

Per the Iowa Department of Public Health: Bureau of Health Statistics, adoptees may now receive a noncertified copy of the certificate of birth prior to adoption. Dear Parishioners,

Today we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption, a feast flowing from Tradition with a capital "T". In our Catholic faith, we speak of "Sacred Tradition and Sacred Scripture, then, are bound closely together, and communicate one with the other" (Catechism, 80). We do not have direct Scriptural evidence of Mary's Assumption into heaven and the dogma of the Assumption was not proclaimed as definitive until 1950. Yet, the wide held belief, evidence of this belief, and a wide demand for further investigation caused Pope Pius XII to confirm this ancient and universal teaching.

As you finish reading this paragraph and yawn, you may wonder why I think this matters today. For all of its messiness, the church is a reflection of the human person's attempt to accept our redemption in Jesus Christ. As the church functions by both scripture and tradition, so does the human being. We know that what we say has to impact what we do. I can say my own words of scripture, "I am going to eat a healthy diet" but if my tradition leads me to chocolate ice cream, Doritos, and eating at 9 pm, my words do not have much meaning.

Yet, we live in a culture that wants to absolutely reject all tradition. Listening to a podcast about the novel, Jane Eyre, an 1847 novel by Charlotte Bronte', a commentator noted the orphan forced the family traditions to be broken and the novel moved forward only by the orphan (Jane, in this case) reinventing herself (The orphan genre was widespread during this time.) In stating why these old novels have meaning for us today, she said, "We are all attempting to live as orphans today." What is the problem with rejecting tradition?

While it is a problem for the church, it is a greater problem for the human being. While purification of our traditions is constantly in need, the thought that we can reject tradition without consequence to ourselves is naïve as well. Without recognizing it, we begin to create our own traditions that change our scriptures without full awareness. It is manifested in subtle ways: how we spend our time-scrolling through Facebook, consumed by Pinterest, clicking on a pornographic website, or playing video games. These actions range from immoral to benign from a content (scripture) point of view. However, the act of spending hours online doing these things changes the function of our lives (tradition). No matter how hard we try to reject tradition, we will pass traditions on to the next generation. Will they be good traditions?

The traditions of the church try to reflect upon this very reality and today the church holds up the Tradition of Mary's assumption into heaven as a tradition that is meaningful for understanding our own lives and our ultimate end. God gives us the virtue, example, and promise of Mary as a tradition worthy of emulation. We do not have to do this on our own!

God knows human beings live well when our traditions are well formed by the words we live by. Mary heard the Word (Jesus, bore the Word, embraced the Word, suffered with the Word, and received the reward of the Word. We are not orphans, we are sons and daughters of this same Word. I pray we can do two things, First, may we be more aware of the traditions we are creating. Second, may we embrace the traditions that unite us more closely to the Word like Mary did. In Christ,


