PASTOR'S REFLECTION

Do you want to become a saint? As we prepare to celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints as a Holy Day of Obligation this Wednesday, that is a worthy question.

I was reminded of that while visiting with a young couple preparing for marriage. In response to: "Why is he the guy to marry?" the bride-to-be responded: "I read Therese of Lisieux's <u>Story of a Soul</u> and was convinced *I will become a saint*. My fiancé is a good man who will help me in that." Of all the answers to that question I've received over the last 26 yrs, "S/he will help me become a saint" is quite rare.

Too bad! Ultimately *to help me become a saint* is a helpful stance from which to receive anyone God sends into my life—be they a great challenge or a clear blessing. Everyone can be of help when what they ask of us, or offer us, is met with my simple, small actions of loving them.

St. Therese's "Little Way" of becoming a saint is just that: performing what she calls "little virtues"—little acts of kindness, selflessness, generosity, or sacrifice for the good of my neighbor.

Well aware of her "littleness" compared with the great saints whose images surround us at St. Columbkille, and her inability to do the heroic and inspiring things they did for Jesus, St. Therese practiced this Little Way of becoming Christ-like. For the last 100 yrs. she has been inspiring countless others—like this young bride—that if we want to, we can become saints, too.

Pope Francis issued an apostolic exhortation "<u>It is Confidence</u>" last week to bring St. Therese's "Little Way" to our attention again. At a time of great complexity in human relationships, he notes: she can help us rediscover the importance of simplicity, the absolute primacy of love, trust and abandonment (to God's taking care of us).

It is confidence that God will help us if we risk to love in simple ways, that gives confidence we can become a saint. What in the end is more important than that?


BOOK READING AND SIGNING

Baptism

Baptism is the basic Sacrament of the whole Christian life, the gateway to life in the Spirit, and the door which gives access to the other sacraments. With the new birth through water and the Word, we are freed from sin and regenerated as sons and daughters of God. We ask expecting couples to visit our website or contact Serena Freisinger at s.freisinger@dbqarch.org during pregnancy to help prepare for the baptism of their child.

First Reconciliation & First Communion

These sacraments are typically celebrated when a child is 7 or 8 years old, or in second grade. At St. Columbkille, we have a firm belief that since Reconciliation and Communion are part of everyday Catholic living, preparing for these sacraments at home within the family is essential. We are guiding families in a way that not only provides parents with the tools they need to prepare their child, but also walking with them to learn how to use those tools in their daily Catholic family life.
