

Holy Holy Holy

People who are new to our religion or who are preparing to become Catholics or who are simply inquiring about Roman Catholicism can astound and surprise us with their questions. Often times this is because they are fascinated (or puzzled) by an aspect of our religion which we take for granted since we are very used to that particular aspect of our Faith.

Several years ago I was conducting a program for people who were interested in becoming Roman Catholics. After one of the classes a young man who played baseball and was very devoted to the game asked, "Father, what's with all these saints in the Catholic religion? You have thousands of them and you pray to them and ask them to pray for you. I don't get it. Why don't you just go right to God and ask God. It would be less complicated."

Having grown up a Catholic the Saints were simply a given for me. They were part of the Faith and I had never given much thought to what they really meant for us. I paused a bit, thought a bit and asked myself how I could explain our amazing Saints to this young man, to this young man who loved baseball.

A small voice from within me (undoubtedly the Holy Spirit) repeated "Hall of Fame. Hall of Fame". "Yes, of course," I thought to myself, "the Saints are the Catholic Hall of Fame". I then proceeded to tell him that the Saints, although not perfect, worked long and hard at progressing in the Catholic Christian Life. They became outstanding in Catholic Christian living because of years of practice, many spiritual stops and starts, intense religious and spiritual discipline and overall continuous training in Gospel values. They progressed to such a level that their lives became distinctive and the way that they were living became noticeable to those around them. Nevertheless, despite their goodness and progress they were still human beings and they were still imperfect. Yet they were and are living examples that any human being who is willing and open to God's help can attain excellence in spiritual living. Therefore, the saints are proof that a life with and in God is attainable. Their example gives us courage to continue on our religious path. The sincere efforts of the Saints provide inspiration for us that if they could be holy with their imperfections, so can we. The saints, while outstanding, are still human beings. They are human beings who tried hard, worked hard, and progressed. They compose the Catholic Hall of Fame. Yet the most wonderful part is that there is still room in that Hall of Fame for you and me.




