

"To the weak, I became weak, to win over as many as possible." One does not have to live very long to know that we all are a mix of strengths and weaknesses.

Much of life is spent maximizing our strengths, putting them to work for our benefit, and minimizing our experience of being weak in any way. Perhaps our deepest desire, however, is to know that we are loved in the midst of weaknesses. God responds to that need in Jesus Christ who accepted the powerlessness of death on a cross and rising again **not** to **condemn us,** but to share His **victory of weakness** over death's power. Weakness *in Christ* is a *path to*–and not a *detriment to*–the fullness of human life.

So much of seminary formation for the priesthood is what we call *human formation*. Much of that is becoming aware of one's weaknesses and being able to *work with them rather than hide them* in ways that keep one from sharing oneself and being a "bridge to Christ."

That ability to share out of one's weakness is the work of Grace in all of us—a self-acceptance that God's love for me *in my weakness and sin* makes possible. It is the fruit of prayer, and then risking to offer you my incompleteness to receive if you will. Christ's love makes it all possible! That offered vulnerability is at the core of all human relationships from marriage and parenting, to friendships, and the bonds of a shared humanity. It's what Pope Francis hopes we all take away from this pandemic as a grace in the midst of so much *weakness in common*.

St. Paul commends Christians to this ministry of *becoming weak* for you, that is really a showing and sharing of one's already *present weaknesses*. That is why at the core of parish life are the ways we become weak to each other—we welcome those who are new because we need their witness of faith; and we ask you to share your gifts to foster parish life because it will inevitably bring your also sharing weaknesses, needs, desires that turn us all to Jesus and to each other. Parish life and staff and ministries change as we try to better *become weak to the weak*. We are all weak! Grace allows us to see that as a doorway to a shared joy, if in the strength we have in Christ, and for the sake of the Gospel, we can admit it, and share it!

Lent is a great time to work with owning, and sharing our weaknesses *In Christ.* Be watching next weekend's mail for our Lenten newsletter and the opportunities it holds.
