A KING WHO NEVER CONDEMNS ANYBODY

The first reading tells us how David, after defeating all his enemies, was anointed king over all of Israel. His kingdom, great and powerful, became the image and symbol of the kingdom of peace and justice that God would one day establish on earth. Israel waited for so many centuries the coming of the one to start this kingdom.

The Gospel is giving us the answer of God to all these expectations, a reply that people find disappointing, because Jesus was not proclaimed king as he sat on a golden throne, but when he was nailed on the cross. This is how Jesus defeated all his enemies. His victory is a victory of love, not of arrogance and violence, as the second reading tells us. We end Year C and the liturgical cycle of three years with the image of Jesus forgiving everybody.

At times we may have been surprised by God's countenance that Jesus has revealed to us. He is a God who does not think and reason like human: he does not judge, he does not condemn, he does not discriminate, does not weigh good and evil with the scale, does not put-up barriers between the upright and wicked; he loves the upright and the wicked in the same measure and does not allow anybody to get lost.

Let us keep this well in mind: the thoughts of God are not like our thoughts; his ways are not our ways. The heavens are as high above earth as his thoughts are above our thoughts (Is 55: 8-9). If you have understood that the heart of God is different, very different from ours, then, I am sure, all the labor gone into writing them is more than worthwhile. Keep going out into the whole world to announce and proclaim the great news: the love of Christ is greater than our sins.

UN REY QUE NUNCA CONDENA A NADIE

La primera lectura nos cuenta cómo David, después de derrotar a todos sus enemigos, fue ungido rey sobre todo Israel. Su reino, grande y poderoso, se convirtió en la imagen y símbolo del reino de paz y justicia que Dios algún día establecería en la tierra. Israel esperó durante tantos siglos la venida del que inició este reino.

El Evangelio nos está dando la respuesta de Dios a todas estas expectativas, una respuesta que la gente encuentra decepcionante, porque Jesús no fue proclamado rey mientras se sensaba en un trono de oro, sino cuando fue clavado en la cruz. Así es como Jesús derrotó a todos sus enemigos. Su victoria es una victoria del amor, no de la arrogancia y la violencia, como nos dice la segunda lectura. Terminamos el año C y el ciclo litúrgico de tres años con la imagen de Jesús perdonando a todos.

A veces podemos habernos sorprendido por el rostro de Dios que Jesús nos ha revelado. Es un Dios que no piensa y razona como humano: no juzga, no condena, no discrimina, no pesa el bien y el mal con la escala, no pone barreras entre los rectos y los inicuos; ama a los rectos y a los malvados en la misma medida y no permite que nadie se pierda.

Tengamos esto bien en mente: los pensamientos de Dios no son como nuestros pensamientos, sus caminos no son nuestros caminos. Los cielos están tan por encima de la tierra como sus pensamientos están por encima de nuestros pensamientos (Is 55, 8-9). Si han entendido que el corazón de Dios es diferente, muy diferente al nuestro, entonces, estoy seguro, toda la obra que se ha ido a escribirlas vale más que la pena. Sigue saliendo al mundo entero para anunciar y proclamar la gran noticia: el amor de Cristo es mayor que nuestros pecados.
