14th Sunday in Ordinary Time
Luke 10:1-12, 17-20

In the days after the awful 2020 killing of George Floyd, a Catholic friend remarked, “Racism is today’s great evil. We should put all our energy into fighting it.” I admired her intuition that the church must stand firmly against evil. Amen, I thought. At the same time, something felt wrong. As months went by, I saw her steadily slide into bitterness and anger. Soon, despondency. She spoke of giving up the fight. Don’t we too wonder how to fight evil without losing our joy or energy?

Jesus’ words this week help. He says, “Rejoice not that you have power over demons, but that your names are written in heaven” (Luke 10:20). Notice the asymmetry in where he wants our focus: on the latter, not the former. Should we confidently embrace our God-given power to overcome evil? Absolutely. But even more so, we should emphasize the positive element of our relationship to God. It is tempting but dangerous to define ourselves by what we oppose. It is better to define ourselves by—to rejoice in—what we celebrate: in Jesus, God has written our names in heaven. This sustains our battles.

This week, our marching orders are: fight evil. But more deeply, rejoice that God knows and loves us personally, individually. We allow this joyful knowledge to undergird our fight against the darkness of our day. Then we enjoy long-term stability to be cheerful warriors, who never forget the reason for the contests we are called to fight and win: love.

Student Tuition Organization:

For those families who have not submitted their STO, or need to complete their application, the closing date for Round 2 is August 8, 2025. If you are needing assistance, please follow the directions below.

- Families that are not required to file federal income tax must check DNF on their application.
- The application VERIFICATION deadline is May 15, 2025. Families must have their 2024 Federal Tax Return completed and their STO application verified by FACTS no later than May 15.
- If they don't make the May 15th Round #1 verification deadline, they will be in the Round #2 consideration pool if all materials are received by August 11th.
- The STO application is required for your local school tuition assistance program.
- The application fee is \$40.00. St. John's is set up to pay for that fee. No SJS Family will pay the application fee.
- If a family needs assistance with their application, they can call the FACTS Helpline at 866-315-9262 Monday - Thursday 7:00 am to 7:00 pm and Friday 7:00 am to 5 pm.

From the Desk of Fr. Beckman:

What does it mean to evangelize? In Church circles today, we speak of the New Evangelization.

What exactly does that mean? One may conclude that missionaries are the one's who evangelize as they bring the message of the Gospel to those who have never heard it before. The seventy-two disciples in today's Gospel were more than missionaries. They not only brought the Good News of Jesus' triumph over sin and death to them, but they lived their lives as though it mattered. They lived their lives out of gratitude to Christ in order to overcome the evil that this world tempts us with. Remember that Jesus told Pontius Pilate, "My kingdom is not of this world" (John 18:36). Jesus' kingdom is not a political or earthly one. His kingdom signifies that the values, principles, and nature of his kingdom differ from earthly ones. His kingdom is free from war, prejudice, oppression, hatred, maliciousness, injustice, immorality, and all other forms of evil. The early evangelizers gave witness to love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, self-control, and praise to God even in the midst of the temptations that this world sets before us. Living out the Lord's calling is as important as making it known. If one doesn't live it out then they are hypocritical. That's why the virtues of prayer, humility, modesty, kindness, generosity, an understanding heart, care and concern for others, especially the sick, the suffering, and the poor, were vital in their ministry. As long as we are in this world their will be many challenges that will confront us, some that are even evil. So, whenever we are being tempted we should turn our thoughts over to God: To God's holiness and goodness, God's healing and comforting power, God's forgiving and merciful heart, God's wisdom and guidance, God's justice and truthfulness, and to God's divine providence and love. May we all share this good news with our families, our friends, our coworkers and colleagues as we bring the Good News of Jesus Christ to a world longing for peace. The peace that only God's Kingdom can bring.
