On Memorial Day Catholics honor our nation's heroes and remember our Church which has defended the dignity and freedom of the human person for two-thousand years.

As Americans, we remember those who died in service of our country. But as Catholic Americans, we should also reflect on the meaning of freedom and thank God for the Church which proclaims the way to the fullness of freedom. One reason we are willing to fight and die for freedom is because the need for freedom is imprinted into our nature. Therefore, we fight for it for others.

We honor those in our families who paid the ultimate price for the free-

dom that we enjoy as an Americans. However, some today have trivialized the meaning of freedom or distorted it beyond recognition. True freedom is much deeper than being able to do what we want. Freedom directs us toward truth and choosing the truth perfects our exercise of freedom. "The more one does what is good, the freer one becomes. There is no true freedom except in the service of what is good and just." The Church teaches us that to understand freedom we need to consider both our nature and purpose of our humanity. We are more than part of the material world. Once we understand that we are a unity of body and soul, created in the image of God and endowed with reason and free will, we are ready for the Church's teaching on freedom. "God created man a rational being, conferring on him the dignity of a person who can initiate and control his own actions. God willed that man should be 'left in his own counsel,' so that he might of his own accord seek his Creator and freely attain his full and blessed perfection by cleaving to Him."

Human beings are unique among all other created things in that we can freely choose to act in ways that are not in accord with our nature; we can turn away from God. However, turning away from God is not true freedom, it is an abuse of freedom. Instead of freeing us, it enslaves us. We need to understand this point because it is critical.

Blessed John Paul II in The Gospel of Life says that when freedom is no longer based on objective truth, it destroys itself. He says if the self is understood in terms of absolute autonomy, as it is in secular society, then people will eventually reject each other. Society will become a mass of competing individuals without mutual bonds. Such a society does not become more free; it becomes less free as vice, corruption, brutality, and oppression inevitably grows.

Because of our reason and free will, we are compelled to seek truth, especially religious truth. Our Creator instilled this drive within us, so that we would seek Him, for He is truth. And having found truth, we are obligated to live it to the best of our ability. But we cannot satisfy this obligation unless we are free from coercion. Consequently, it is the obligation of the state to ensure that its citizens are free to exercise their religious freedom. However, if the state fails in its obligation, or is attacked by another state, then, at some point, human beings will rightly and necessarily fight and die for true freedom.

This Memorial Day Catholics rightly honor our fallen brothers and sisters, those who have died so that we may continue to choose freedom. But we should also remember our Church, who has defended the dignity and freedom of the human person for over two-thousand years.

Parish Hall Window Replacement Update:

The replacement of the (13) Parish Hall windows is now complete. All the old windows that did not lock, were not well insulated and were deteriorated so bad that we had holes in the frames letting in water have now been replaced with new vinyl windows that will never deteriorate. In addition, when the windows were removed the contractors fixed and replaced the wood that had rotted around the window frames. The new window frames were built out of PVC and everything was back caulked to not allow any water penetration or future rotting. Lastly, the windows were framed and trimmed on the inside so that we would not need to redo anything when we embark on the 2nd phase of the Parish Hall renovation. This project also included installing a new ceiling in the Parish kitchen and installing new LED lighting. This was another area of the Parish Hall which need attention. We would like to thank all the donors who contributed to this important project. We continue to make strides in improving the Church facilities while improving the functionality and safety of the Parish.
