St. Lawrence of Brindisi Feast Day - July 21

Lawrence of Brindisi had an outstanding gift for languages. In addition to his native Italian, he was fluent in Latin, Hebrew, Greek, German, Bohemian, Spanish, and French.

Lawrence was born on July 22, 1559, and died in 1619, at age 60. His parents gave him the name of Julius Caesar, Caesare in Italian. After the early death of his parents, he was educated by his uncle at the College of St. Mark in Venice.

When he was 16, he entered the Capuchin Franciscan Order in Venice and received the name of Lawrence. He completed his studies in philosophy and theology at the University of Padua and was ordained a priest at 23.

With his facility for languages Lawrence was able to study the Bible in its original texts. At the request of Pope Clement VIII, he spent much time preaching to the Jews in Italy. So excellent was his knowledge of Hebrew, the rabbis thought he was a Jew who had become a Christian.

Soon, Lawrence's sensitivity to the needs of people began to surface. He was elected major superior of the Capuchin Franciscan province of Tuscany at the age of 31. He had the combination of brilliance, human compassion, and administrative skill needed to carry out his duties. He was promoted by his fellow Capuchins and was elected minister general of the Capuchins in 1602. In this position he was responsible for the growth and expansion of the Order.

Lawrence became papal emissary and peacemaker, which took him to many foreign countries. An effort to achieve peace in his home kingdom of Naples took him to Lisbon to visit the king of Spain. Serious illness in Lisbon took his life in 1619.

In 1956, the Capuchins completed a 15-volume edition of Lawrence's writings. Eleven of the 15 contain his sermons, each of which relies heavily upon scriptural quotations to illustrate his teaching.

His constant devotion to Scripture, coupled with great sensitivity to the needs of people, are a great witness to Christians today. Lawrence had a balance in his life that blended self-discipline with a keen appreciation for the needs of those whom he was called to serve. May we too be devoted to the Word of God so that it might bear fruit in our lives as it did for St. Lawrence.
