NATURAL FAMILY PLANNING WEEK July 23–29, 2023



The Joy of Columbkille Golf Outing is not far off—2 weeks! We use time to measure distance to the Outing. The game itself is measured in yards: from where you are to the flag. Recently, a young Ladies professional was disqualified from a tournament because her caddie used a rangefinder to determine the yardage to the flag. Such assistance was not allowed at that particular tournament. Rangefinders are welcome at our golf outing—I for one will need all the help available!

So, what is your rangefinder for how close you are to the Lord? Participating in a weekend Mass offers among the best measures that Jesus gave us. The Scripture we hear allows us to hold our values up to those of Jesus so I can gauge where to grow in mercy, honesty, being welcoming or just, or however those around me need to see more of Christ in me. The Readings also inspire us to believe I can get that close, and live those values and virtues that Jesus says is possible. I can love my neighbor as myself, and God with all my heart, because His Spirit is within me to help.

Receiving the Eucharist then invites me to consider "Do I share myself as fully as Jesus does with me?" Am I willing to draw as near to you as our Savior does to us? Being there to share this hour each week is itself a pretty good measure of one's desire to be seen as "I'm here for you, as Jesus is for me."

At the end of the Golf Outing, regardless of our score, we will all end up in the clubhouse together—if we stay on the course. If we stay close to the Lord, in His mercy, something similar will happen in life, too! Keep getting closer to Him now, so that happens for us, and for those who are using us as their rangefinder for Jesus.

CATHOLIC Q&A

Why do priests wear a Roman collar?

The practice of priests wearing the Roman collar developed in the mid-nineteenth century as an alternative to wearing the cassock which in some places was seen as impractical or which was even outlawed by anti-Catholic legislation. Since its introduction, it has taken different forms, and if you visit different countries today, you will see variation in what priests wear.

The Code of Canon Law simply observes that priests wear "suitable ecclesiastical garb" according to the judgments of the national bishops conferences and local custom (no. 284). The US Bishops have instructed that outside of liturgical functions, a "black suit and Roman collar are the usual formal attire for priests. The use of the cassock is at the discretion of the cleric." Priests who are members of religious communities are to follow the rules of their institute regarding the habit or other approved clothing.

In the end, whether a priest wears the Roman collar, a religious habit, or, as is the case in many European countries, a suit and tie (to distinguish them from Protestant clergy who wear a collar) the goal of their clerical clothing is to serve as a sign of their commitment to guide and to serve, and to also allow them to be truly public figures because they are ordained for the service of all. ©LPi

Baptism
