthen the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus in our parish, last year we distributed free of charge A3 size (11.3/4 x 16-1/2 in) full-color pictures of the Sacred Heart to a large number of families. This year we distributed more pictures of the Sacred Heart and more prayer cards. With this latest distribution, more than 1800 families have received the full-color picture of the Sacred Heart.

For us Catholics, Jesus Christ is the center of our lives, and the image of the Sacred Heart of Jesus reminds us to live Christ-centered lives. Please remember to say the prayer given in the Sacred Heart Prayer Card every day of the year. If you need more prayer cards, they are always available in the vestibule. Daily prayer to the Sacred Heart of Jesus will help us live Christ-centered lives. Moreover, it will bring us many blessings, as promised by the Lord Jesus to St. Margaret Mary Alacoque.

St. Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690) was a French nun who had a great devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Our Lord Jesus appeared to this saint several times from 1673 to 1675, encouraging her to spread this devotion. During his apparitions, Jesus made 12 promises to those who practice and promote this devotion. The following are the 12 promises made by Jesus.

- 1. I will give them all the graces necessary in their state of life.
- 2. I will establish peace in their homes.
- 3. I will comfort them in all their afflictions.
- 4. I will be their secure refuge during life, and above all, in death.
- 5. I will bestow abundant blessings upon all their undertakings.
- 6. Sinners will find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- Lukewarm souls shall become fervent.
- 8. Fervent souls shall quickly mount to high perfection.
- 9. I will bless every place where an image of my Heart is exposed and honored.
- 10. I will give priests the gift of touching the most hardened hearts.
- 11. Those who shall promote this devotion shall have their names written in my Heart.

that my all-powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the First Fridays in nine consecutive months the grace of final perseverance; they shall not die in my disgrace, nor without receiving their sacraments. My divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in this last moment.

The Sacred Heart of Jesus is the symbol of God's infinite love for us. Pope Leo XIII writes, "There is in the Sacred Heart the symbol and express image of the infinite love of Jesus Christ which moves us to love in return." The Sacred Heart is a reminder of the self-sacrifice of Jesus on the cross for our salvation, and it is constantly throbbing with love for us. Let us consecrate ourselves to him every day and return his love for us by doing his will always in our life.

Loyalty to Jesus in Life

Introduction

Our Scripture readings for this Twelfth Sunday in Like today's Gospel, the first reading, taken from the Ordinary Time call us to preach Christ through our prophecy of Jeremiah, reflects on the sufferings of the words and lives without fear. In the second reading, Paul assures the Christians in Rome that they need not be afraid of opposition both because they share in the death of Jesus and his Resurrection and because they are united with Christ, the new Adam, in his Resurrection.

Today's Gospel passage is taken from the end of Jesus' instruction to the Twelve apostles as he sends them forth in pairs to prepare the people for His own coming, giving them a share in His own powers of miraculous healing. He instructs them to live simply and to expect opposition and rejection. After having predicted future opposition and persecution, Jesus encourages his disciples to stand firm. Three times they are urged, "Do not fear!" "Do not be afraid!"

Instead of shrinking from their task, they are to proclaim the Gospel boldly because they will be protected, just as Jeremiah was assured of God's protection. Hence, Jesus commands his disciples not to fear their persecutors. He presents before them the world, the second Adam brings grace and life. First Reading, Jeremiah 20:10-13

believer. Jeremiah (ca 650 BC to 580 BC) experienced political intrigue. He met active hostility. Nevertheless, Jeremiah was confident that God would not let his enemies overcome him. He declared, "But the Lord is with me, like a mighty Champion: my persecutors will stumble, they will not triumph." He praised God for salvation before he actually experienced it. "Sing to the Lord, praise the Lord, for he has rescued the life of the poor from the power of the wicked!" The passage from Jeremiah contains three voices and three addressees. There is the overall narrator, there is Jeremiah himself, and there are his enemies.

Second Reading, Romans 5:12-15

Paul assures the faithful followers of Jesus that they need not be afraid of opposition because they share in the death of Jesus and in His Resurrection. With words of encouragement, Paul explains why, in spite of their bitter experience of opposition, their work will succeed. Since Jesus, by His death and Resurrection, has conquered sin, Jesus' followers will ultimately succeed in carrying out his work, despite the opposition they encounter. Paul describes Jesus as the new Adam. Where the first Adam brought sin and death into the law, to sin, to self and to the world.
