## The Holy Spirit is a Divine Person

Did you know that the Holy Spirit is a person?

The foundation of the Christian faith is that there is only one God, but he exists as three Divine Persons. It is a profound mystery, a mystery we will never fully understand, but one that we *can know something* about because it was revealed by God.

The Bible speaks of the Father as God (Phil. 1:2), Jesus as God (Titus 2:13), and the Holy Spirit as God (Acts 5:3-4). The Bible also indicates that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are distinct Persons, since the Father sent the Son into the world (John 3:16), He cannot be the same person as the Son. Likewise, after the Son returned to the Father (John 16:10), the Father and the Son sent the Holy Spirit into the world (John 14:26; Acts 2:33). Therefore, the Holy Spirit must be distinct from the Father and the Son.

Sometimes the Personhood of the Father and Son is appreciated, but the Personhood of the Holy Spirit is neglected. Sometimes the Spirit is treated more like a "force" than a Person. But the Holy Spirit is not an it, but a He (see John 14:26; 16:7-15; Acts 8:16). The fact that the Holy Spirit is a Person, not an impersonal force (as in Star Wars' "force"), is also shown by the fact that He speaks (Hebrews 3:7), reasons (Acts 15:28), thinks and understands (1 Corinthians 2:10-11), wills (1 Corinthians 12:11), feels (Ephesians 4:30), and gives personal fellowship (2 Corinthians 13:14).

But the three Persons are not each part of God but are each fully God and equally God. Within God's one undivided being there are interpersonal relationships such that there are three Persons. The distinctions within the Godhead are not distinctions of His essence and neither are they something added on to His essence, but they are the unfolding of God's one, undivided being into three interpersonal relationships such that there are three real Persons.

God is not one person who took three consecutive roles. That is the heresy of modalism. The Father did not become the Son and then the Holy Spirit. Instead, there have always been and always will be three distinct persons in the Godhead.

The Trinity is not a contradiction because God is not three in the same way that He is one. God is one in essence, three in Persons.

So, the foundational mystery of Christianity is that we worship the Triune God as revealed by God Himself in Holy Scripture, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Therefore, the Holy Spirit is indeed a person.
