

Why is Iesus so hard to see? That question wells up as I spend time with the story told by Cleopas and his companion to the stillunrecognized Jesus walking with them to Emmaus. Why not say "Hey guys! Its me-Jesus!"? Why vanish as soon as they realize He is their companion at table? Why doesn't Jesus just make Himself clearly present by-oh say-answering Pope Francis' (and our) prayer that this Coronavirus just disappear...or any of a thousand good things to make life and faith-easier?

Well, when Peter could not see seeing suffering as part of being Messiah, Jesus in Mt 16:23 responded "you are setting your mind not on divine things but on human things." Admittedly, my mind easily goes to human things-comfort, understanding, what is satisfying or pleasing to me. So even with that as a given, what might be the divine things God wants my mind set upon?

One is the reverence with which God holds our freedom. Faith is always a gift from God but it is also a free choice! I was praying before Mass Easter morning about how convicting it would be for the pandemic to just be over on Easter. With 2/3 of the world under quarantine, who could refute that the God of Jesus Christ, is God indeed!

But God invites faith. The Divine mind knows the line between freedom, and coercion. By embracing in faith that Jesus was present to Cleopas and companion then, and us today: in the Word of God explained by Christ then and His Church now, in the breaking of the Eucharistic bread at Mass, and in our sharing faith like those back in Jerusalem, I entrust God with setting the line where it needs to be.

Another is in that the Emmaus bound two-were two! returned to Jerusalem to find the Eleven and those with them-more than two! When Jesus seems hidden, or vanishes, He does so into the context of our relationships of faith and self-gift. When my life experiences challenge, gratify, humble or fulfill-in everything-Christ wants us to turn to each other. Together, in His name, as two or more, we will find Him with us in what each shares. While not a substitute for receiving the Eucharist together at Mass, sharing oneself is an encounter with Iesus we can have in midst of a pandemic, even over old technology like the phone, or vikes!-A letter!

God's Divine mind sees togetherness, communion, and sharing as better for faith and love, than our understanding fully how it all works. God has shared enough reasons to believe to respect our rational minds, but not so much that He compromises our will. We find ourselves in the place of faith-together. Heaven is together with God, in God. Nurturing together now, makes sense enough to me for faith, and for loving you and God.




