See the bulletin insert or website for details. The website will also inform you if it has to be cancelled for weather reasons.

Please avail yourself of this and other opportunities to receive Anointing of the Sick. The sacrament is not only for the dying! It is meant to strengthen those who are facing a serious life change because of illness and to assist them by providing spiritual reinforcement. If you later want to be anointed, and find that someone in the same household has a confirmed case of Covid-19, it could be very difficult. Priests have to be mindful of quarantine demands in light of all who need sacramental ministry.

Who may be anointed? Anyone suffering from a serious or chronic illness or facing major surgery may celebrate this sacrament. Old age with physical weakness, or being in an age group or having an underlying condition that makes you vulnerable to Covid-19 are reason for anointing even if no serious illness is present. Please let your relatives or neighbors who would want to receive this sacrament know!

Dear Parishioners,

#### "Are you envious because I am generous?" (Matthew 20:15)

These words of Jesus come at the end of the parable about the kingdom of heaven and Jesus sets up the parable to end in conflict. The first part of the parable gives us two wonderful images.

First, even though we are told that the landowner has a "foreman", we see the landowner going out in search of laborers. The landowner is out looking at dawn, 9 am, noon, 3 pm, and 5 pm. That is intense searching. Jesus is revealing how intense and personal God wants us.

Second, that must be one heck of a good sized vineyard! There is always room for one more in God's vineyard. God has room for you!

The second part of the parable could have been very peaceful, yet edifying. If the landowner paid the first workers first, no conflict would have happened. They would have been gone by the time the last ones were paid. However, Jesus tells the parable so that the first had to see the last and see the landowner's generosity.

Why would Jesus do that? Does he want more from us than simply seeing the last shall be first and the first shall be last? It seems as though Jesus wants us to take on the mind of God. Can you not rejoice in God's generosity when another is the beneficiary?

To embrace a mindset that searches for the other; a mindset of enough room for everyone; a mindset where we are never envious of generosity.

These are challenging mindsets. Most of the time we will not get there by intellectually thinking about it. We need to emotionally respond as well. However, it does not seem that this is our language today. When we talk about emotions, we typically use the language of "react" rather than "respond." It is as though our emotions act outside of us or on us. It does not have to be that way.

In St. Paul's letter to the Ephesians, a passage cited every Wednesday in our prayers, St. Paul lays out the difference between reacting and responding. In this situation, he is speaking of anger. He acknowledges that anger hits us; it does seem to come from outside of us. However, he says, "Therefore, putting away falsehood, speak the truth, each one to this neighbor, for we are members one of another. Be angry but do not sin; do not let the sun set on your anger, and do not leave room for the devil" (4:25-27).

Jesus places before us an invitation to take on the mind of God and God gave the gifts for us to embrace the invitation through both the gift of thinking and emotion. How can we help one another use them well and respond rather than react?




