Veterans Day, November 11

November 11th belongs to the veterans of our armed forces and their families. At the 11th hour of the 11th day 11th month of 1918, the Armistice with Germany went into effect thereby ending major hostilities of The Great War (which came to be known as World War I). Beginning the following year, November 11 was known as "Armistice Day." President Woodrow Wilson established the day by saying, "To us in America, the reflections of Armistice Day will be filled with solemn pride in the heroism of those who died in the country's service and with gratitude for the victory, both because of the thing from which it has freed us and because of the opportunity it has given America to show her sympathy with peace and justice in the councils of the nations."

"On May 13, 1938, November 11th was declared a legal holiday by Congress to remember the cessation of fighting and those who had served in 'The Great War.' In 1954, a bill was passed extending the day to recognize our veterans of all wars. Today we honor all the men and women who have served our country in all branches of the Armed Services.

Veterans have given their lives for a country that believes that "all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness." We can live our lives standing for the same principles.

America needs Catholics, faithful to the teachings of the Church, who will communicate their values, live out their values, and sacrifice themselves for Christ in ordinary everyday life as our veterans sacrificed for us. America needs Catholics who pray for her leaders and work to protect life, faith, family, and freedom while maintaining a solidarity with the poor and downtrodden.

On Veterans Day, Americans thank our veterans for their unstinting service, whether or not they have served in active duty. They gave themselves for their country. In return, we must care enough to honor their sacrifice by living a virtuous life with the freedom they have provided us.
