

Welcome to our Joy of Columbkille Parish Picnic weekend! Most weeks that begin with our Sunday gathering, the communion in Christ we renew at Mass, becomes visible in relationships beyond those with fellow parishioners. This weekend, the gratitude for each other fostered in the ritual we share each Sunday, is made visible to each other in the more "free-form" of our picnic conversations and games!

As we express and enjoy the life together that being a parish family brings, Jesus' Gospel challenge to be radically forgiving might seem a bit of a "kill-joy." Forgiveness involves things like conflict, humility, or vulnerability--not so easy.

But of all the qualities needed for life-together, from the intimacy of marriage, to the inter-dependence of nations, is any virtue more necessary than forgiveness? Few things engage the self-giving of true love like forgiveness. And, doesn't restoring a relationship thought to be damaged, bring amazing joy?

So it makes sense that Jesus would strengthen our own resolve to work at forgiveness, by inviting disciples to nurture *gratitude* for all God has forgiven us. Our Christian faith makes a radical forgiveness reasonable. When I have no reason to forgive, or expect forgiveness, a Christian can call on three helps:

- Forgiving because *Jesus* loves the offender, not because I do
- Asking or offering forgiveness because Jesus is gracing me to do what I don't have the desire to
- Forgiving out of my love for Jesus, who forgives me for so much

I can't come up with any greater motivation to try again at a relationship that has hurt me multiple times, or to hope that I'll be forgiven again, than bringing faith in Jesus into the hurt.

Forgiveness does not always bring reconciliation, and resuming a prior relationship. That is another step, and not always possible. But gratitude for Jesus empowers forgiveness from my heart.

May our picnic bring us to gratitude for the communion in Jesus we enjoy!

### **SACRAMENTS**

#### **Baptism**

Baptism is the basic Sacrament of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. With the new birth through water and the Word, we are freed from sin and regenerated as sons and daughters of God. #### First Reconciliation & First Communion

These sacraments are typically celebrated when a child is 7 or 8 years old, or in second grade. At St. Columbkille, we have a firm belief that since Reconciliation and Communion are part of everyday Catholic living, preparing for these sacraments at home within the family is essential. We are guiding families in a way that not only provides parents with the tools they need to prepare their child, but also walking with them to learn how to use those tools in their daily Catholic family life.
