## SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS

Today's first reading from the writings found in the book of Isaiah is taken from the period called the Restoration, i.e. after having been exiled by their Babylonian conquerors, and therefore living cheek to jowell with peoples from many other nations, God's people came to the conclusion/ understanding that the one true God which they worshiped, must be the God of all other peoples as well. Therefore, today's reading tells us that all nations would eventually come to worship the one and the same God in Jerusalem. (As Jesus said: "ALL are called..."} In today's Gospel, in response to the question: "Will only a few be saved?" Jesus responds with the same vision as that found in Isaiah, i.e. that the whole world (catholic/universal) will be called to share in the salvation He provides. Finally, the author of the letter to the Hebrews (i.e. those familiar with the Old Covenant/Testament) under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, points out that the recent Jewish experience of the formerly exiled period was intended by God to be a discipline to His people, just as a loving father gives necessary discipline to the child he loves, so that the child might prosper. Does it not seem then, that the evils we all must endure in our lives might well be a loving God's/father's disciplining us to see beyond the temporary pain, in order to keep us close to the "bosom of Abraham"?
