The Dignity of Work

The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Work is more than a way to make a living; it's a form of continued sharing in God's creation. In the beginning, God gave Adam (man: male and female [Gen 1: 27]) work to do. He was to keep (protect) and till the garden (cf. Gen 2:15). Man is presented as a laborer who works the earth, harnesses the forces of nature, and produces "the bread of anxious toil" (Ps 127:2), in addition to cultivating his own gifts and talents. Labor also makes possible the development of society and provides for the sustenance, stability, and fruitfulness of one's family: "May you see the prosperity of Jerusalem all the days of your life! May you see your children's children!" (Ps 128:5-6). Dignified work is necessary for the well-being of the human person. The Lord blesses our work so we may share its fruits with others (Deut. 14: 28-29).

But work is not to become an end in itself. Just as God rested from his labor on the seventh day (Gen 2: 1-3), man must rest from his labors to refresh himself and give thanks to God for his blessings. The Sabbath is for everyone, all are allowed to rest (Deut. 5: 13-15).

The dignity of work is to be protected, as the basic understanding of "man [must be] as the source, the focus and the aim of all economic and social life" (Pope Benedict XVI). "Work is a good thing for man, a good thing for his humanity, because through work man not only transforms nature, adapting it to his own needs, but he also achieves fulfillment as a human being and indeed, in a sense, becomes 'more a human being'" (St. John Paul II).

Flood Damage in Cambridge

Because of the flood damage in Cambridge, Fr. Calapan will be staying in the St. Thomas rectory permanently , and the rectory office staff will relocate to our rectory for the time being. All weekend Masses will be celebrated here at St. Thomas: 4:00 & 6:30 PM Saturday, and 8:30 & 10:30 AM Sunday. In addition to the normal week day Masses, Father will celebrate the Wednesday daily Mass and Adoration at 8:00 AM.
