

In early May, before I was ordained, Father David set up a preaching schedule with Deacon Travis and me. I looked at the schedule, added some more dates and that was that. About a month ago, I looked at this weekend's readings. And I discovered that I get the gospel with politics and religion – two things that many are told shouldn't be discussed! And I thought I'd have wedding feasts, vineyards and landowners. Thanks, Father David!

Jesus is presented a dilemma by the Pharisees and Herodians and he handles the dilemma to pay the tax or not by using it to push back against both groups. He says, "Repay unto Caesar what is Caesar's and unto God what is God's". That statement puts them between a rock and a hard place as they really can't disagree with either of those statements. So politics and religion are indeed related!

The Church teaches in the Catechism (paragraphs 2238 through 2243) about the duties of citizens – the repaying unto Caesar part. In paragraph 2240, the Church teaches that we have a duty to submit to authority and co-responsibility for the common good, which makes it morally obligatory to pay taxes, to exercise the right to vote, and to defend one's country.

However, in paragraph 2242, the Church also teaches that citizens are obliged in conscience not to follow the directives of civil authorities when they are contrary to the demand of the moral order, to the fundamental rights of persons or the teachings of the Gospel. So, there is a healthy tension there between obeying the competent authority and pushing back when necessary.

Politics, by nature, is a rough thing and these days always seems to be divisive. Think about any hot button issue today, whether it be abortion, the death penalty, euthanasia, the transgender ideology, immigration, or any of the other issues that face the country and divide us. It is easy to take a right wing or left-wing approach and have it dominate our thoughts and actions to the extent that politics suddenly becomes our god and idol. We forget to pay unto God and instead pay solely to Caesar.

Repaying unto God however, does not mean that we retreat from the world and that we do not consider the world of politics. As Catholics, we have a duty to ensure the common good. We do this by both rendering unto Caesar through our duties as citizens and rendering unto God through our duties as Christians.

Let us work hard for the common good AND work for communion with God. Vote when you have a chance. Be active in your community. And help those invisible among us: the poor, the immigrant, the homeless. Live out the Gospel, especially Matthew 25. That's how we will maintain a healthy balance between our duties as citizens and our duties as Christians. That is how we equally repay unto Caesar and repay unto God.

"[M]y chosen one, I have called you by your name, giving you a title, though you knew me not." Isaiah 45:4

**Baptism** 

Baptism is the basic Sacrament of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. With the new birth through water and the Word, we are freed from sin and regenerated as sons and daughters of God. ### First Reconciliation & First Communion

These sacraments are typically celebrated when a child is 7 or 8 years old, or in second grade.
