

World Day for Consecrated Life: Sunday, February 4, 2024

What is consecrated life? Some men and women join religious communities in order to consecrate their lives to God as a way of seeking holiness. To consecrate something means to set it aside or devote it to a holy purpose. When a man or woman decides to accept Christ's invitation to leave everything and follow Him in a radical way, they make vows to live like Jesus in poverty, chastity, and obedience. They participate in a ceremony in which they make this commitment, much like a married couple exchanges their vows on their wedding day. They promise Christ that they will live the rest of their lives dedicated exclusively to Him. These vows help them to live simply, to be more open with God, and to depend totally on Him.

The components of consecrated life include:

Public vows of poverty, chastity and obedience professed freely to God and accepted in the name of the Church. This profession obligates and liberates the consecrated religious priest, brother, or sister to strive to love as God loves and to abide in his love.

Public witness or visible presence in the Church witnessing to the Person of Jesus Christ who is present here among us, loves us to the end, and gives rise to this great hope.

Life lived in common according to the charism of the founder or foundress.

Through a certain separation from the world proper to the charism of the institute (approved by the Church), consecrated religious are called to be salt and light—a prophetic countercultural sign—whose focus is on God who illuminates all things.

A corporate or common apostolate (work in the world) which gives concrete expression to the purpose of the institute and is a source of unity and identity among its members.

The spiritual life of the consecrated religious is nourished with prayer, the Eucharist, the Word of God, and a critical reading of the signs of the times. The main categories of consecrated religious who profess public vows are:

Consecrated religious monks (men) and nuns (women) live and work primarily within the enclosure of their community setting and have given their lives in support of the Church through prayer and hidden sacrifice. Currently there are nuns living in Westfield and Lowell, VT.

Apostolic religious priests', brothers' and sisters' communities are frequently engaged in works related to education, health care, communication, social work, or administration for example. The consecrated life is a gift God has given to the Church through the Spirit so that, the Gospel might be present in the world and might draw everyone toward the Kingdom of God.

Parish Hall Renovation Phase 2:

The St. Thomas Parish Hall Renovation for Phase 2 has raised one third of the amount needed to start the project. Our goal is to start the project in the April/May timeframe, and we would ask for your consideration of a donation to the project. We continue to focus on the areas of the Church that are in need of repair, and this is the next phase as the Parish Hall is used for many important functions including parish events, committee meetings, coffee hour, community gatherings, breakfast, dinners, senior group activities and religious education for the children. Phase 1 of the Parish Hall renovation replaced the windows and window frames that were severely in need of repair. Phase 2, will clean, seal, repair the stone walls, remove the paneling and rotted wood above the stone walls, replace the wood with new framing where needed, new insulation and sheetrock will be installed to replace the paneling which will make it easier to maintain going forward. In addition, the ceiling tiles and new LED lights will be installed which will be much more energy efficient.
