Luke 12:13-21

Recent studies suggest that millennials will be the first generation in America to be worse off than their parents in terms of financial earnings and job status. Many lament this. I propose that this week's Gospel provides a hopeful way to see the trend as good news.

The Lord Jesus says, "Take care to guard against greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist in possessions" (Luke 12:15). Greed damages us with the deception that we are what we possess. But to Jesus, this is simply not true. What makes us happy is who we are, who we become.

Does not the expectation that every generation should do better than their parents subtly mask the poison of greed? A similar attitude is mirrored in the man who demands that Jesus justly arrange his share of the family inheritance. Despite the injustice, Jesus will not play that game. In fact, he seems to prefer that the man have less than his parents. What good would having more be to this man if he becomes enslaved and miserable by greed? What good would it be for us to have more if it means we become much less?

In allowing the man to have less, Jesus opens a space for him to become more: a man free to love. In that much more meaningful sense, perhaps he was better off than his parents. Maybe the millennials will be, too.

From the Desk of Fr. Beckman:

This week, we continue our reflection on the archdiocese's "Journey In Faith" initiative. We have already reflected on why this happening and the goals of the process. This week, we'll consider the **values** which will guide this process and who will **lead** these efforts along with how it will **impact** our parishes.

First of all, what values will guide this process:

- Prayer:** Deepening our relationship with God
- Worship:** Create a vibrant sacramental life and love for God
- Charity:** Swerving others like Christ
- Lifelong Learning:** Continuing our faith formation

Who will lead these efforts: The archdiocese is leading these efforts and has partnered with Catholic Leader Institute (CLI) to help coordinate our processes for gathering feedback. CLI has assisted many other dioceses in these types of efforts. All final decisions, however, will be made by Archbishop Zinkula after he has reviewed all feedback and considered recommendations from various advisory bodies. Each pastor will identify 3-6 parish leaders to serve as your parish's "Journey In Faith" Parish Team. The pastor and team will be trained by CLI. They will facilitate local parish sessions to gather your response to proposals and compile your ideas about additional options for consideration.

How will this impact our parishes: Every parish in the archdiocese will be grouped with other parishes to create a "Pastorate." Each pastorate will have one pastor and usually one or more other priests called "Parochial Vicars" (previously called associate pastors). This process will also involve:

- Enhanced collaboration with nearby parishes for operations and ministries.
- Share clergy and parish staff
- Adjustments to Mass times and/or locations
- Consideration of future mergers of parishes within the newly formed pastorates

All parishioners are asked to participate in prayer, discernment, and dialogue.


Next week we will look at questions like: Will parishes be closing? What will happen to church buildings? How will decisions be made?
