John 14:15-21

In my family, we can hardly speak about orphans without tears. My father was adopted as a baby. He frequently told us stories of how his parents welcomed him not just into their home but into their hearts. It was never merely a relocation or a legal transaction. It was the joy of being chosen, of receiving a family, a name, and a place where he belonged forever. Even in his later years, recalling that gift still moves him to tears of tender gratitude.

That is the kind of tenderness behind Jesus' words in today's Gospel: "I will not leave you orphans; I will come to you." (John 14:18) He is going away, but not abandoning us. Instead, he sends us the Advocate, the Holy Spirit — his own Spirit, shared with the Father — who dwells in us. Through the Spirit, Christ is present in us, and we are present in him. His Spirit gives us a home and a family.

We deepen this knowledge in the sacraments, in prayer, and in the daily life of the Church. The Spirit is the bond of belonging, the power that makes us God's sons and daughters, not spiritual orphans. And this is not a one-time event. There is always a deeper outpouring of the Spirit available to us, a fresh appropriation of the promise that we are never abandoned.

If only we could be as grateful as my dad is for his adoption, realizing that we have been adopted by God Himself. In Christ, we are never left as orphans.

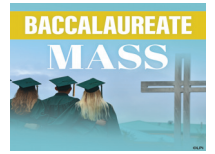

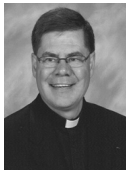

From the Desk of Fr. Beckman:

This week, as we continue with the 17th installment of our reflection on the meaning of Christian death and resurrection of the body, we reflect on our own resurrection. Jesus told us to “*love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind,*” to “*love your neighbor as yourself,*” and “*love one another as I have loved you*” (Matthew 22:37, 39; John 15:12). He also told us to turn the other cheek in a dispute, to give to the poor, and to pray for those who persecute you. He explained that everyone is our neighbor and that we should treat all people as we would want to be treated in any given situation, that whenever we feed the hungry, clothe the naked, give shelter to the homeless, or visit the imprisoned, we are doing those things to and for him. Additionally, Jesus urged us to not worry, fear, or be anxious, but to pray to God as our Father, and to watch and wait for the coming of the kingdom of God. Jesus’ purpose in giving us these teachings wasn’t to create some earthly paradise without sickness, accidents, or victimhood; nor was our reward going to be the privilege of living a nice, comfortable earthly life. The goal of it all was heaven. It was eternal life. It was our resurrection. Jesus says in Matthew 19:17, “*If you would enter life, keep the commandments.*” Then, in Matthew 25, Jesus warns that those who ignore the hungry, the thirsty, the stranger, the naked, the sick, and the imprisoned will “*go away into eternal punishment,*” while the righteous, those who care for the needy instead of ignoring them, will go “*into eternal life*” (Matthew 25:34-46). Jesus also announced: “*For this is the will of my Father; that everyone who sees the Son and believes in him should have eternal life; and I will raise him up at the last day*” (John 6:40). And, “*the hour is coming when all who are in the tombs will hear his voice and come forth, those who have done good, to the resurrection of life, and those who have done evil, to the resurrection of judgment*” (John 5:28-29). If you read closely, you can see that Jesus is talking about more than one kind of resurrection. This we will continue to explore in next weekend’s article.

I have based this reflection on a book I recently read by Scott Hahn with Emily Stimpson Chapman, entitled: *Hope To Die: The Christian Meaning of Death and the Resurrection of the Body.*

Congratulations to our 2026 High School graduates may the inner star of navigation, Jesus Christ fill them with grace and bless them on their pilgrimage of life. **Happy Mother’s Day** to all our mothers! May the seeds of faith and love which they have planted in us continue to blossom and grow on this Mother’s Day and always.
