Parishioner feedback challenges the premise that if we look for and experience the Resurrection in our own lives, the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist will makes sense. The challenge is that we have evidence for the Resurrection: the empty tomb, the change in the disciples, etc. What is the evidence that the bread and wine becomes the Body and Blood of Christ?

The single greatest piece of evidence for me is that our Catholic faith continues to see this participation in the Last Supper as the center of the whole Christian life. The very fact that there is "no evidence" for the Real Presence would make it easy to dismiss, yet it hasn't been.

The passages I have chosen have a two-fold aspect. First, each has a direct encounter with Jesus Christ. Second, each person changed substantially or had a profound new hope. Why is this such a big deal to me? Have you ever attempted to change the fundamental way you are living your life? It seems nearly impossible. In seminary formation, we expect seminarians to change substantially; it is tough yet it happens. It is not just changing habits; they live by a new hope through an ongoing encounter with Christ.

Of our sacraments, the Eucharist is the one we can receive every day and we are called to it on Sundays. Christ enters into our lives in a very subtle and ongoing way. God does not overwhelm, but invites. (I see that as the gift of "no evidence"; it gives us the freedom to simply receive it as complete gift.)

The passage for this week is the woman caught in adultery (John 8:3-11). She is set up, humiliated, and used as a pawn to set up, humiliate, and catch Jesus. Jesus enters into her world, he writes in the ground, and everyone changed. The stone throwers dropped their stones and went away. The woman changed; her hope was transformed. A hope for a quick death became a living hope shaped by mercy (love).

An encounter with Jesus changed the stone throwers and the woman and this is our invitation. The Eucharist is going to change us and that is part of its challenge - do we want to change? From my experience, the answer is a big NO! I remember convincing myself when I was in college that if I could simply disprove the witness of Jesus, then I could do whatever I wanted. I was closer to the stone throwers than I was to the woman, but Jesus still changed me.

May the love (mercy) Jesus reveals to this woman inspire us to be open to the change shown in her resurrected life.

Baptism

Baptism is the basic Sacrament of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. With the new birth through water and the Word, we are freed from sin and regenerated as sons and daughters of God. First Reconciliation & First Communion

These sacraments are typically celebrated when a child is 7 or 8 years old, or in second grade. At St. Columbkille, we have a firm belief that since Reconciliation and Communion are part of everyday Catholic living, preparing for these sacraments at home within the family is essential. We are guiding families in a way that not only provides parents with the tools they need to prepare their child, but also walking with them to learn how to use those tools in their daily Catholic family life.
