Infant Jesus of Prague and the Miracles I Experienced

In April 1992, I was in Prague in the Czech Republic to attend an Executive Committee Meeting of the International Union of the Catholic Press (UCIP). During the afternoon on the second day of the meeting, I made a quick visit to the Carmelite church of Our Lady of Victory to see the Infant Jesus of Prague. Devotion to Infant Jesus is popular in Kerala, India, where I come from. Hence, the thought of visiting the statue of Infant Jesus was an added incentive for me to attend the meeting in Prague.

According to a legend, the statue of the Infant Jesus of Prague once belonged to St. Teresa of Avila (1515-1582). Later it came to the possession of a Spanish noblewoman known as Princess Polixena of Lobkowicz. In 1628, she donated the statue to the Carmelite friars of Prague, saying, "Venerable Fathers, I bring you my dearest possession. Honor this image, and you shall never be in want."

With the statue's arrival, the Carmelites started special devotions to Infant Jesus. Holy Roman Emperor Ferdinand II, the king of Bohemia, Hungary, and Croatia, heard about this devotion and sent a monthly stipend for the support of the friars. However, during the Thirty Years' War, the Carmelite friary was plundered in 1630, and the invaders threw the statue into a pile of rubbish. Seven years later, it was found with its hands broken off by Fr. Cyrillus, and he placed it in the church again.

One day, while praying before the statue, Fr. Cyrillus heard these words: "Have pity on me, and I will have pity on you. Give me my hands, and I will give you peace. The more you honor me, the more I will bless you." Soon Fr. Cyrillus got the statue repaired, and devotion to the Infant Jesus resumed. People who prayed before the Infant Jesus began to receive all kinds of blessings, including help with their financial needs. Slowly the devotion spread to other parts of the world.

The devotion to the Infant Jesus is focused on the mystery of the Incarnation. The statue emphasizes the humanity of Jesus and God's closeness to us and his love for us. The statue is 19 inches tall, carved out of wood, and dressed in royal robes. The Infant Jesus wears a crown and holds a miniature globe in his left hand. The right hand is raised in blessing. The globe has a cross on its top, symbolizing his kingship over the world.

Let me now come back to the story of my visit to Prague. Since Our Lady of Victory Church was 25 miles away from the conference center, I took a bus to go there. When I saw the statue of Infant Jesus, I was mesmerized by it. After spending some time in prayer before the statue and enjoying the church's beautiful architecture, I came out looking for a bus.

As I saw a young man standing nearby, I asked him

where I could get a bus to the conference center. He said the last bus to that area would leave within a few minutes from the bus station and that I would have to take the subway to reach the station. Then, to my pleasant surprise, he offered to take me there so I would not miss the bus.

We took the subway, and within minutes, we reached the bus station. At that time, the last bus to my destination on that day was getting ready to leave. Thanking my unknown helper, I ran to the bus and got in before it left the station. As I sat down, I could not believe that a stranger would come to my rescue in a foreign land. However, that is what happened. To this day, I believe the stranger was an angel sent by Infant Jesus to help me!

When miracles happen, they happen one after another. A few minutes after I boarded the bus, I dozed off. Then I woke up to the noise of passengers talking and found out the bus had broken down. The driver warned that the dilapidated bus would need a mechanic to get it started again. Immediately, I began to worry about how to get to my place before sundown.

Getting out of the bus, I looked around. To my pleasant surprise, I could see my conference center within walking distance! Another miracle from the Infant Jesus of Prague! Imagine

what would have happened to me if the bus had broken down several miles away from the conference center! Yes, when we pray to Infant Jesus, he answers our prayers in more ways than we can imagine. The more we honor him, the more he will bless us. That is why when a parishioner suggested that we get the help of Infant Jesus for our Capital Campaign, we placed the statue of Infant Jesus in the church sanctuary.

This statue of Infant Jesus will be a reminder for us to pray to Infant Jesus for the success of our Capital Campaign. It will also be a reminder for us to participate in the Campaign wholeheartedly. If anyone cannot participate in the Campaign because of financial problems, please remember to pray faithfully to Infant Jesus for help, and you will see miracles happening.

The goal of our Capital Campaign is to raise \$7 million. By the grace of God, we have reached \$3.5 million with the participation of 13% of our registered families. Suppose the rest of the families also join in this Campaign to raise money for the maintenance work and renovation of the church, maintenance work of the school buildings, and the construction of a much-needed Family Life Center. In that case, we will soon reach our Campaign goal and complete the project as planned.

Hence, please trust Infant Jesus for all your needs and make your pledge and initial payment as soon as possible, if you have not already done so. The Infant Jesus, in his love and mercy, will bless you abundantly.



Infant Jesus of Prague



Niño Jesús de Praga y los Milagros Yo Experimenté

En Abril de 1992, estuve en Praga, República Checa, para asistir a una reunión del Comité Ejecutivo de la Unión Internacional de la Prensa Católica (UCIP). Durante la tarde del segundo día de la reunión, hice una visita rápida a la iglesia Carmelita de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria para ver al Niño Jesús de Praga. La devoción al Niño Jesús es popular en Kerala, India, de donde vengo. Por lo tanto, la idea de visitar la estatua del Niño Jesús fue un incentivo adicional para asistir a la reunión en Praga.

Según una leyenda, la estatua del Niño Jesús de Praga perteneció a Santa Teresa de Ávila (1515-1582). Más tarde pasó a manos de una mujer noble Española conocida como la Princesa Polixena de Lobkowitz. En 1628, donó la estatua a los frailes Carmelitas de Praga, diciendo: "Venerables Padres, les traigo mi posesión más querida. Honren esta imagen y nunca les faltará".

Con la llegada de la estatua, los Carmelitas iniciaron devociones especiales al Niño Jesús. El Emperador del Sacro Imperio Romano Germánico Fernando II, rey de Bohemia, Hungría y Croacia, se enteró de esta devoción y envió un estipendio mensual para el sostenimiento de los frailes. Sin embargo, durante la Guerra de los Treinta Años, el convento Carmelita fue saqueado en 1630 y los invasores arrojaron la estatua a un montón de basura. Siete años más tarde, fue encontrado con las manos rotas por el Padre Cyrillus, y lo colocó de nuevo en la iglesia.

Un día, mientras rezaba ante la estatua, el Padre Cirilo escuchó estas palabras: "Ten piedad de mí y yo me apiadaré de ti. Dame mis manos y te daré la paz. Cuanto más me honres, más te bendeciré". Pronto el Padre Cirilo hizo reparar la estatua y se reanudó la devoción al Niño Jesús. Las personas que rezaban ante el Niño Jesús comenzaron a recibir todo tipo de bendiciones, incluida la ayuda con sus necesidades económicas. Lentamente la devoción se agudizará a otras partes del mundo.

La devoción al Niño Jesús se centra en el misterio de la Encarnación. La estatua enfatiza la humanidad de Jesús y la cercanía de Dios con nosotros y su amor por nosotros. El estatuto mide 19 pulgadas de alto, está tallado en madera y está vestido con túnicas reales. El Niño Jesús lleva una corona y sostiene un globo terráqueo en miniatura en su mano izquierda. La mano derecha se levanta en señal de bendición. El globo tiene una cruz en la parte superior, que simboliza su reinado sobre el mundo.

Permítanme volver ahora a la historia de mi visita a Praga. Como la Iglesia de Nuestra Señora de la Victoria estaba a 25 millas del centro de conferencias, tomé un autobús para ir allí. Cuando vi la estatua del Niño Jesús, me quedé hipnotizado. Después de pasar un tiempo en oración ante la estatua y disfrutar de la hermosa arquitectura de la iglesia, salí en busca de un autobús.

Cuando vi a un joven parado cerca, le pregunté dónde podía tomar un autobús al centro de conferencias. Dijo que el último autobús a esa zona saldría a los pocos

minutos de la estación de autobuses y que tendría que tomar el metro para llegar a la estación. Luego, para mi grata sorpresa, se ofreció a llevarme allí para que no perdiera el autobús.

Tomamos el metro y en minutos llegamos a la estación de autobuses. En ese momento, el último autobús a mi destino ese día se estaba preparando para partir. Agradeciendo a mi ayudante desconocido, corrí hacia el autobús y subí antes de que saliera de la estación. Cuando me senté, no podía creer que un extraño vendría a rescatarme en una tierra extranjera. Sin embargo, eso es lo que sucedió. ¡Hasta el día de hoy, creo que el extraño era un ángel enviado por el Niño Jesús para ayudarme!

Cuando suceden los milagros, suceden uno tras otro. Unos minutos después de abordar el autobús, me quedé dormido. Luego me desperté con el ruido de los pasajeros hablando y descubrí que el autobús se había averiado. El conductor advirtió que el autobús en ruinas necesitaría un mecánico para ponerlo en marcha nuevamente. Inmediatamente, comencé a preocuparme por cómo llegar a mi casa antes de la puesta del sol.

Saliendo del autobús, miré a mi alrededor. Para mi agradable sorpresa, pude ver mi centro de conferencias a poca distancia. ¡Otro milagro del Niño Jesús de Praga! ¡Imagínate lo que me hubiera pasado si el autobús se hubiera averiado a varios kilómetros del centro de conferencias! Sí, cuando rezamos al Niño Jesús, él responde nuestras oraciones de más formas de las que podemos imaginar. Cuanto más lo honremos, más nos bendecirá. Es por eso que cuando un feligrés sugirió que consiguiéramos la ayuda del Niño Jesús para nuestra Campaña Capital, colocamos la estatua del Niño Jesús en el santuario de la iglesia.

O Menino Jesus de Praga e os Milagres que eu Vivi

Em Abril de 1992, estive em Praga, na República Checa, para participar numa reunião do Comité Executivo da União Internacional da Imprensa Católica (UCIP). Durante a tarde do segundo dia do encontro, fiz uma rápida visita à igreja Carmelita de Nossa Senhora da Vitória para ver o Menino Jesus de Praga. A devoção ao Menino Jesus é popular em Kerala, na Índia, de onde sou natural. Por isso, a ideia de visitar a estátua do Menino Jesus foi um incentivo adicional para eu participar na reunião em Praga.

De acordo com a lenda, a estátua do Menino Jesus de Praga pertenceu a Santa Teresa de Ávila (1515-1582). Mais tarde, chegou à posse de uma dama nobre Espanhola conhecida como Princesa Polyxena de Lobkowitz. Em 1628, doou a estátua aos frades Carmelitas de Praga, dizendo: "Veneráveis Frades, envio-vos a minha maior riqueza. Honrem esta imagem, e nunca terão necessidades."

Com a chegada da estátua, os Carmelitas iniciaram devoções especiais ao Menino Jesus. O Sacro Imperador Romano Fernando II, rei da Boêmia, Hungria e Croácia, ouviu falar dessa devoção e enviou uma bolsa mensal para o apoio dos frades. No entanto, durante a Guerra dos Trinta Anos, a igreja Carmelita foi invadida em 1630, e os invasores deitaram a estátua no lixo. Sete anos mais tarde, foi encontrada pelo P. Cyrillus, com as mãos quebradas e ele colocou a imagem novamente na igreja.

Um dia, enquanto rezava diante da estátua, o P. Cyrillus ouviu estas palavras: «Tende piedade de mim, e eu terei piedade de vós. Dá-me as minhas mãos e eu te darei paz. Quanto mais me honrares, mais eu te abençoarei." Então o P. Cyrillus mandou consertar a estátua e a devoção ao Menino Jesus foi retomada. As pessoas que oraram antes ao Menino Jesus começaram a receber todos os tipos de bênçãos, incluindo ajuda para as suas necessidades financeiras. Lentamente, a devoção espalhou-se por outras partes do mundo.

A devoção ao Menino Jesus centra-se no mistério da Encarnação. A estátua sublinha a humanidade de Jesus e a proximidade de Deus conosco e o seu amor por nós. A estátua tem 19 centímetros de altura, esculpida em madeira e vestida com vestes reais. O Menino Jesus usa uma coroa e segura um globo em miniatura na mão esquerda. A mão direita é levantada em bênção. O globo tem uma cruz no topo, simbolizando a sua realeza sobre o mundo.

Permitam-me que volte agora à história da minha visita a Praga. Como a Igreja de Nossa Senhora da Vitória ficava a 25 quilómetros do centro de conferências, apanhei um autocarro para ir até lá. Quando vi a estátua do Menino Jesus, fiquei hipnotizado por ela. Depois de passar algum tempo em oração diante da estátua e apreciar a bela arquitetura da igreja, saí à procura de um autocarro.

Quando vi um jovem nas proximidades, perguntei-lhe onde poderia apanhar um autocarro para o centro de conferências. Ele disse que o último para aquela área

sairia em poucos minutos da estação e que eu teria que apanhar o metro para chegar à estação. Então, para minha agradável surpresa, ele ofereceu-se para me acompanhar até lá para que eu não perdesse o autocarro.

Apanhámos o metro e, em poucos minutos, chegamos à estação. Nessa altura, o último autocarro para o meu destino naquele dia estava a preparar-se para partir. Agradecendo ao meu ajudante desconhecido, corri para o autocarro e entrei antes que ele saísse da estação. Quando me sentei, não pude acreditar que um estranho viria ao meu socorro numa terra estrangeira. No entanto, foi isso que aconteceu. Ao sair do autocarro, olhei ao meu redor. Para minha agradável surpresa, pude ver o centro de conferências a uma distância bem perto! Mais um milagre do Menino Jesus de Praga! Imagine o que teria acontecido comigo se o autocarro tivesse avariado a vários quilómetros de distância do centro de conferências! Sim, quando oramos ao Menino Jesus, Ele responde às nossas orações de mais maneiras do que podemos imaginar. Quanto mais o honrarmos, mais Ele nos abençoará. Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, Isaiah 55:10-11; Romans 8:18-23; Mathew 13:1-23

What Kind of Soil Are We?

Introduction

We all realize the sad truth that only a few professing Christians are really living productive spiritual lives. Hence, today's readings invite us to take a positive and optimistic view of the missionary efforts we make, and to continue to bear witness to Christ's Gospel through our transparent Christian lives, instead of turning cynical and becoming depressed. In the first reading, Isaiah, in the midst of a desert, can feel sure of the approach of spring for his people. Like Isaiah, all religious reformers confidently depend on the power of God's word. In the second reading, St. Paul reminds us that suffering is part of creation (seeds must fall into the earth and die in order to produce a fruitful life) and suffering and death produce redemption. Paul is expectantly waiting for his eternal reward, as he has sowed the word of God diligently and suffered for the Lord. Today's Gospel assures us that, since God is in charge, He will bring the harvest, and it will be abundant. We need not despair if that harvest is not immediately visible. The Church in every century has seen people reject Christ, as illustrated in the *parable of the sower*. The parable tells us to do our part by preparing fertile soil in our hearts for the word of God to yield 30-, 60- or 100-fold. We are to imitate the farmer who loses no sleep over a few seeds eaten by birds or a few suffocated seedlings. He knows well that the harvest will depend on the quality of the soil and the care and attention the seed receive.

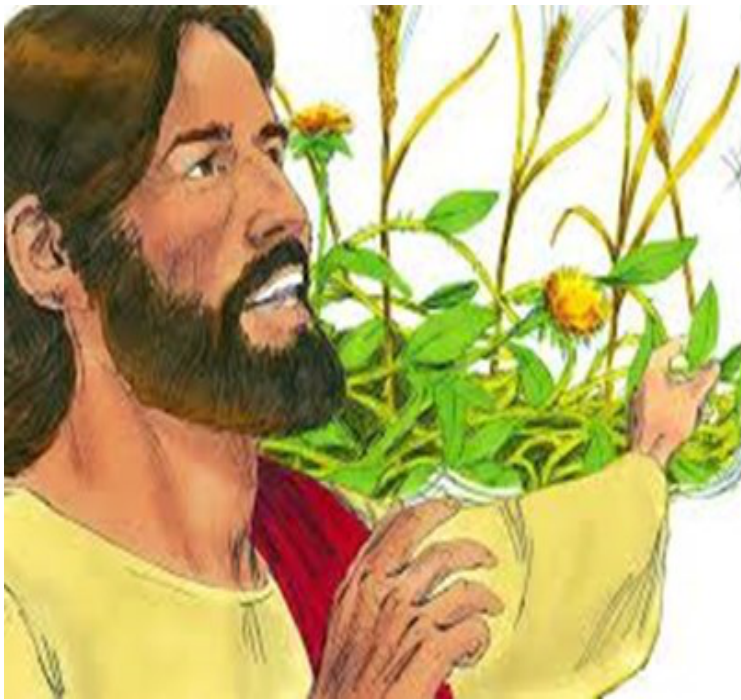
First Reading, Isaiah 55:10-11

The prophecies collected in Isaiah, chapters 40-55, are known as the Book of Consolation. Written for the exiles who would return from Babylon to Judah, the chapters are meant to comfort the dispirited people.

There are promises of fertile land and restoration, water for the thirsty, and secure defense against enemies as the result of Yahweh's power, and mercy. What Isaiah means is that, like rain and snow which water the earth so that seeds may sprout and grow, God's word will accomplish its purpose, in this case, to return the exiles to their homes in peace. Their return will be an everlasting memorial to the power of Yahweh's word. Thus, today's passage promises spiritual fertility. It implies that God will make the peoples' religious lives fruitful, as He has done for their land. And it could bespeak a promise that God will make fruitful the work of the prophet, whose job it is to proclaim God's word. In this reading and in today's Gospel, we are assured that God shares His abundance with us and that His plans will not be frustrated. That is why Jesus in today's gospel talks about the wonderful effects on human life from the rain-like Word of God.

Second Reading, Romans 8:18-23

In this passage, descriptions of our spiritual distress are combined with descriptions of nature's distress. Following in Jesus' footsteps, Paul reminds the community in Rome of their obligation to trust God's word. But he does not use Isaiah's farming imagery. Instead, Paul states that the sin of Adam has brought corruption both to humankind and to nature. Genesis 3:14-19 describes nature turning against the convicted Adam and Eve. For Paul, then, what God is doing for us in Christ will redeem, not just mankind, but nature too. Paul uses agricultural imagery when he explains to his readers that they enjoy "the first fruits of the Spirit." Paul advises us to be patient in awaiting redemption and the kingdom.



seed to germinate, the seed is already there. Even the tiniest seed of God's love can produce in us a harvest beyond our imagining. The Church is prodigal too, proclaiming the Gospel among primitive tribes in far-away jungles and among teenage gangs in urban ghettos, trusting in the power of the word of God which is described as a "sharp sword" (Is 49:2), "two-edged sword" (Heb 4: 12), and "fire and hammer" (Jer 23: 29). In other words, God's Word is powerful – and, as we know, no power exists that can frustrate it.

Yield depends on soil type: The good spiritual yield in life depends on fully and willingly a person accepts and responds to the word of the Lord. His word never blossoms alongside greed, snobbishness and the love of the easy life. Christ is the sower, and while we desire to be good soil, we know there are times when we are pretty shallow like the depth of soil along the path. There are areas of rock in our lives where God's word has not taken root, and there are areas where God's word finds difficulty in taking root. In his parable of the sower, Jesus uses four different soil-types to represent four separate responses people can give to God's saving word. In fact, each one of us may display all four different types of soil at various time in our personal lives.

Gospel Reading, Mathew 13:1-23

A parable to boost morale: The word "parable" comes from the Greek word *parabole*, which means putting two things side by side in order to confront or compare them. And that is exactly how Jesus uses parables: He places a simile from life or nature against the abstract idea of the reign of God. Jesus' parable of the seed sown in various soil types was an attempt to boost the morale of his frustrated disciples. They were upset and discouraged because they realized that their master was facing opposition and hostility from the scribes, Pharisees and priests. The synagogues refused to admit him to preach. So, Jesus had to go to beaches and hillsides. Some of the Pharisees were planning to trap him, and the common people were more interested in his ability to heal them than in his preaching. Using the parable of the sower in today's Gospel, Jesus assured his confused disciples that the "Good News" he preached would produce the intended effect in spite of opposition and controversy. Matthew may have included this parable in his Gospel, because his own Judeo-Christian community had experienced similar adverse reactions from their fellow-Jews, just as people today are frustrated in their attempt to live the Gospel in our consumerist, hedonist, secularist, materialist, atheistic/agnostic society.

A parable of God's prodigality. Matthew's Gospel, Chapter 13, repeats seven parables Jesus taught on the shore of the Sea of Galilee. The parable of the sower is the first. Some Bible scholars think that Jesus told the parable in verses 3-9 and that the early Church may have added the allegorical interpretation in verses 18-23. According to the traditional Palestinian farming practices, sowing often precedes plowing. We can assume that the sower intended to come back and plow the seeds into the soil. This parable is a story of God's prodigality, sowing seeds right and left, in abundant measure, so that we constantly receive the word in our hearts from a merciful and generous sower. God is always scattering the seeds of His kingdom around us whether we deserve them or not, so that when the soil of our hearts is ready for the

1. Soil along the path. This soil is too hard to absorb the seed. Soon the birds eat it up or passers-by trample it under foot. Jesus explains that this soil is like the person who hears the word of God without letting it sink in. The seed/word is then replaced by worldly concerns. This type of soil represents people whose hearts and/or minds are closed because of laziness, prejudice, fear, pride, or immoral living. You and I are called to "sow" God's word in our children, and to live out the values that Jesus "sowed" in us through his Church; but first we must open our hardened hearts and become true disciples (CCC #546).

2. What kind of soil are we? How do we respond to the Word of God and to the various Acts of God in our lives? Do we allow the trials and tribulations of this world to overwhelm the tender seed growing within us? Do we pull back when people harass us because we are believers? Do we decide, because things are not working out the way we think they ought, that God doesn't care for us, or that He is powerless, weak, and not to be heeded? Do we allow the cares of this world, our ambitions, or our desires for success and happiness, to choke out the messages that God sends us through the various events of our daily lives and through the various people we encounter? How we respond to the Word of God is the key to how fruitful the Gospel is going to be in our lives. Unlike the situation in nature, we can, as it were, change the kind of soil that we are. God allows the seed to land on the hard paths, on the rocky ground, and in the thickets of our lives in the hope that in those places it will find a place to mature and bear fruit, that those things which impede growth will be removed, and that the soil may be just a little deeper than it at first appears to be in those rocky places.

Jesus challenges us in the parable of the sower to sow seeds of encouragement, joy, and reconciliation regardless of the "soil" on which it is scattered, and to imitate the seed's total giving of self that becomes the harvest of Gospel justice and mercy.

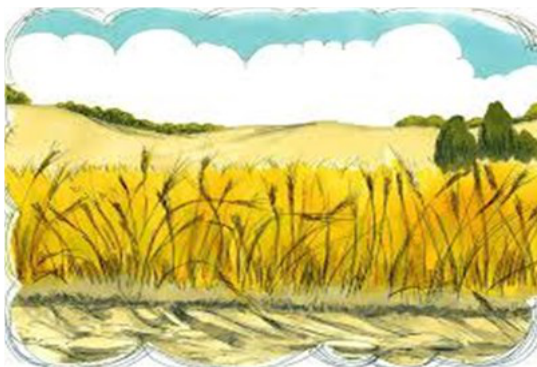
Anecdote

Sonora 64 and IR 8: Agricultural scientists like Dr. Norman Borlaug from the U.S., Dr. M. S. Swaminathan from India, and Dr. Gurdev Khush from the Philippines proved to the world that seed has enormous power in it to save a nation from poverty. In the sixties, political scientists were predicting massive worldwide famine, acutely hitting countries like India with its 440 million people and leaving millions to starve. There was, however, one scientist who saw things differently.

His name was Dr. Norman Borlaug an agronomist from the U. S. who went to India with a seed called "Sonora 64," a wheat seed he developed at the *International Maize and Wheat Improvement Centre* in Mexico. Borlaug convinced the Indian agricultural scientists and the government authorities to give it a try. They planted some Sonora 64 wheat in

the Punjab region of India. The results were spectacular and soon they were using it throughout the subcontinent.

Later, they introduced a new variety of rice, called IR8, developed by Dr. Gurdev Khush at the *International Rice Research Institute* at Manila, Philippines, and it brought even better results: It increased rice production five-fold without using chemical fertilizers and ten-fold by using chemical fertilizers. These new seeds enabled India and other Asian countries to avert famine. Today with 1,378,604,014 people (as of Monday, May 25, 2020—www.Worldometers.info), India produces a food surplus and has become a major rice exporter, shipping nearly 4.5 million tons in 2006. Here we see the power of a seed. Jesus tells us in today's Gospel about the far superior power of the word of God. [Fr. Phil Bloom (<http://www.homilies.net/e/E-08-07-13.asp>).

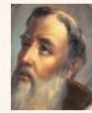

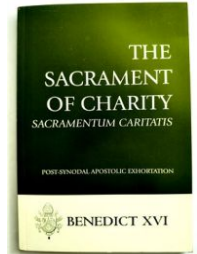

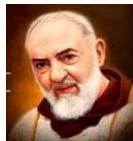
