DEACON'S CORNER

It's been quite a few months since we wrapped up our OnebyOne capital campaign, and many of you have been faithfully making payment on your pledges. I thought I'd give you an update on the project for our food pantry.

First of all, a little background. The pantry was started by Deacon Tom Craig and a committee of concerned parishioners. It

was located in the parish rectory utilizing the basement and garage. When the latest addition was added to the church, there was a room set aside for the pantry. Along the way a small shed was purchased to house some of the overflow of products that were donated from time to time. We have served as many as 140 families in a month, and as few as 40 during the pandemic. Currently we are serving around 50-60 families a month. All in all, the pantry has become a bright shining star of our community and fulfills Jesus' words, "give them some food yourselves." (Mt 14:16).

We are currently reviewing all of our processes by surveying our current pantry clients, and volunteers, as well as, visiting other rural pantries. The decisions we make now, will impact how we operate for many years in the future. I will keep you up to date as we make progress through the winter and into next spring. Thank you again for your support. If you have any questions, please feel free to set up an appointment. I'd be happy to address them with you.
