

# **PARISH FINANCIAL** REPORT

What do you think about the role of a "prophet"? In our readings today, we have two different images.

Isaiah uses his poetic skill to share God's Messiah transforming the world. This vision became particularly important to our Church because of a single line: "a little child to guide them" (11:6). This prophecy spoke about a reality occurring sometime in the future and 600 years later Jesus was born.

In John the Baptist, we have a prophet who proclaims a completed task: "Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is **at hand!**" (Matt. 3:1). John is not predicting the future but proclaiming the fulfillment of prophecy. Profoundly different messages yet both are called prophets.

Somehow, our religious ancestors were able to recognize and learn from both of them. Who are our "prophets" today? Who shares both hope and challenge? I would love to be able to answer that question. All I can offer is a few questions to test a prophet's message.

- 1. Does the prophet's message have weight? In our Gospel, John gives us the image of the chaff being blown away and the heavy seed remaining. We have to weigh the truth of a prophet's statement because we live in a world of hyperbole.
- 2. Does a prophet's message have a transcendent message? Although John's message was immediate, the focus is on the "kingdom of heaven." The human person is so much more than what can be seen. A prophet has to engage all aspects of the person.
- 3. Does a prophet's message depend upon secret or hidden knowledge? John coming in the desert signals the barrenness of his message. It is available for all to come and see. As part of the Catholic Church, we are gifted with Scripture and Tradition that is completely public and helps us evaluate any prophetic message.

This season of Advent invites us to be challenged and discover hope through the gift of faith revealed by the prophets. How do we help one another embrace the "little child" to lead us?

# CATHOLIC Q&A

What's the story behind the Advent wreath?

Each season in the liturgical calendar comes with its own local and regional rituals. During the Advent season, wreathes adorn church sanctuaries and family dining room tables. You may have said Advent wreath prayers in childhood or taken a turn lighting the candles. The Advent wreath is full of symbolism about Christ and his coming at Christmas. The wreath is made of evergreen boughs, reminding us that the life of grace doesn't falter with the changing seasons. It always remains fresh and new. Similarly, a circular wreath reminds us of the eternal, neverending nature of God's love.

Candles remind us that Christ is the light of the world, the One who "shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it." We use four candles to represent each week of Advent. Traditionally they come in the liturgical colors of the season. Purple has historically represented penance and sacrifice. We see the same color for the season of Lent. On the third Sunday of Advent, however, we light a rose color. The priest will wear rose vestments at Mass. This is Gaudete Sunday. Gaudete means "rejoice" in Latin. On the third Sunday of Advent, we're roughly halfway through the season. The Church chooses the midpoint to remind us to celebrate in the midst of our anticipation! Whatever the color and whatever the day, the Advent wreath is a beautiful practice to focus our attention on Christ's coming at Christmas. ©LPi

#### 2022 STO Tax Credits Available Through December 31



#### **Baptism**


