

## Gospel Meditation

## Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Have you ever heard that the gospel is radical? In our times, we hear that word and think of fundamentalists, radical activists, or extremists – people who go beyond limits to achieve their goals and may not consider themselves bound by normal propriety or morality. Their ethos

might not be so different from James and John in today's gospel. "Lord, do you want us to call down fire from heaven to consume them?" This isn't so foreign to some of the stories of the Old Testament. Yet Jesus rebukes them. He won't be exacting in the way his contemporaries expected. There will be no radical rain down of fire and brimstone. Jesus is radical in another way: the call to discipleship.

"The Son of Man has nowhere to rest his head." "Let the dead bury their dead. But you, go and proclaim the kingdom of God." "No one who sets a hand to the plow and looks back to what was left behind is fit for the kingdom of God." These can be difficult passages to read. These are not normal things to hear! It can be easy for many of us to avoid the exacting nature of the gospel, which might not be what we think it is. James and John wanted to set the bar high for others on the outside and to punish those who didn't meet that standard. Jesus sets the bar high for his disciples, those who say they want to follow him. He may be using some hyperbole, but it's only to send a clear message. This is a radical call, one that has a cost. To truly put God and others first, before ourselves, will involve sacrifice. How is Jesus asking you to be radical today?

## **Totus Tuus 2019**

This summer, Christ the King is again hosting the Catholic youth camp, Totus Tuus ("Totally Yours"). The camp has two sections, one for those entering grades 1–8, and one for those entering grades 9–12. Last year, we had over 60 participants!

The diocese organizes the program, and send a teaching team of seminarians and college-aged students, who do a great job combining enrichment in the faith with a ton of energy and fun. The day includes catechetical instruction, daily Mass, songs, games, and recess. I've worked with the Totus Tuus programs in the past, and have always found them to be engaging and fun, as well as a great way for the students to

grow in their love for God. The dates for the program are as follows:

The grade school camp is from 9 AM to 3 PM, Monday, July 22, to Friday, July 26.

The high school camp is from 7:30 PM to 9:30 PM, Sunday, July 21, to Thursday, July 25.

The price is \$60 for a grade student, and \$25 for a high schooler. For families with multiple students, the maximum cost is \$150. Please make checks to Christ the King Parish.

## And from Our Pastor...

Dear Parishioners and Friends:

On Thursday, June 20, the parish staff gathered in Engle Hall to talk about next year for what we call "calendaring day." It's an important day to review the previous year, what worked and what didn't work, make plans, and put a plan on paper. I learned to do this from my first pastor in Barre, Fr. Bernard Messier, for whom this was an important project that would set the tone and pace for the year to come. At our meeting last Thursday, all parish programs and committees were somehow represented. It is an exhaustive process but a necessary one in which we set program priorities for everyone. At a meeting such as this, one learns quickly that all parish life is connected. It is like a wheel. The Eucharist is the hub; all else are spokes coming from the hub.

Our first priority of course is prayer, and thus the holiness of our people. For most of us, one of our very first moments in a Catholic Church was our baptism. On that day, we began the journey to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. We come to Mass to be holy, to hear the Word, and to receive the Eucharist. Of all of our priorities, the liturgical schedule is the most important. The entire year pivots around Easter. We also look for ways to foster personal holiness. In offering prayer opportunities, retreats, adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, the sacrament of reconciliation, and other devotions, we find ways for our people to pray as a community and thus grow in holiness.

All else that we do as a parish supports our life of prayer and the quest for holiness. Education and outreach come from our life of prayer and lead us back to it. We have programs for our children and adults, and all of them are laser focused on helping our people know Christ better. When we pray the Eucharist, we are naturally inspired to take it on the road, so to speak. One cannot know and love Christ without being a person of service. Any reading of the gospels will lead one to realize that care for the poor is integral to Christian living.

All of these priorities were evident on "calendaring day" as we deliberated over meeting spaces, times, and people present. As parishes, we are blessed with combined Liturgy and Outreach Committees, and a Parish Council that is coming together. The work of the Parish Council will be evangelization and education, as the diocese just led us through a three day workshop on forming priorities around those themes. More on those later.

It all comes back to the Eucharist. The most important thing we do as a parish is pray the Eucharist. It is the cornerstone of your prayer life and mine. In that sacred moment, we are one with Christ. He is our hope and our salvation. Personal holiness is the ultimate priority of all parish activities and the very reason a parish exists. That was evident in our "calendaring" meeting last week.




