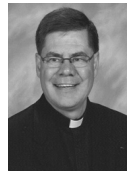

From the Desk of Fr. Beckman:

This week, as we continue with the 8th installment of our reflection on the meaning of Christian death and resurrection of the body, we will take a closer look at how our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit. In every single baptized person, who is not in the state of mortal sin, God lives. He dwells within us, But remember, we have free will, we can choose to separate ourselves from God just as Adam and Eve did. All human life is sacred because it is a gift from God and because we are made in the image of God. This is basic fundamental principle of the pro-life/respect -life movement. The bodies of the baptized have a holiness that comes from sanctifying grace abiding within them. C.S. Lewis once remark in his famous lecture, "The Weight of Glory": *"Next to the Blessed Sacrament itself, your baptized neighbor is the holiest object presented to your senses. They are holy in almost the same way, for in them also Christ is truly hidden."* **The closer and more intimate a person's union with Christ is, the more that holiness manifests in their bodies.** Look at Mother Teresa of Calcutta, or any of the saints. They radiate the love of Christ. People who have met Mother Teresa, and I have met some of her order sisters, often remarked that she was the most beautiful woman that they had ever met, not because she looked like a cover model, she didn't, but because the love of Christ shone forth from her weathered and wrinkled face. Even of those in your family, you can see who is close to the Lord. Importantly, the holiness of the baptized body doesn't end with physical death. Grace continues to linger in the bodies of those united to Christ. That's why Catholic cemeteries are considered holy ground. The bodies of the baptized are buried there. And those bodies are the seed of the resurrected body. "What you sow does not come to life unless it dies. And what you sow is not the body which is to be, but a bare kernel. But God gives it a body as he has chosen, and to each kind of seed its own body (1 Corinthians 15:26-38, 42-44). Please read and reflect upon this most important passage.

I have based this reflection on a book I recently read by Scott Hahn with Emily Stimpson Chapman, entitled: *Hope To Die: The Christian Meaning of Death and the Resurrection of the Body.*
