Jesus said to them, "The children of this age marry and remarry; but those who are deemed worthy to attain to the coming age and to the resurrection of the dead neither marry nor are given in marriage. They can no longer die, for they are like angels; and they are the children of God because they are the ones who will rise." - Lk 20:34-36

REFLECTIONS THIRTY SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

"Some Saducees, those who deny that there is a resurrection, came forward and put this question to Jesus ..." In this Sunday's Gospel, the Saducees avoid their real question. Is there a resurrection from the dead or not? Rather than ask this question point blank, the Saducees try to prove their point through a roundabout, unrealistic scenario. Jesus cuts straight to the question behind the question, citing Scripture passages relating to the resurrection.

The Saducees are trying to trick Jesus. While we may not intend to stump God, our doubts and questions may have more in common with the Saducees than we care to admit. Doubts are part and parcel of life in a fallen world. Still, there are different ways we can word our doubts to ourselves, God, and others. When we're struggling, truly struggling, about some article of faith, do we admit it? Or do we cloak it with other, obtuse questions to hide the nature of our concern?

Have you considered leaving the Church over the hypocrisy of some of her members and leaders? Perhaps the real question is: "How can a place blessed by God and instituted by Christ have this evil in it? Can I reconcile with the concept that an institution has an admixture of good and bad? What do I expect from others, from myself? What responsibility do I have to try and remedy evil in an institution I'm part of?" Perhaps you've wondered about the nature of romantic love, and if God is love, does He really care so much about the details of this particular scenario? Perhaps the real question is: "Can my mind wrap around the concept of a God whose law seems — on the surface, in this situation — to make people unhappy? What is the relationship between the moral law and human flourishing?" These aren't easy questions, but they are more honest ones. This week, don't be afraid of your deeper questions! Bring them to God, to someone you trust, and to yourself.

RCIA (The Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults)

Do you know someone who is interested in learning more about the Catholic faith? Perhaps you are thinking about what it means to be called to the Catholic way of life. The Church has a process called the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (R.C.I.A.) whereby adults can learn and discern whether to become Catholic Christians. The process leads an unbaptized adult to his or her baptism, usually at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday. If the adult has been baptized in another Christian tradition, then the process prepares the person to be received into the Catholic Church by making a profession of faith as a Catholic. The process also prepares the way for someone who was baptized in the Catholic Church to receive First Holy Communion and Confirmation. Here at St. Columba, the RCIA meets on Saturday mornings at 9:30 AM until 11:00 AM beginning in September and continuing into June. Each morning we explore a different topic with lecture/discussion facilitated by one of the RCIA team members. Our goal is to help you on your spiritual journey as you come to know Jesus through the Scriptures, the teachings of the Catholic Church, prayer and worship, and the community of Saint Columba. You will be accompanied on your journey by a Catholic sponsor, usually a friend, who is there to help answer questions and support you. 

CATECHISM IN A YEAR

25. How does man respond to God who reveals himself?

Sustained by divine grace, we respond to God with the obedience of faith, which means the full surrender of ourselves to God and the acceptance of his truth insofar as it is guaranteed by the One who is Truth itself.

26. Who are the principal witnesses of the obedience of faith in the Sacred Scriptures?

There are many such witnesses, two in particular: one is *Abraham* who when put to the test "believed in God" (*Romans 4:3*) and always obeyed his call. For this reason he is called "the Father of all who believe" (*Romans 4:11-18*). The other is the *Virgin Mary* who, throughout her entire life, embodied in a perfect way the obedience of faith: "*Let it be done to me according to your word*" (*Luke 1:38*).

Servant of God Mother Elizabeth Lange, OSP Founder, Oblate Sisters of Providence Servant of God 2010

Elizabeth Clarisse Lange's journey to the United States came from Haiti, through Cuba to Baltimore, Maryland where a large number of French-speaking Catholic Haitian refugees were settling. At the time she moved to Maryland, it was a slaveholding state.

Elizabeth, a strong, free, and independent thinker, was an educated woman who possessed money left to her by her father. She recognized the need to educate the children of her fellow refugees. She used her own money and home for over 10 years and worked with Marie Balas, a friend, to provide a free education to children of color.

She wanted to join a religious order, but no order would accept women of African descent. She believed in the power of prayer, and joined confraternities devoted to the rosary and the Blessed Mother. Prayer and the providence of God led Elizabeth and four other women to form a religious order, the Oblate Sisters of Providence, dedicated to the education of black children. They took their vows on July 2, 1828, and were the first black Roman Catholic order to operate in the United States. The Oblate Sisters of Providence, 191 years later, continue their mission including operating St. Francis Academy, the oldest Catholic school in the U.S. established for black children.

Mother Elizabeth Lange was called home to God on February 3, 1882. Her life exemplified the counsel she gave to her Sisters: "Do all you can for the glory and honor of God". Her legacy continues in the work of the Oblate Sisters of Providence.
