Our Lady of the Rosary

October 7, 1571. It was on this day the combined naval forc-celebrated in October, the month of October is now dedicates of the Pope, Spain, and Venice defeated Ali Pasha of the ed to the rosary. Ottoman Empire at the Battle of Lepanto, near Athens. The Ottomans had around 300 ships, and they lost almost all of them, either sunk or taken. They also lost 7500 of their men. On the contrary, the forces of the Pope, Spain, and Venice lost only a few of their ships. Moreover, they were able to release 15,000 Christian rowers who were slaves on the Turkish ships.

Pope Pius V attributed this great victory to the power of the rosary rather than the power of cannons, as the rosary confraternities at Rome and elsewhere were holding rosary processions during the time of the battle. Hence, he introduced the Feast of the Blessed Virgin Mother of Victory in 1572 to commemorate this unbelievable victory. His successor, Pope Gregory XIII, renamed this feast the Feast of the Holy Rosary the following year. But in 1969, the feast's name became 'Our Lady of the Rosary.' This feast is now being celebrated on October 7. Because the feast of Our Lady of the Rosary is

According to legend, it was our Blessed Mother herself who asked St. Dominic (1170-1221) to say the rosary as a form of prayer. Pope St. Pius V, who was a member of the Dominicans, approved the rosary in its present form and promoted it as a popular Christian devotion. Rosary as a prayer is primarily based on Scripture as all its 'mysteries' are taken from the context of incarnation and redemption. Also, the first part of the prayer, 'Hail Mary' is totally taken from the New Testament. The second part, however, was added by the

For Pope John Paul II, the rosary was his most favorite form of prayer. In fact, it was through his devotion to the Blessed Mother that he became closer to the Lord Jesus. Let us also remember to say the rosary every day and grow in our devotion to the Mother of our Lord Jesus. If we are faithful in saying the rosary, we can be confident that she will be with us to protect us, especially at the time of our death.

Nuestra Señora del Rosario

7 de Octubre de 1571. Fue ese día en que las fuerzas navales combinadas del Papa, España y Venecia derrotaron a Ali Pasha del Imperio Otomano en la Batalla de Lepanto, cerca de Atenas. Los Otomanos tenían alrededor de 300 barcos y los perdieron casi todos, hundidos o capturados. También perdieron 7,500 de sus hombres. Por el contrario, las fuerzas del Papa, España y Venecia perdieron sólo algunos de sus barcos. Además, pudieron liberar a 15,000 remeros Cristianos que eran esclavos en los barcos Turcos.

El Papa Pío V atribuyó esta gran victoria al poder del rosario más que al poder de los cañones, ya que las cofradías del rosario en Roma y otros lugares realizaban procesiones del rosario durante la época de la batalla. Por lo tanto, introdujo la Fiesta de la Santísima Virgen Madre de la Victoria en 1572 para conmemorar esta increíble victoria. Su sucesor, el Papa Gregorio XIII, cambió el nombre de esta fiesta a Fiesta del Santo Rosario al año siguiente. Pero en 1969, el nombre de la fiesta pasó a ser "Nuestra Señora del Rosario". Esta fiesta ahora se celebra el 7 de Octubre. Debido a que la fiesta

de Nuestra Señora del Rosario se celebra en Octubre, el mes de Octubre ahora está dedicado al rosario.

Según la leyenda, fue nuestra Santísima Madre quien pidió a Santo Domingo (1170-1221) que rezara el rosario como forma de oración. El Papa San Pío V, que era miembro de los dominicos, aprobó el rosario en su forma actual y lo promovió como una devoción cristiana popular. El Rosario como oración se basa principalmente en las Escrituras, ya que todos sus "misterios" se toman del contexto de la encarnación y la redención. Además, la primera parte de la oración, 'Ave María', está totalmente tomada del Nuevo Testamento. La segunda parte, sin embargo, fue añadida por la Iglesia.

Para el Papa Juan Pablo II, el rosario era su forma favorita de oración. De hecho, fue a través de su devoción a la Santísima Madre que se acercó más al Señor Jesús. Recordemos también rezar el rosario todos los días y crecer en nuestra devoción a la Madre de nuestro Señor Jesús. Si somos fieles al rezar el rosario, podemos estar seguros de que ella estará con nosotros para protegernos, especialmente en el momento de nuestra muerte.

Nossa Senhora do Rosário






