



Ministry Corner

Hi all: The life of someone in ministry can be overwhelming at times. It can take hours and even days out of your already busy lives. It can be a dirty mess! It can even be repetitive ! BUT it can also be fulfilling. It can be life-changing! Even the mess can turn into something positive. And the more repetitive it becomes the more exciting and challenging it can be. So...how can we be enticed to get involved in something that can be called ministry / service. I have no easy answers. I think you need to look in the logical and more important places for you and your family first. Church is a great place to start. I've been attending a variety of different Masses since my hip surgery and I've noticed that there seems to be very few greeters at the doors. This is a wonderful opportunity for you to do ministry as a family. You could even choose the Mass that you like to attend and volunteer to be the greeter at that Mass or you could volunteer to rotate Masses and meet some new people. If you want to do something on a more individual basis you could be a Eucharistic Minister, Lectur or Usher. I know there is always a great need. And again, if you have children grades five and up, they could be trained to be altar servers and you could all do ministry as a family.

Then, if doing Ministry at church is not enough for you...there are always ways to get involved in the community. Ever since I read the other day that Antioch is one of the "most miserable cities to live in" in the United States, I've wanted to do something. I love Antioch but more importantly I am attached in all kinds of ways with the people who live here. There are so many people in our city that need help and it's not just the homeless on the streets. It's the single moms who are trying to do the best for their children. Maybe you could volunteer to tutor these children. Maybe it's simply buying a new coat or jacket or sweat-shirt for a child that we can distribute with our Ladies Dinner project items to the school district for the children of Antioch in need. It could be old towels and blankets for the Animal Shelter or even small kennels or crates. Anyone who travels can pick up the small containers of lotions, shampoos, etc. that are left in your hotel rooms and bring them to us so they can be distributed to one of the Homeless Shelters. For those of you who knit or crochet, you could create warm scarfs for those who are on the streets.

And if none of these appeal to you, there is work on the next Ladies Dinner. I am still in need of a committee who is willing to help finalize the theme and minimal decorations for the event. I need someone to take care of hostesses and make sure they have their lists of guests ready in time. I need women to help with the skit (It's time to bring it back as we have had several requests). There is also a need to get things set up for the wonderful men who serve. There are also easy one-step type of activities that you can do to help me with the Ladies Dinner.

Never ever assume that your help isn't needed. You will make new friends, you will do lots of good and you will add more people to your extended family. God gave us two hands, intelligence and most of all a big heart. We need to put these to good



Twenty-Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Naaman and the leper who returned to Jesus saw God's hand in their healing. Only through God's intervention could they have been cured. Through this recognition of God's presence and action in their lives, they grew in faith. For what are you grateful? Pause for a moment to reflect on all of the blessings in your life. God is the source of these many blessings—life, love, gifts, and so much more. Of all the gifts for which we must be grateful, none is as great, or as astounding, as the gift of salvation offered to us through Jesus Christ. Let this sink in, not only in your mind but in your heart. Like Naaman and the leper who returned, allow yourself to be touched by the immense love of God for you.

All Good Gifts

In the past few years, many have adopted the practice of keeping a gratitude journal. Sometimes, the journal-keeper uses a book that includes prompts that guide the user's reflection. Others simply keep a list or write brief reflections at the end of their day or week, recognizing the many things for which they are grateful. The action of seeking out the blessings of life creates a habit of attentiveness. We see what we seek. When we look for things for which to be grateful, we realize that we are surrounded by blessings. This is not only a good practice for our emotional health and well-being. Recognizing our blessings and growing in gratitude for them is a deeply spiritual practice, through which we become attentive to God's presence and action in our lives. Gratitude can truly be a life-changer for us. As we grow in gratitude, we view the world through the perspective of abundance rather than scarcity. Without the habit of gratitude, we take things for granted. We get caught in an endless cycle of wanting more, rather than seeing all that we have.

One Or One Of The Nine

Naaman and the leper also grasped that their grateful faith should lead them to respond in praise and to make a change in their life. Naaman vowed to put his faith in the Lord; the leper returned, glorifying God and thanking Jesus. Not all responded in thankful praise, however. The leper who returned was one of ten. The other nine went about their merry way, happy to be healed, but failing to acknowledge or express their gratitude to the Healer. Are you one, like Naaman and the leper who returned to Jesus, whose thankfulness leads you to faith and to faith-filled living? Or are you one of the nine, who takes for granted the gifts and blessings that surround you? For what are you grateful? What is your faithful and faith-filled response?

Cuando buscamos por cosas por las cuales estar agradecido, nos damos cuenta que estamos rodeados de muchas bendiciones. Esta no es solo una práctica buena para nuestra salud mental y bienestar. Reconociendo nuestras bendiciones y creciendo en agradecimiento por ellas es una práctica profundamente espiritual, por medio de la cual nos ponemos atentos a la presencia de Dios y su intervención en nuestras vidas. El agradecimiento verdaderamente puede ser un cambio de vida para nosotros. Al ir creciendo en el agradecimiento, vemos al mundo por medio de la perspectiva de la abundancia en lugar de la escasez. Sin el hábito del agradecimiento, damos las cosas por hecho. Estamos atrapados en un círculo infinito de querer más, en lugar de ver todo aquello que tenemos.

Uno O Uno De Los Nueve

Naamán y el leproso también comprendieron que su fe agradecida debía guiarlos a responder en alabanza y hacer un cambio en sus vidas. Naamán prometió poner su fe en el Señor; el leproso regresó, glorificando a Dios y agradeciendo a Jesús. Sin embargo, no todos respondieron con una alabanza de agradecimiento. El leproso que regresó fue uno de los diez. Los otros nueve se fueron alegres, felices de haber sido sanados, pero fallando en reconocer o expresar su agradecimiento a quien los sanó. ¿Eres tú uno, como Naamán y el leproso que regresó a Jesús, cuyo agradecimiento te lleva a la fe y a una vida llena de fe? ¿O eres como uno de los nueve, que da por hecho los dones y las bendiciones que te rodean? ¿De qué es de lo que estás agradecido? ¿Cuál es tu respuesta fiel y llena de fe?


