## **WHAT IS DIFFERENT THIS YEAR?**

In the hope of drawing our candidates, sponsors, and parents to have a personal transformation in Jesus and the Church, we are introducing "Youth Alpha" for Confirmation preparation. We pray that this will create an opportunity for youth to have a sense of belonging before they come to believe and to become disciples. Additionally, we have created "accompaniment conversations" for sponsors. The conversations focus on key topics of the sacrament of confirmation. The conversation utilizes the principles of accompaniment found in Luke 24:13-34: <u>deep listening, hospitality, affirming, empowering, and prayer.</u> The conversations have to be completed over 10 months and they will help the sponsor discern the candidate's readiness for confirmation.

## **QUESTIONS ON SPONSOR/REQUIREMENTS**

#### WHAT IS A SPONSOR?

A sponsor is a practicing Catholic who lives their life in harmony with the church while seeking to be a disciple of Jesus. This person's function "is to take care that the person confirmed behaves as a true witness of Christ and faithfully fulfills the duties inherent in this sacrament." (Canon 892)

## WHAT DOES IT MEAN TO BE A SPONSOR?

We want sponsors to serve in a mentor role. A sponsor will meet with the teen for conversations about faith using a variety of topics important to the confirmation preparation. Upon completion of accompaniment sessions, the sponsor will notify the Faith Formation Coordinator through documentation of the experience. Additionally, the sponsor will join the teen for service projects, Mass, Adoration, and other activities the teen identifies as important to their confirmation journey. Upon completion of the accompaniment sessions, the sponsor serves as a witness testifying to the teen's readiness to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

## **QUALIFICATIONS TO BE A SPONSOR**

The following are qualifications defined by the church:

- 16 years of age or older
- Is not the father or mother of the candidate
- Received the three Sacraments of Initiation: Baptism, Eucharist and Confirmation
- Participates in the Mass on Sundays and Holy Days; and receives the Sacraments of Eucharist and Reconciliation regularly.
- Actively strives to live out their commitment to Christ and to the community life of the church by a lovingly responding to those with whom they come in contact.
- If married, the marriage is valid according to the laws of the Catholic Church.
- Is willing to give support to the candidate through prayer and the example of their Christian life.
- Is able to attend the Rite of Confirmation Mass and testify to the Bishop the candidate's readiness to receive the sacrament

## WHEN CHOOSING A SPONSOR, PLEASE CONSIDER 3 THINGS:

- A practicing Catholic who lives out her Catholic faith with joy
- Someone you can talk to and you admire
- Someone who is available to journey with you

## TIPS FOR CHOOSING A SPONSOR:

- Begin with prayer: ask God to guide you to the person right for you.
- A Godparent can be good candidate, but ask these questions: Do you know them well? Are they able to fill this role?
- Is there a relative, sibling (16 or older) or family friend who stands out to you as a good candidate?
- Do you feel comfortable diving into prayer and faith conversations with this person?
- Is the person available to meet with you on a regular basis and attend the Rite of Confirmation Mass?

#### CAN MY OLDER TEEN BE A SPONSOR?

Teens 16 years or older who have received all the sacraments of initiation (*Baptism*, *Communion and Confirmation*) are eligible to be a sponsor. However, it is always better to have a trusted adult (family member) who can both complete accompaniment conversations and ensure their readiness for confirmation. If your candidate chooses an older teen as their sponsor, please be prepared to provide extra support.

### CAN MY TEEN CHOOSE A SPONSOR WHO LIVES OUT OF TOWN?

Absolutely, Yes! The sponsor can certainly complete "accompaniment conversations" through ZOOM. However, when the sponsor comes in town for a special occasion, it is a great opportunity to meet in-person with their candidate.

## WHAT IF I CAN'T FIND A SPONSOR?

We completely understand that it may be difficult to find a sponsor that fulfills the requirements to be a sponsor who can make a commitment to the preparation journey. If you are unable to find a qualified sponsor, please contact Faith Formation Office. We will work with you to find a sponsor who can fulfill the requirements.

## HOW MANY SERVICE HOURS WILL MY TEEN NEED TO TURN IN?

Our hope is that your candidate cultivates a heart for service. In accompaniment conversation #3, they will talk about the baptismal call to serve. We would like one of their three service experiences to come from that conversation of service. Additionally, we would like them to accrue <u>at least 15 hours of service</u> from the project identified with their sponsor. The 3 categories are: serve the St. Boniface Community (Mass, faith formation sessions, parish community events, and parish outreach projects), serve those outside the St. Boniface community (Waukee Food Pantry and Joppa), and serve with Knights of Columbus and Men of Boniface (Fish Fry, Pancake Breakfasts, Fall Cleaning, and other outreach initiatives).

### DOES MY TEEN NEED TO ATTEND RETREAT?

Teens preparing for confirmation should attend retreat. Retreats are an important opportunity for the candidate to understand the Saving Love of Jesus and have a meaningful encounter with God. Teens who attend retreats consider the weekend the highlight of their year. While it may seem overwhelming to make a commitment for the whole day, it is always worth the sacrifice. **The teens are made anew!** 

## ACCOMPANIMENT CONVERSATIONS

We invite the sponsor and candidate to enter into a covenantal relationship of **TRUST**, **CONVERSION**, **AND COMMITMENT TO CHRISTIAN DISCIPLESHIP**. Accompaniment conversations happen around CORE topics/catechesis for the sacramental preparation for Confirmation. They are conversations between the candidate and their chosen sponsor. Each conversation has a reflection component to it.

## 1. **CONFIRMATION**

**Step #2**: As a starting point for conversation. sponsor will share about her/his "prayer life" by focusing on the following questions: *What prayer is, why it matters, and how to do it?* The goal is to draw both—sponsor and candidate—to renew/cultivate simple prayer habits at home and come to know the fruits of joining friends, family, and the parish community for prayer.

## 3. SERVICE

**Step #1:** Sponsor will focus on forming the heart of service by exploring what the candidate is passionate about, commit to 5 service projects within and outside the parish community, and reflect on the importance of forming the heart.

### 4. MASS, CONFESSION, & ADORATION

**Step #1:** Sponsor will explore the importance/riches of these sacraments: Mass, Confession, and Adoration, and make the following commitments:

- i. Attend Mass together (October 2023 October 2024)
- ii. Attend Adoration (ADORATION is on Tuesdays from 6-7 PM; 40 hours of adoration during Lent 2024)
- iii. Celebrate the Sacrament of Confession

### 5. MARY AND THE SAINTS

<u>Step #1</u>: Sponsor will explore candidate's thoughts on Mary and Communion of Saints. Help candidate choose a confirmation Saint who will be the firm spiritual companion and intercessor. Sponsor will reveal her relationship to Mary and Saints by sharing some of the devotions sponsor celebrates. Sponsor will look at some of the Saints: Oscar Romero, John Paul II, Teresa of Calcutta, Faustina, Dymphna, Clare of Assisi, Boniface, Maximilian Kolbe, and etc., Encourage candidate to choose a Saint, provide more information, and empower candidate to embrace the pursuit of holiness of the chosen Saint for Christian discipleship journey.

## **CONFIRMATION SAINT**

### WHY DO WE CHOOSE A CONFIRMATION SAINT?

<u>Answer</u>: Confirmation saints are chosen to be a person we want to be like, as well as someone who can pray for us from heaven. To aspire to be like a saint is the same as trying to imitate an actor, musician, or athlete; a confirmation saint is someone who we want to be like! As members of the Church, we are never alone, as the Letter to the Hebrews says, "We are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses" (Hebrews 12:1). These witnesses are the saints who continually intercede for us (CCC 956); in choosing a confirmation saint, we are choosing a special friend to intercede for us and to model our lives here on earth.

### WHY DO WE CHOOSE A CONFIRMATION NAME?

**Answer**: Scripturally, a name is not only what a person is called, but also who the person is—a special meaning of that person. Indeed, it conveyed the truth of the person. Your Confirmation name is the name you choose for yourself; although it is not required that you to do so. In the scriptures, changing your name signaled a change in your vocation or even your identity. If you choose to take a new name, then you will select a name of the saint you research. The Saint should be someone whose life or death inspires you or who exhibited qualities you admire. Even if you do not choose to use the name of a Saint as your confirmation name, the Saint project is still required.

## **HOW DO I SELECT A CONFIRMATION SAINT?**

## **Answer**: Pray, Discern, and Choose

- i. **PRAY**: Since you are inviting a Saint to accompany you forever, it is important to take some time to think and pray about the following questions:
  - What kind of role model are you looking for, what qualities do they have that you want, and what kind of person are you hoping to become?
  - Pick a few different saints and then spend time in prayer and ask all of them to pray for you. The Holy Spirit will help you find the one who sticks out more than others, and who resonates with you more than others
- ii. <u>DISCERN:</u> Consider doing a little more reading on the Saint you or someone in your family was named after, one from your family's country of origin, or a patron Saint of something that is important to you. The Church has a saint for almost anything and you can start with this link: <a href="https://lifeteen.com/blog/biggest-best-list-confirmation-saints-guys-girls/">https://lifeteen.com/blog/biggest-best-list-confirmation-saints-guys-girls/</a> Or Talk to your Sponsor, parents, trusted family member, and Confirmation Ministry Leader for recommendations:
  - What saints are they familiar with and do they have a special devotion to a saint?
  - Asking those who know you best can help you find a saint you can form a relationship with for the rest of your life.
  - Check out this book, "100 Saints that Every Teen Should Know" from Julie Schell in the Faith Formation Office
- iii. **CHOOSE**: Once you have made your choice, pray to that saint for guidance and to help you prepare for the sacrament of confirmation

## SACRAMENT OF CONFESSION: EXAMINATION OF CONSCIENCE

## 1. I am the Lord, your God, you shall have no other gods before Me.

## 2. You shall not take the name of the Lord God in vain.

## 4. Honor your father and your mother

Have I been disrespectful to teachers, coaches, and others in authority? Have I done my chores without complaining?

### 5. You shall not kill.

*Have I hurt others or fought with them?* 

Have I not forgiven others and held on to grudges?

Have I been mean to others or made fun of them?

Have I been unfair to others, especially those who are different than I am?

## 6. You shall not commit adultery.

Have I been respectful of my body?

Have I shown respect for others' bodies?

### 7. You shall not steal.

Have I taken anything that did not belong to me?

Have I cheated on tests or schoolwork?

Have I cheated in games or sports?

## 8. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor.

Have I told lies?

Have I called anyone names or said bad things about others?

## 9. You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.

*Have I been jealous of the friends that someone else has?* 

Do I think of other people in terms of what they can give me instead of in terms of how I can show them God's love?

*Have I been envious of others?* 

## 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's goods.

Have I held on to anger or jealousy when other people have things that I want? Do I share with others?

## **How to Celebrate Confession**

- 1. Enter the confessional and shut the door securely.
- 2. Make the Sign of the Cross.
- 3. After the priest gives the blessing, say:

Bless me Father, for I have sinned. This is my first confession.

4. Confess your sins to the priest. When you finish, say:

For all these sins and those I cannot remember, I am truly sorry.

- 5. Listen to the advice the priest gives you.
- 6. Say the Act of Contrition:

My God, I am sorry for my sins with all my heart.
In choosing to do wrong and failing to do good,
I have sinned against you whom I should love above all things.
I firmly intend, with your help, to do penance, to sin no more,
And to avoid whatever leads me to sin.
Our Savior Jesus Christ suffered and died for us.
In his name, my God, have mercy. Amen.

7. The priest will give you absolution. When he finishes, say:

Amen.

8. As you get up to leave, say:

Thank you, Father.

9. Leave the confessional and do the penance that the priest gave you

**IMPORTANT**: For future confessions, you should simply say how long it's been since your last confession. E.g. "Bless me Father, for I have sinned. It's been two weeks since my last confession, and these are my sins..."
