

"April showers bring May flowers" the adage goes. With May come many other celebrations of the preparation that went before. This month is full of year-end school concerts, graduations, our ordinations in the Church, and more.

In the Gospel, the "beloved-ness" that grew in the relationship between the Beloved Disciple and Jesus allowed him to lead the way in recognizing Jesus there on the shore. "It is the Lord!" he said to Peter.

This is not the first time John's gospel teaches us that *love* will be first to realize things - the beloved disciple reached the tomb first, Mary Magdalen was the first to encounter the Risen Lord, now again *love leads the way*. Love—sharing in each others' life as Jesus shared His—sharpens our ability to recognize Him with us.

Love leading the way to recognizing Christ invites us to ask a couple of questions. First: how am I returning God's love for me, so like the Beloved Disciple, I can grow in sensing Jesus with us when others cannot? The liturgies of Holy Week prior to Easter offer us guidance:

- Holy Thursday's foot-washing invites us to return God's love in service to those we know and those we do not.
- Good Friday's reverence of the Cross invites our acting with trust in God's faithful care to respond.
- The Easter Vigil's celebration of Christ sharing His life in our baptisms encourages us to share our lives generously, too.

Every Mass is an encounter with Jesus' gift of His very self in love. We leave empowered to return His love for us in all of these ways.

The second question to ask is: "How do *I* lead with love?" One of the gifts of one's *home and family* is the setting it provides for practicing how to lead with love as disciples of Jesus:

- Do I respond generously and consistently to each other's needs, or the needs of life together?
- Are we nurturing simple expressions of affection that make it easy to express?
- Do I see the chores that go with sharing a home as ways to say "I love you!" and "We are important to me!"?

Leading with love in my reactions to you will help us both see Christ with us, and in us! It will help us all return the beloved-ness God holds each of us in, and be seen as disciples who recognize their Lord.

One more thing about our liturgies. We have extended mask-wearing by ministers of the Eucharist through Easter to give additional time for those wearing them to become comfortable with attending Mass. As of Mother's Day weekend we will no longer require their use.


