Summer Reading Program:

We want to clarify a couple of things for our Summer Reading Program:

- #1- This is an optional incentive program. It is not required for every student to complete. And, students are not going to be penalized for not participating.
- #2- Students can complete books independently, read with an adult, or have the book read to them. When they take the Accelerated Reader test, they will have to say if they read the book independently, or with assistance.
- #3- If there isn't an AR test for the book, please have the students in grades 1-2, write a 3-5 sentence summary of the book. In grades 3-5, students write 2 paragraphs summarizing the book. In grades 6-8, directions are on the sheet that was sent home.
- #4- The grades encouraged to participate are incoming 1st-8th grade for the 2025-2026 school year. If you have questions, please feel free to contact me via email, or call the school at 319-334-7173.

The reading program was changed to be more incentive based rather than punitive for students.

From the Desk of Fr. Beckman:

Pentecost means “fifty.” The Jewish Feast of Pentecost comes fifty days after Passover; and just as the Christian Easter is the fulfillment of the Jewish Passover, so the Christian Pentecost comes fifty days after Easter as is the fulfillment of the Jewish Pentecost. In a way, it is like Christmas because just as Christmas is the birth of Christ, Pentecost is the birth of the Church. The Holy Spirit, the soul of the Church, the life of the Church, comes down upon the members of the Church at Pentecost. The symbols of rushing wind (the breath of life), that God is the source of all life; tongues of fire (light and power), illuminating minds and giving strength to believers; and a dove (peacefulness) to calm our weary souls and not to be afraid in adversity. These images help us understand the meaning of this great gift to the Church. Now, our Trinitarian God has been revealed to us. All three are united and eternal. They always act together. God the Father created the world through his Word, the Son, out of love, the Holy Spirit. “God so loved the world that he sent his only Son, not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through him (John 3:16). The Son, Jesus, is the “Logos,” the “Word” and “mind” of the Father whom Jesus revealed more completely. And for the rest of history, beginning with Pentecost, it was also God the Holy Spirit, whom Jesus said he would send as another advocate to lead, guide, inspire, and direct his Church according to all truth. This is the love between the Father and the Son. The love that is so perfect that it is also a person, the third eternal divine person. Because God is love, the aim of love is intimacy, and so the Holy Spirit gives us maximum intimacy with God and God with us. Love desires unity and oneness. St. Paul said that we are “temples” of the Holy Spirit (1Corinthians 3:16; 6:19-20).

**June 8, 2025
Pentecost Sunday
John 20:19-23**

When I was a seminarian almost 20 years ago, a bank vice president taught us etiquette classes. She said, “Gentlemen, please make sure your breath isn’t bad. Take some breath mints before you hear confessions, okay?” We nervously laughed because the proximity that makes breath noticeable (whether pleasant or not) can be a bit awkward.

When Jesus breathes on his Apostles (John 20:22), he must have been within inches of at least some of them. This closeness of his breath has a purpose: the purpose of forgiveness of sins. “Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them” (John 20:23). Why in the world would the almost uncomfortable closeness of his breath forgive sins?

In the Bible, breath is spirit or wind. It comes from above and makes that which is below to have identity. To not have a single identity is to be multiple, divided. The word “sin” comes from an ancient word that means “to split” or “render asunder.” Sin divides us sinners and the world around us; our spiritual “breath” leaves us and our identity splinters. Only breath from above restores. For example, a shattered vase is rendered whole because the craftsman breathes the spirit of the vase back into it when he repairs it. A human being shattered by sin is made whole by the breath of God, breathed by Jesus through his priests. His breath alone forgives sins. It’s always done with his gentle, loving closeness.
