Lanciano, Italy Eucharistic Miracle

Around 750, a monk had serious doubts about the host actually becoming Jesus' body and blood. After consecrating the host, "a ring of human flesh formed around the wafer, and in the chalice five globules of human blood formed (in correspondence to each of the five wounds traditionally ascribed to Christ at the crucifixion). This great physical miracle was reserved in a monstrance or ostensorium for future generations to visit in adoration." Since 1574, there have been four investigations of this Eucharist. These have determined that the flesh and blood is indeed of human origin and is a miracle. *(Information taken from "Our Sunday Visitor")*

AFFIRMING A CULTURE OF LIFE

Article 22, also known as Personal Reproductive Liberty, "has been sold to the legislators and citizens of Vermont as simply preserving women's abortion 'rights'... in the Vermont Constitution, but there is so much more danger hiding beneath the surface that has not been openly discussed."
