


Memorial Day weekend was long a symbol for me and my family. It marked the beginning of summer, the first weekend of the pool opening, and the breaking free from school. Crossing that Memorial Day threshold just seems to bring with it that inherent freedom found in summer. It flips a switch in my mind that makes me think of sweet corn, cook-outs, and summer adventures.

As a Church we are also crossing one of those thresholds that leads us into a whole new way of life - one of gifted freedom and energy, one that changes everything about our life. During the Easter season we have heard in the Scriptures about a whole new way of living that the disciples have begun. We see a newly confident Peter, who instead of running away now proudly stands up to the Jewish authorities. We see great healings, a missionary spirit, we see even the biggest sinners come to startling and powerful conversions. Something new has happened to these people.

Each of these stories takes place after Pentecost. After Jesus gives the gift of the Holy Spirit to His Disciples. Today we celebrate Pentecost, not as a memory, but as a living act of Jesus. Jesus bestows the gift of the Holy Spirit upon us today so that we might be freed from the prison bars of death and be transformed into bold evangelical disciples like Peter, Paul, and so many others.

The Holy Spirit bears gifts for each of our lives - principally that we each might know that we are sons and daughters of God and that nobody can take that identity away from us. That we are disciples of Christ, journeying together to better love God and neighbor. That each of us is a special and unrepeatable instance of God's love. The gift of the Holy Spirit is a life transformed and on fire for the heart of Jesus.

Yet as we dwell in this new age of the Holy Spirit we all too often pass these gifts by and rather rely on our own initiative and strength. We are forgetful that God has made us into temples of the Holy Spirit. So we pray together that ancient prayer of the Church, "Come, Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love." May the Holy Spirit come down upon all of us today as at Pentecost! Let us cross this threshold together and invite the Holy Spirit to transform our lives and banish out fear and doubt. Jesus is alive, and the world needs Him - the world needs you to let the Holy Spirit in!

#### **Baptism**

These sacraments are typically celebrated when a child is 7 or 8 years old, or in second grade. At St. Columbkille, we have a firm belief that since Reconciliation and Communion are part of everyday Catholic living, preparing for these sacraments at home within the family is essential. We are guiding families in a way that not only provides parents with the tools they need to prepare their child, but also walking with them to learn how to use those tools in their daily Catholic family life. 
