This weekend makes me think about the range of a parish's activities again. In addition to Mass, we are celebrating the Sacrament of Anointing after each of the Masses and Baptisms as well. On top of all of that, hopefully you received a letter about our school project in the mail this last week. It seems strange to have such a large project not to be our sole focus but celebrating Mass, Baptisms, Reconciliation, Marriages, and Anointing are so big that they need to shape everything else that we do.

We have known that our school needed to be renovated since we arrived in 2018, but the extent of our renovation and addition has changed over the years. We will be asking for your support of this project and it will not be a small ask. We still have to raise \$2.8 million by February 1, 2024 to make this project go. They kept asking the questions: Should we do this? Can we do this? What should we do? What do we need? Is this the best solution? Their rigor improved this project and allowed them to give unanimous support for our project.

While we have informational meetings scheduled later in October, we are happy to hear any questions that you may have. May our work together always bring a better and brighter focus on God working in our lives no matter the activity.

May God bless and keep our busy parish growing in Christ.

SACRAMENTS

Baptism

Baptism is the basic Sacrament of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. With the new birth through water and the Word, we are freed from sin and regenerated as sons and daughters of God. First Reconciliation & First Communion

These sacraments are typically celebrated when a child is 7 or 8 years old, or in second grade. At St. Columbkille, we have a firm belief that since Reconciliation and Communion are part of everyday Catholic living, preparing for these sacraments at home within the family is essential. We are guiding families in a way that not only provides parents with the tools they need to prepare their child, but also walking with them to learn how to use those tools in their daily Catholic family life.
