

## Journey in Faith

The Archdiocese of Dubuque is holding 34 regional informational sessions for parishioners to learn more about the Journey in Faith process.

These sessions will further explain information that will be released at [dbqjourneyinfaith.org](http://dbqjourneyinfaith.org) in early September.

Participants will learn more about:

- Rationale, process, and timeline for Journey in Faith
- Importance of prayer and synodal listening in this process
- Proposed pastorate models as possible new groupings of parishes for the future
- Ways to listen, learn, ask questions and provide insights throughout the process including engaging in your parish's October and November local meetings and providing written feedback via the Journey in Faith website

There are **34 September Regional Journey in Faith Information Sessions** from which to choose. Each is held in a parish church and is scheduled for three hours. Parishioners should attend a meeting held in their Regional Planning Area (RPA). The overall information will be the same at each meeting, however, the proposed pastorate models that are explained will be specific to your RPA. **We will be holding a meeting here at St. John's (Independence) on Saturday, September 20 from 9:00 - 12:00.**

A summary video with key points from those meetings about prayer and synodal listening will be released at the end of September.

**Archbishop Attends SECAM 20th Plenary Assembly: Part 2**

Under the theme "Christ, Source of Hope, Reconciliation and Peace," bishops, priests, religious and lay leaders from across Africa gathered together in Kigali, Rwanda, July 30-Aug. 4 for the SECAM 20th Plenary Assembly. They were joined by representatives from around the world, including the chair of the U.S. bishops' subcommittee on the church in Africa, Archbishop Thomas Zinkula.

SECAM, which stands for the Symposium of Episcopal Conferences of Africa and Madagascar, is the association of Africa's Catholic bishops. SECAM convenes a plenary assembly every three years, and the focus of this year's assembly was the creation of a 25-year pastoral vision for the African church.

Archbishop Zinkula spoke on the first full day of the plenary assembly, having been asked by SECAM's president to deliver a message from the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). Archbishop Zinkula has been chair of the USCCB Subcommittee on the Church in Africa since spring of 2025.

In a message of solidarity, Archbishop Zinkula emphasized the "long-standing and deeply valued" relationship between the U.S. church and the church in Africa. "We are inspired by the faith and resilience of the church in Africa. We, in turn, share with you some of the gifts God has given the church in the United States," he said. In his talk, Archbishop Zinkula highlighted the 2001 USCCB pastoral letter "A Call to Solidarity with Africa," which expressed support for the church and people of the continent. An example of this support, he said, is the USCCB's Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa, which has distributed more than \$40 million, including more than \$900,000 specifically to SECAM programs.

"We believe this is not just financial support," he said, "but a deepening of our ecclesial relationship, built on mutual respect and love." And he said the USCCB will continue "to build and strengthen these ties, not just through grants, but through friendship, collaboration and a shared synodal path."

Many other church leaders from across Africa and the world spoke during SECAM's plenary assembly, and discussions took place on what the church's role should be in addressing some of the significant challenges that Africa faces today. "In their regional reports," Archbishop Zinkula recalled, "bishops mentioned outsiders stealing the continent's natural resources, the effects of climate change, fraud and corruption in government and society, inequality, migration and human trafficking."

There were also discussions about violent conflict, a problem plaguing many regions of Africa. In fact, as church leaders gathered for the plenary assembly, there were more than 35 armed conflicts taking place on the continent.
