Principal's Report

October 20, 2020

1. Choice update

- a. We (Patty, Joan, and I) are currently working on our 3rd Friday in September enrollment audit for the WPCP.
- b. 52 items are due to our auditing firm by October 23, 2020. We've already submitted 23 items.
- c. This is our first big audit for the WPCP for the 2020-21 school year. They are doing most of it virtually, where we are uploading documents to a secure system.

2. Electronic Sign update

a. The Town of Buchanan updated their sign ordinance to allow a changeable free standing sign at the school location. This will allow the school/parish to display messages of hope and upcoming events within our school/parish. It will be a message to our community that we are here to stay and serve our local community. Install will be 2-4 weeks. See the attached rendering for more detail as to what it will look like.

3. Personal Space dividers

a. Thanks to an anonymous donation, we purchased enough personal space dividers for half the number of kids in each classroom. This will allow us to use an extra safety precaution in place for partner work for the students. Students will still have to wear a mask, but this is just an extra barrier for getting closer than 6 feet apart.
