From the Desk of Fr. Beckman:

This Advent I ask of you two things: First, be intentionally involved in your faith. Prayerful, active, full and conscious participation is what the New Evangelization calls for. Secondly I ask of you, please, “Embrace the Promise.” You might ask, and just what is that promise?

On the **First Sunday of Advent** the prophet Isaiah calls us to trust in divine rather than human power. He invites us to return to God, our one true source of peace and life. “Come, let us climb the Lord’s mountain, to the house of the God of Jacob that he may instruct us in his ways, and we may walk in his paths. O house of Jacob, come, let us walk in the light of the Lord.”

The readings on the **Second Sunday of Advent** have the prophet Isaiah giving renewed hope for a better future for the people. Peace will once again reign through this “shoot that shall sprout from the stump of Jesse.” The spirit of the Lord shall rest upon him. The attributes of this hoped for king later developed into the traditional gifts of the Holy Spirit.

On the **Third Sunday of Advent** the prophet Isaiah provides two ways in which the renewal promised by God is manifested: the barren wilderness will be filled with new life, and those who suffer physical maladies will be healed of their infirmities. We pray that God will also heal us spiritually, pardoning our sins, and leading us to salvation.

On the **Fourth Sunday of Advent** Isaiah, says the child shall be called “Emmanuel,” meaning, “God with us.” Jesus is a name that means “God saves.” May God dwell within your heart, and remain with you forever.

Each Advent we are reminded of the first coming of our savior at his birth in Bethlehem, and look forward with joyful anticipation to the culminating event of glorification. We also recognize his coming to us in the Eucharist. That he truly is with us, uniting him to us in his body, blood and spirit. During Advent we remind ourselves to be prepared throughout the whole year long that we are to wait and watch with joyful longing, expectation, and hope for the second coming of our Lord in all his glory.

So let us “**Embrace the Promise**” that the Lord will come to each of us this Christmas and remain with us our whole lives long until he comes again. Blessed are you who trust that the Lord’s words will be fulfilled.
