This month, each of our students is reflecting on the virtue of generosity. As part of the Holy Family community, I have found myself also contemplating how this very important concept plays out



A SPIRIT OF **CENEROSITY**

Generosity is an odd thing. Many consider that being generous involves monetary gifts or the distribution of 'things'. True generosity, I believe, is much more than that. Just wander through recess when our Kindergarten or 1st Grade

are outside. How many times have I watched classmates jostle to be 'the one' who walks their injured friend to the office. There is no reward for this, indeed there is a sacrifice of their very limited free time. How many times have I watched a middle school classmate sit quietly with a friend who is anxious, sad, or suffering. By their mere presence they are generous, giving freely of their heart and their ready ear.

What role models for me (and all of us). I have been reflecting. Am I generous when I drive? How often do I allow that driver to merge ahead of me? Am I generous when I am with others who are lonely? How often do I allow them to speak freely and at length, acknowledging that they have few opportunities to do so? Am I generous when others disagree with me? How often do I listen with an open heart, actively seeking to understand a different point of view? Am I generous when I suffer? How often do I allow others to support me through my vulnerability?

Because... yes... it is also generous when I welcome others into the more private parts of my life.

Generosity is hard. It requires humility and risk. It asks us to give of those things we need and protect most, not of our plenty.

Watch your kids this week. Children are surely the best

examples of generosity I've ever seen.


