Virtue and Character Formation

"Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is gracious, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things" (Phil4:8).

A virtue is a routine tendency to do what is right and good. The virtuous person pursues the good and chooses it in concrete actions. He is one who freely practices doing what is right and good. The goal of the virtuous life is to become like God. Moral virtues are acquired by continued human effort, and they prepare a person for communion with the Holy Spirit. Practicing the virtues brings a joy filled life. Human virtues are acquired by instruction about the virtues, by conscious and intentional acts, and by persistence. Repeated efforts are purified and raised up by God's grace. With God's help, they forge character and give the ability to practice the good routinely. The four virtues that play an important role are called "cardinal" virtues. They are prudence, justice, fortitude, and temperance. The virtuous person is happy to practice them. It's not easy for us, wounded by sin, to maintain moral balance. But Christ's gift of salvation offers us the grace necessary to persevere in the pursuit of the virtues. Everyone should always ask for this grace of light and strength, frequent the sacraments, cooperate with the Holy Spirit, and follow his calls to love what is good and shun evil. So, while practicing the virtues, if a strong wind comes upon you and become frightened that you begin to sink, take courage and call to Jesus, "Save me." He will stretch out his hand to you, "Oh ye of little faith" (cf. Mt. 14:30-31)...
