**SCRIPTURE REFLECTIONS**

As we are but a few weeks from the end of the Liturgical year, today the Church asks us to reflect on the doctrine of the resurrection from the dead. The first reading recounts the famous Old Testament martyrdom for their faith of the seven brothers. More concretely, they refused to buy into/conform to the popular government enforced (specifically looking for uniformity) pagan values. Because they believed in the resurrection from the dead, as the result of their decisions, they saw that some things are more important than the mere preservation of life. We know that the root meaning of the word martyr means witness, i.e. witness to the presence of the Risen Christ among us and the promise of our resurrection with Him, should give us a priority in thinking that some things are more important than merely preserving (this) life. Thus we may often think of the martyrs of the early Christian church, and think: not my problem. What about the countless number of subsequent saints who well-aware that caring for the diseased, sick and dying might well take them to the same result, i.e. martyrs/witnesses for charity to others? What about those priests in the Nazi death camps who volunteered to take the place of fathers of families, rather than see those families destroyed? Our lives are not without challenges to the principle that some things are more important than merely preserving life itself. E.g. the threat of the recent Covid problem should be obvious: did we rush into complete hibernation, or remain as social human beings? In today's Gospel Jesus diverts attention to the fact that resurrection from the dead should dominate our priorities. St. Paul mentions in passing that our faith is expected to yield good works. They may well be more important than merely preserving life!
