And boy, do I love our students.

This month, I've been incorporating some silly and serious questions into our 5th **Grade** lunches, just to build some shared experiences as we eat together. I'm checking in with students about reading skills, social-emotional challenges, and general organization.

Recently, I've been reading *Emotionally Resilient Tweens and Teens*, by Kim John Payne and Luis Llosa. I picked it up for my own parenting because my own children are chugging toward "tween-age-hood", but it's so relevant that I wanted to share it here, too. The bulk of the book is first-hand stories by young adults about specific challenges they faced and overcame in elementary and middle school. It's full of talking points to use with your children and practical tactics for dealing with social challenges.

Today is also Ash Wednesday, the beginning of the season of Lent. This is a time to slow down, reflect on things that we would like to incorporate into our lives, and maybe decide to purge some not-so-healthy habits. I encourage you to find some time this week to open up a conversation with your children about the importance of preparing our hearts and minds so we keep space for Jesus. Taking intentional time to focus on each season of the year, spiritual or otherwise, can be so good for our mental health.


