SCRIPTURE READING REFLECTION

In this liturgical year of Gospel readings from St. Mark, we finally (since early March – now until the end of November) return to St. Mark's Gospel. Today also, we begin hearing from the epistle of St. James, (relative of Jesus? Followed St. James the Apostle as 2nd bishop of Jerusalem, d. 62 A.D.) who is somewhat famous for such lines as "be doers of the word, not hearers only, thereby deluding yourselves" and "faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead." Perhaps we contemporaries might say: "Show me your lifestyle and you'll show me what you really believe."

I think it helpful to understand today's Gospel if one recognizes that the Pharisees were complaining about "keeping the tradition of the elders." The tradition of the elders was not the O.T. law itself, but rather the inevitable human interpretation of it. In this case of a demand for clean hands, cups etc., the law prescribed this for the priests who were to offer the people's sacrifices. What became a tradition was an interpretation that these prescriptions applied to everyone and not just the priests, and then not just when sacrifices were being offered, but at any meal. It would seem that what ticked off the Pharisees so much was that Jesus discounted their accretions to the Law in favor of more fundamental realities, and therefore their prestige? Of course, we never get upset when others contradict us?
