### SCRIPTURE READING REFLECTION

In today's liturgy we listen to the Passion story as found in St. Mark's Gospel. The key to efficaciously hearing this, is to keep reminding yourself that all of the horrors involved, the complete abandonment by all of his friends, the betraval by someone so close to him, the viciousness and deceit of those who passed judgment (actually pre-judged) on him, the widespread complicity in the injustice and brutality of so many – the false witnesses, Pilate who knew he was innocent, the soldiers who mocked and scourged him, the passersby, etc. - all of these evils that the innocent Jesus endured, he did, not so much for mankind as an abstraction, not so much for others, but as St. Paul reminds us in the Epistle to the Galatians, he did it for me, personally! We weep for the suffering we – forget about others - have caused him. We acknowledge that he wasn't handed over, but rather that he handed himself over, willingly, because he loves us, and asks only that we love him in return. Today is a good time to reflect how much do we, personally, really love him in response? And how is that reflected in daily life?

# EASTER TRIDUUM

The summit of the Liturgical Year is the Easter Triduum, from the evening of Holy Thursday to the evening of Easter Sunday. Though chronologically three days, they are liturgically one day unfolding for us the unity of Christ's Paschal Mystery.

The single celebration of the Triduum marks the end of the Lenten season, and leads to the Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord at the Easter Vigil.

The liturgical services that take place during the Triduum are: Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday Communion service of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday Mass of the Resurrection of the Lord
